Get this from a library! military roll, Stanislaus County, California. [Cecil E Kilroy] -- The time-period covered by this military roll involved the conflict between the United States and Spain over Cuba and the Philippine Islands.

Nicks living daughter Jan shared a scanned signed document with me. It was suggested to me by a few of the younger generation of the Kooy family that I write an article from their time of arrival in the U. I will give a brief summary of their trip to North Dakota then carry on through the first cousins. As some of you know Aunt Dora Vanassen has a book out on her life in America and her Missionary work. She also gives an account of the trip to America. I am not trying to compete with her, but some of the younger people said they would like to have a brief story of the travels to America. The information I have comes from members of the family. Wilma and I also traveled to Belfield, North Dakota. They showed us the history of the immigrants who came there. Klaas Kooi, "Grampa", was born Nov. Elizabeth Gortsjak, "Grandma", was born Oct. They were married in or , the date I am not sure of. After having a family of ten children, one, Maria, passed away in 1904, they decided in Feb. I want to say that Uncle Nick went to America before the others, he went in More on him as I write about the next generation. After 1- to 2 weeks they arrived at Ellis Island. After going through the legal work there, they went by train to North Dakota. They arrived there in late Feb. I understand they had quite a tirne on the train. Our Grandpa had a time keeping them rounded up. There is some confusion as to where they lived. I checked it out and most of the Dutch families lived in Belfield, ND, which is a short distance from Dickerson, the main shopping town. The museum and history is in Betfield. The understanding we got there was that many of the families there had help buying their tickets from wealthy Dutch investors, who owned thousands of acres of land in North Dakota, to be developed. I am not sure if the Kooy's were in this group. I can tell you that from grandpa down aII of them worked hard. Piet, Bill, Lena, Tillie and Betsy. After school the girls, including Betsy, did house work. That is a brief story about the Kooy's up to and through North Dakota. I will write about each one of them through the first cousins, after their arrival- in California in October. In the past few years, after Wilma and I retired, we have traveled through North Dakota etc. After visiting some of the next generation I was asked by some of them if I would follow on with the family after they arrived in California. After my recent visits with Dennis Johnston and Harvey Kooy they both said it would be nice to write more about the family after they arrived in California. Also, I understand that Kim Ulrich was interested. What I am going to do is bring it up to date as far as my generation, the first cousins. If the younger people want to carry it on from there, it is their choice. Folks, the first thing I would like to say is that you will note I am not a professional writer. Also, everything I will write about the family was told to me by family members and information I gathered in our travels. If some of the things I write such as names, dates, etc. What I will do is start with the oldest and go in order. I will refer to them by name because they did not become Aunts and Uncles during this time. I believe your younger members of the family will find it very interesting as you read what the family did and how well things went, through good times and bad times. I want to just add that Klaas and Elisabeth Kooy had 12 children in 24 years. The rest of the family all arrived in California. As I write about each member of the family I will- say who they married, but not having the dates I will skip that. He and a few buddies came ahead of the rest of the family. I believe they aII came to Corcoran, an area which is close to Hanford. He married Hendrika Van Assen and they had four children. They spent most of their life farming and also had a chicken ranch. They had four children: Elisabeth Courtway born in Salida, Ca. Clarence Kooy born in Gault, Ca. Dine Pederson born in Gault, Ca. They all arrived in the Corcoran area where Nick was. Piet married Minnie Rowe. They had a dairy and later had a chicken ranch. Piet also worked in the ship yard during WWII. They had two children: Annabelle Toombs born in Gault, Ca. Everret Kooy born in Gault, Ca. BiII married Eunice Sauls, who had four sons from a previous marriage. I believe they were aII born in the Modesto area. Bill worked for the county fire department for most of his life. An added note on BiII. He said he had three buddies all named Gerrit, so he chose the name BiII to make things easier. Lena passed away with the flu in I would like to add a little extra to the Hoogendoorn life. In they moved to Iowa to live and farm. They moved back to Southern California in

May of Piet was all ready to go in the dairy business in Artesia, California when the big earthquake of hit Long Beach, So they packed up and moved to Ripon. From that time on they all became farmers. She married Tom Hendriks in Hanford. She met him in North Dakota in , when she was an 11 year old girl. He worked on the same farm as the Kooy family did. They met again 5 years later at a town Christmas party in Corcoran. Tom and Tillie were dairymen and chicken ranchers most of their lives in Southern California. They had six children: Elisabeth "Betsy" Arrived in Corcoran with family in October, She married John Van Donk. They were farmers most of their lives in the Ripon area. They had a vegetable and fruit market and John was also a butcher. Maria Hendrika Arrived in Corcoran with the family in October, Married to Dean Smith. I believe Maria was a registered nurse. Dean was in construction. He was a finish carpenter and also a crew foreman. He still did a lot of work after retirement for the church, etc. Dora Willimina Arrived in Corcoran with the family in October, Married to Herman Vanassen. They were farmers in the early part of their marriage. As many of you know, they both became involved in missionary work. After Herman passed away, Dora traveled all over doing missionary work. She has a book out covering the work. Nellie Kooy The first of the family born in the U. She married Hank Richardson. Hank was an inspector both in the Manteca and Avery, Ca. I believe he was a health and food inspector in Manteca, and was a building inspector in Avery. They raised two foster children from teenagers to adults. John William Born in Corcoran, Ca.

Miss Converse, is the daughter of John Converse, whose home is a few miles from Coulterville. The groom is a young stockman of Groveland, Tuolumne county. The couple were married at the parsonage of the South Methodist Church, the Rev. Fenton performing the ceremony. The couple left for Coulterville, where they will reside. The bride is a very pretty little lady, not known here, however. The groom is an industrious young man; has been employed in the Salida vicinity for some time. He has some mining properties near Coulterville, and will put in the winter developing them. Only three years into their marriage, Lottie Converse Elliott died of consumption pulmonary tuberculosis on November 21, , at the early age of Mariposa Gazette, December 5, Mrs. Lottie Elliott passed away last Friday evening at the home of her parents, Mr. John Converse on the Greeley Hill. The deceased was stricken with consumption about two [months] ago and though everything possible was done to relieve her all efforts were useless. Death called and his summons must be obeyed. Elliott was a gentle and lovable disposition and her early death is greatly deplored by all who knew her. She was a native of Mariposa county and about twenty-two years of age. Besides her parents she is survived by five brothers and four sisters, and her husband and two young children. May He who does all things wisely send the bereaved family strength to bear their great sorrow. Captain Grant was his Father and died in France in and is buried there. By posting pictures of the visit to his gravesite - we connected through one of his brothers. I clicked on the link and the first search I did was for Woodruff, and Mamie was the first picture that came up. I could hardly stand it. I was late getting back to work. It makes me feel as though you have been my friend forever. It certainly has given me a connection to you, and I have a love for what you do. I have tried for many years to find anyone with that name, and I have searched many genealogy web sites to no avail.
