1: FACT CHECK: Are NFL Players Required to Stand on the Field During the National Anthem?

when the League was founded in , the complexity and ambiguity of the NFL Rules Book makes it one of the most difficult codes to digest, second only to Official Baseball Rules (OBR).

Trump realDonaldTrump September 23, Sports fans should never condone players that do not stand proud for their National Anthem or their Country. NFL should change policy! During the National Anthem, players on the field and bench area should stand at attention, face the flag, hold helmets in their left hand, and refrain from talking. The home team should ensure that the American flag is in good condition. It should be pointed out to players and coaches that we continue to be judged by the public in this area of respect for the flag and our country. Pages 62 and 63 contain only regulations about the enforcement of fouls committed on the field during gameplay, and nowhere else does that document specify anything about the either the playing of the national anthem prior to games or the required behavior of players and team personnel during that ceremony. In fact, the rulebook makes no mention of the national anthem at all. Rule 4, which covers Game Timing, states only that both teams must be on the field before the scheduled start time of the first and second halves, and must initially appear on the field at least 10 minutes early in order to allow sufficient time for warming up: Both teams must be on the field to kick off at the scheduled time for the start of each half. Prior to the start of the game, both teams are required to appear on the field at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled kickoff in order to ensure sufficient time for proper warm-up. Designated members of the officiating crew must notify both head coaches personally of the scheduled time for kickoff prior to the start of each half. Throughout the period on game-day that a player is visible to the stadium and television audience including in pregame warm-ups, in the bench area, and during postgame interviews in the locker room or on the field, players are prohibited from wearing, displaying, or otherwise conveying personal messages either in writing or illustration, unless such message has been approved in advance by the League office. All such items approved by the League office, if any, must relate to team or League events or personages. The League will not grant permission for any club or player to wear, display, or otherwise convey messages, through helmet decals, arm bands, jersey patches, or other items affixed to game uniforms or equipment, which relate to political activities or causes, other non-football events, causes or campaigns, or charitable causes or campaigns. Further, any such approved items must be modest in size, tasteful, non-commercial, and noncontroversial; must not be worn for more than one football season; and if approved for use by a specific team, must not be worn by players on other teams in the League. However, some sources have confusingly stated that the NFL has a separate game operations manual distributed to all the teams, and it is that document, not the rulebook, which supposedly includes the wording in question regarding player conduct during the national anthem: The rulebook is concerned with in-game actions by players and coaches like scoring, penalties, challenges and so on, whereas the game-operations manual dictates how NFL games should be run in the bigger-picture organizational sense. But the game operations manual does. The home team should ensure that the American flag is in good condition. It should be pointed out to players and coaches that we continue to be judged by the public in this area of respect for the flag and our country. The NFL will not discipline those teams and players who refused to be on the field for the playing of the national anthem before games Sunday, league spokesman Joe Lockhart said. Potential disciplinary action over how players act during the anthem would need to be in place under the collective bargaining agreement with the NFLPA, and to make matters more complicated, several states that have teams also extend first-amendment protection to employees of private businesses while at work.

Registration for the Game begins at 3: The Promotion Period begins at kickoff approximately 8: Exact dates are subject to change dependent upon the NFL schedule. The Promotion and participation in the Promotion are subject to these Official Rules. The Weekly Scoring Periods are as follows: Once you are a registered participant of the Game, you may access the Game Page at any time during the Registration and Promotion Period by visiting nfl. The use of script, macro or any other device to automate or subvert the registration process is prohibited and all such registrations will be void. In the event of a dispute as to the identity of an participant based on the email address submitted at the time of registration, registration will be deemed from the person named on the applicable registration form regardless of whether that is the name of the authorized account holder of the email address from which said registration form was submitted , provided such individual is eligible according to these Official Rules. The object of the Game is to accrue the most correct picks without being eliminated by the conclusion of the Game Period. Pick an NFL team who you think will win each week hereafter combined, your Prediction. You may only pick each team once throughout the course of the season. The Predictions you submit for each Weekly Scoring Period will accumulate correct picks in the following way: For each correct game prediction you make you are awarded a correct pick "€" for each incorrect game prediction you make you lose a life. When you are out of lives, you are eliminated from the Game. Do all of the following during the Registration Period: The deadline for choosing, modifying, or submitting your Prediction for each Weekly Scoring Period is prior to kickoff of the first applicable game. Therefore, you may revise your Prediction for each Weekly Scoring Period throughout the Registration Period; however, you may not make a Prediction for a game that is already in progress or has been completed. Prediction that is received by the applicable deadline will be used to tabulate your correct picks. Correct picks will not be awarded if 1. Prediction is not made by the applicable deadline, 2. All selections must be accepted and acknowledged by the computer servers by the applicable deadline to be considered valid, timely, and eligible. Tiebreaker sort within Survivor works as follows. In the event of a tie on correct picks, entries are ranked based on the combined record of the NFL teams not yet picked. Should a tie still exist, entries will be ranked based on timestamp of the latest pick made.

The teams were originally scheduled to play the playoff game, officially a regular season game that would count towards the regular season standings, at Wrigley Field in Chicago, but a combination of heavy snow and extreme cold forced the game to be moved indoors to Chicago Stadium , which did not have a regulation-size football field. Playing with altered rules to accommodate the smaller playing field, the Bears won the game and thus won the championship. Fan interest in the de facto championship game led the NFL, beginning in 1927, to split into two divisions with a championship game to be played between the division champions. The de facto ban was rescinded in 1931, following public pressure and coinciding with the removal of a similar ban in Major League Baseball. With Canadian football being a different football code than the American game, the CFL established a niche market in Canada and still survives as an independent league. The upstart AFL began to challenge the established NFL in popularity, gaining lucrative television contracts and engaging in a bidding war with the NFL for free agents and draft picks. The two leagues announced a merger on June 8, 1966, to take full effect in 1970. In the meantime, the leagues would hold a common draft and championship game. List of National Football League seasons From 1920 to 1926, the NFL did not have a set number of games for teams to play, instead setting a minimum. The league mandated a game regular season for each team beginning in 1927, later shortening this to 11 games in 1928 and 10 games in 1929, mainly due to World War II. After the war ended, the number of games returned to 11 games in 1930 and to 12 in 1931. The NFL went to a game schedule in 1932, which it retained until switching to the current game schedule in 1933. If two teams tied for the conference lead, they would meet in a one-game playoff to determine the conference champion. In 1933, the NFL expanded from 15 teams to 16 teams. Instead of just evening out the conferences by adding the expansion New Orleans Saints to the seven-member Western Conference, the NFL realigned the conferences and split each into two four-team divisions. The four division champions would meet in the NFL playoffs , a two-round playoff. Effectively a third-place game , pitting the two conference runners-up against each other, the league considers Playoff Bowls to have been exhibitions rather than playoff games. The league discontinued the Playoff Bowl in 1969 due to its perception as a game for losers. In 1970, the league added a second wild card team from each conference, bringing the total number of playoff teams to ten, and a further two wild card teams were added in 1975 to bring the total to twelve. When the NFL expanded to 32 teams in 1978, the league realigned, changing the division structure from three divisions in each conference to four divisions in each conference. As each division champion gets a playoff bid, the number of wild card teams from each conference dropped from three to two. Every dollar of income generated through television rights fees, licensing agreements, sponsorships, ticket sales, and other means is earned by the 32 clubs and is taxable there. This will remain the case even when the league office and Management Council file returns as taxable entities, and the change in filing status will make no material difference to our business. Each conference has one defined officer, the president, which is essentially an honorary position with few powers and mostly ceremonial duties such as awarding the conference championship trophy. The commissioner is elected by affirmative vote of two-thirds or 18 whichever is greater of the members of the league, while the president of each conference is elected by an affirmative vote of three-fourths or ten of the conference members. He is the "principal executive officer " [40] of the NFL and also has authority in hiring league employees, negotiating television contracts, disciplining individuals that own part or all of an NFL team, clubs, or employed individuals of an NFL club if they have violated league bylaws or committed "conduct

detrimental to the welfare of the League or professional football". The commissioner can also issue sanctions up to and including a lifetime ban from the league if an individual connected to the NFL has bet on games or failed to notify the league of conspiracies or plans to bet on or fix games. By redistributing profits to all teams the NFL is ensuring that one team will not dominate the league through excessive earnings.

It includes detailed information on illegal hits, including diagrams. There has been no change in rules since the start of the season, only an increase in the level of discipline for violations of existing rules. Any play involving a violation that needs to be reviewed for possible discipline, whether flagged on the field or not, is referred to Executive Vice President of Football Operations Ray Anderson and his staff, which includes Director of Football Operations Merton Hanks, a nine-year NFL veteran Merton Hanks or Ray Anderson makes the initial determination for discipline for on-field violations. The player has the right to appeal league discipline. All on-field fine money collected by the NFL is used for charitable purposes. These funds have been used to support retired player programs, including the NFL Player Care Foundation and NFLPA Players Assistance Trust; disaster relief initiatives; and other charities supporting youth, education and sports-related medical research. Sportsmanship All of the player safety and on-field conduct rules that follow can be summarized in one word-"sportsmanship. The term sportsmanship conveys respect for the game, respect for opponents, respect for the game officials, and respect for the fans. The League will not tolerate unsportsmanlike conduct. This applies to any act which is contrary to the generally understood principles of sportsmanship. In addition, the player may be fined. Officials will immediately call a foul if any unsportsmanlike conduct occurs anywhere on the field. It is important to note that the unsportsmanlike conduct rules apply to all personnel in the team area, including players, coaches, team employees, and officials. Lack of respect or other unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated during games or at other times, including postgame interviews. This includes abusive, threatening, insulting, or profane language or gestures, and physical acts by coaches, players, and other club personnel directed at opponents, officials, game personnel, or fans. Coaches and players should keep in mind that every NFL game is broadcast on radio and television, and that there are open microphones near the playing field as well as closeup camera shots that permit easy lip-reading by viewers. The League and its participants are severely criticized whenever obscene or profane language or obscene gestures are carried or shown on the air. Serious incidents of this kind will warrant disciplinary action by the League. It also requires recognition that NFL players are uniquely talented, trained, and conditioned, with year-round preparation now the norm. Player safety is a top priority for the League in ensuring that the game is played as fairly as possible without significant unnecessary risk to its participants. It should also be a top priority for all NFL players. Remember, many of the player safety rules are designed to protect not only the player who gets hit, but also the player who does the hitting. National Football League Player on the Ground at the End of a Play Illegal acts that jeopardize the safety of players will not be tolerated. The League will continue to stress enforcement of the personal foul rules, with special emphasis on the unnecessary roughness and roughing the passer rules that prohibit hits on players in defenseless positions, including passers in the act of passing, receivers in the process of attempting to catch a pass, a runner whose forward progress has been stopped and is already in the grasp of a tackler, a kickoff or punt returner attempting to field a kick, and a player on the ground at the end of a play. You should pay special attention to the rule concerning low hits on the quarterback where the defensive player had an opportunity to avoid forcible contact. These hits are illegal and will result in both onfield penalties and discipline by the league. Officials will continue to be instructed that, if there is any doubt as to the potential for a foul, they should lean toward player safety and call the foul. This is not a complete list of the rules. You are strongly advised to familiarize yourself with the more detailed and comprehensive descriptions contained in the NFL Rule Book and in particular the acts constituting unnecessary roughness and roughing the passer, detailed in Rule 12, Section 2, Articles 8 and Rule 12, Section 2 also contains other important player safety rules that are not

specifically illustrated or clarified in this section. In addition, it is not legal to clip in close line play, unless the block from behind is above the knees. The League recognizes that safety cannot be promoted exclusively through interpretation of existing rules or adoption of new legislation, and that the participants on the field must assume responsibility for making it work. Discipline may be imposed for a first offense and without any prior warning. In addition, suspension without pay may be imposed when deemed appropriate. In some cases a violation may be detected in postgame review of video. If a postgame review establishes an egregious violation, particularly involving safety-related issues such as hits on the quarterback, the offender may be subject to suspension. Defenseless players are defined as a a player in the act of or just after throwing a pass; b a receiver catching or attempting to catch a pass; c a runner already in the grasp of a tackler and whose forward progress has been stopped; d a kickoff or punt returner attempting to field a kick in the air; and e a player on the ground at the end of a play. Use of Helmet and Facemask. These provisions do not prohibit incidental contact by the mask or non-crown parts of the helmet in the course of a conventional tackle on an opponent. Receiver Catching or Attempting to Catch a Pass 1. Receiver Who Has Completed a Catch. Roughing the Passer Because the act of passing often puts the quarterback in a position where he is particularly vulnerable, special rules against roughing the passer apply. Pass rushers are responsible for being aware of the position of the ball in passing situations. Incidental or inadvertent contact by a player who is easing up or being blocked into the passer will not be considered significant. A rushing defender is prohibited from committing such intimidating and punishing acts as "stuffing" a passer into the ground or unnecessarily wrestling or driving him down after the passer has thrown the ball, even if the rusher makes his initial contact with the passer within the one-step limitation provided for above. When tackling a passer who is in a virtually defenseless posture e. A rushing defender is prohibited from forcibly hitting in the knee area or below a passer who has one or both feet on the ground, even if the initial contact is above the knee. It is not a foul if the defender is blocked or fouled into the passer and has no opportunity to avoid him. A defender cannot initiate a roll or lunge and forcibly hit the passer in the knee area or below, even if he is being contacted by another player. It is not a foul if the defender swipes, wraps, or grabs a passer in the knee area or below in an attempt to tackle him. Protection While Out of Pocket. When the passer goes outside the pocket area and either continues moving with the ball without attempting to advance the ball as a runner or throws while on the run, he loses the protection of the one-step rule and the provision regarding low hits, but he remains covered by all other special protections afforded to a passer in the pocket. If a passer outside the pocket stops behind the line and clearly establishes a passing posture, he is covered by all of the special protections. Note on Officiating The Competition Committee emphasizes that whenever a game official is confronted with a potential unnecessary-roughness situation and is in doubt about calling a foul, he should lean toward safety and not hesitate to throw the flag.
