

1: The Need for a New Model of Drug Control

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The agency seeks to reduce illicit drug use, manufacturing and trafficking, drug-related crime and violence, and drug-related health consequences. In recent years, the office has come under fire over how it spends its multi-billion-dollar budget and whether federal anti-drug policies are actually effective. Beginning in March , ONDCP certification of grantees or contractors became a precondition for receiving a federal grant or contract. Penalties for failure to comply with the new law included suspension of federal payments for an undisclosed period, termination of a federal grant or contract or suspension or disbarment of the grantee or contractor from receiving another grant or contract for a period of up to five years. It also established specific reporting requirements in the areas of drug use, availability, consequences, and treatment. Executive Order and Executive Orders and assigned ONDCP responsibility within the executive branch of government for leading drug-control policy and developing an outcome-measurement system. Such coalitions are supposed to reduce substance abuse among adolescents, strengthen collaboration among organizations and agencies in both the private and public sectors, and serve as catalysts for increased citizen participation in strategic planning to reduce drug use over time. Drug Free Communities DFC has, since its inception in , supported more than 2, drug-free community coalitions across the United States. As part of its treatment efforts, the agency funds Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral, and Treatment SBIRT programs that rely on the health care system to help diagnose and treat drug abuse before it becomes a more serious problem. Another program is Access to Recovery ATR , which provides vouchers for treatment services as well as recovery support services. High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas HIDTA provides agencies with coordination, equipment, technology, and other resources to combat drug trafficking in key parts of the country. The Counterdrug Technology Assessment Center CTAC serves as the central counterdrug enforcement research and development center for the federal government. Drug Endangered Children programs coordinate the efforts of law enforcement, medical services, and child welfare workers to ensure that children found in these environments receive appropriate attention and care. The Fentanyl-Laced Heroin Demand Reduction Forum brought together law enforcement and public health officials, prevention specialists, and treatment providers from federal, state, and local governments to discuss the public health threat and response techniques arising from deaths related to fentanyl-laced heroin, a powerful synthetic drug that is 80 to times more powerful than morphine and can kill humans in small doses.

At a press conference releasing the Strategy, General McCaffrey said he hopes to change the funding and budget structure of the National Drug Control Strategy in the future. He said he would prefer a system where a year Strategy is agreed upon and followed over that time frame with annual accountability hearings before a Congressional committee. In the process of meeting each of the goals, the report sets smaller objectives to be met. Increase the number of State governments and community organizations participating in the development of national prevention standards and a national prevention infrastructure. Increase the number of schools with comprehensive drug prevention and early intervention strategies with a focus on family involvement. Increase the number of community drug coalitions through a focus on the need for public support of local drug prevention empowerment efforts. Reverse the upward trend in marijuana use among young people and raise the average age of initial users of all illicit drugs. Increase the effectiveness of local police through the implementation of community and problem-oriented policing with a focus on youth and gang violence, drug-related homicides, and domestic violence. Break the cycle of drug abuse and crime by integrating drug testing, court-authorized graduated sanctions, treatment, offender tracking and rehabilitation, and aftercare through drug courts and other offender management programs, prison rehabilitation and education, and supervised transition to the community. Increase the effectiveness of Federal, State, and local law enforcement task forces that target all levels of trafficking to reduce the flow of drugs to neighborhoods and make our streets safe for the public. Improve the efficiency of Federal drug law enforcement investigative and intelligence programs to apprehend drug traffickers, seize their drugs, and forfeit their assets. Increase the number of schools that are free of drugs and violence. Reduce the health, welfare, and crime costs resulting from illegal drug use. Increase treatment efficiency and effectiveness. Use effective outreach, referral, and case management efforts to facilitate early access to treatment. Reduce the spread of infectious diseases and other illnesses related to drug use. Expand and enhance drug education and prevention strategies in the workplace. Identify and implement options, including science and technology options, to improve the effectiveness of law enforcement to stop the flow of drugs into the United States, especially along the Southwest Border. Lead efforts to develop stronger bilateral and multilateral intelligence sharing to thwart the use of international commercial air, maritime, and land cargo shipments for smuggling. Conduct flexible interdiction in the transit zone to ensure effective use of maritime and aerial interdiction capabilities. Break foreign and domestic drug sources of supply. Destroy major trafficking organizations by arresting, convicting, and incarcerating their leaders and top associates, and seizing their drugs and assets. Reduce the foreign availability of drugs through eradication and other programs that reduce drug crop cultivation and through enforcement efforts to attack chemical, money laundering, and transportation networks that support trafficking organizations. Reduce all domestic drug production and availability and continue to target for investigation and prosecution those who illegally divert pharmaceuticals and listed chemicals. Increase the political will of countries to cooperate with the United States on drug control efforts through aggressive diplomacy, certification, and carefully targeted foreign assistance. Strengthen host nation institutions so that they can conduct more effective drug control efforts on their own and withstand the threat that narcotics trafficking poses to sovereignty, democracy, and free-market economies. In the source countries, aggressively support the full range of host nation interdiction efforts by providing training and operational support. Make greater use of multilateral organizations to share the burdens and costs of international narcotics control to complement the efforts of the United States and to institute programs where the United States has limited or no access. The Strategy emphasizes that progress in each of these five areas will be measurable through various reports: Past Drug Control Strategy reports have been criticized for setting unmeasurable and unrealistic yearly goals. The goals are substantially different from the goals in previous

reports. The Strategy listed the same goals in a slightly different order. The President released a separate strategy for dealing with methamphetamine abuse. The report also asks that Congress increase penalties for trafficking in precursor materials and urges better training of investigators to find methamphetamine laboratories. International proposals for dealing with the methamphetamine problem include working more closely with Mexico to curb trafficking of the drug across the U. Southwest border and fostering international communication about diversion of precursor materials. A bill now pending in Congress would increase the penalties for trafficking in methamphetamine precursor materials. FY Supplemental Funding. The request was a reprogramming of Department of Defense funds. When asked what the most important problem facing the nation is, respondents most often said crime and violence, followed by the drug problem. They also ordered a Government Accountability Office study on the distribution of grants. Propaganda in the United States Paying for anti-drug messages in television shows[edit] In the spring of , the ONDCP began offering additional advertising dollars to networks that embedded anti-drug messages in their programming. They developed an accounting system to decide which network shows would be valued and for how much. Then they would suggest ways that the networks could increase the payments they would get. They did sign off on them -- they read scripts, yes. The original script portrayed two young people using drugs at a party. Originally depicted as cool and popular, after input from the drug office, "We showed that they were losers and put them [hidden away to indulge in shamed secrecy] in a utility room. That was not in the original script. Specifically, MPP argued that Nevada campaign finance laws required the Drug Czar to reveal how much taxpayer money he had spent to defeat the initiative. MPP filed a writ of mandamus as an appeal of the decision. And on October 13 and 14, Burns traveled to Alaska to oppose Measure 2, a measure to allow the state to tax and regulate the sale of marijuana. In an effort to minimize drug-related crime, illness and death, the Effective National Drug Control Strategy advocates a policy which emphasizes public health approaches to drug control. The drug war has succeeded in arresting and incarcerating large numbers of people. There are over 1. As of June , 5. This translates into 1 out of every 35 adults in the nation. The graph cannot express the financial and psychological damage endured by the children and spouses of those incarcerated. Nor does it express the damage that certain communities and racial groups experience. For example, black males born today have a nearly one in three chance of going to prison. Since , the federal government has been asking high school seniors how easy it is for them to obtain marijuana. Twenty-three years and millions of arrests later, Since , federal surveys show there has been a rise in adolescent drug use. This has coincided with record spending, record arrests and record incarceration rates. The drug war has escalated for decades, but has not resulted in less adolescent drug use. Drug crimes receive some of the most severe criminal sanctions in our legal system. Is this a realistic or appropriate approach to controlling juvenile drug use? If not, then why should only some be arrested? How do we determine who gets prison sentences and who does not? These are unsophisticated approaches to youth drug use that are not based on strategies proven to work. The evidence shows that these strategies have not decreased the availability of drugs for school-aged kids, nor has it deterred their use of drugs. Does the current drug control strategy reduce the supply of drugs and raise their price? The indicators of a successful supply-reduction effort are rising drug prices and decreasing drug purity levels. Despite massive investments in border patrols, overseas crop eradication efforts, Department of Defense involvement and arrests of drug smugglers and drug dealers, the drug war has not reduced the supply of drugs nor made them more costly to obtain. The market prices for illegal drugs follow the same laws of supply and demand that apply to all commodities. The drug war creates an artificially high commodity price, and these huge profit margins have encouraged more drug producers to enter the market. Greater production has created economies of scale. Lower production costs allow drug cartels to earn the same high profit margins with lower retail prices. The cartels accommodate for interdiction efforts by over-producing their commodity to account for the losses. Easy availability, increased purity and lowered prices have resulted in high levels of overdose deaths and hospital emergency room drug episodes. Even more alarming has been the devastating expansion of the HIV and Hepatitis C epidemics due to the prohibition on needle possession. Each day 33 more people are infected with HIV due to injection drug use. By the end of , it was estimated that more than , African-Americans and 55, Latinos were living with injection-related AIDS or had already died from it. It is time to develop a drug strategy that works. Since we are failing to reduce the supply and use of drugs, while incarcerating record numbers of drug offenders, we need to accept that criminal laws cannot effectively solve the complex issue of drug use. Indeed, there is mounting evidence that the extreme criminal sanctions we employ today may actually worsen some of the problems of drug abuse. The Effective National Drug Control Strategy provides a detailed alternative model of drug control based on sound research and empirical evidence, and was developed by a wide range of professional associations. The Effective Strategy emphasizes public health approaches, investment in our children and confronting the underlying economic and social problems, which are the root causes of drug abuse. As can be seen from the chart below, the Effective Strategy seeks to balance law enforcement, treatment and prevention efforts.
