Yet thou shalt be brought down to hell, to the sides of the pit. Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: Notwithstanding in this rejoice not, that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven. May I stand in awe of You! Scripture In Perspective Moses was the chosen author of God. If one does not take the text to describe any part of pre-Genesis history and one takes the Creation narrative to refer in every detail to literal 24 hour days then it covers approximately years. It has been estimated that Moses recorded the essence of the book of Genesis sometime after the time of the exodus out of Egypt in 15th Century BC. While he may have had access to oral history and artifacts, perhaps even some Egyptian documents, it was God who would have inspired and informed his writing. This does not address when he recorded the Book of Exodus. Chapter One introduces the creative expression of God. He sovereignly speaks a linear-time-contained physical reality into existence and summarizes the first six days of His Creation. If one takes them as introduction to a mere allegory or parable they have an impact upon ones understanding of the entire Bible. If one takes the words to refer to the beginning of everything created external to Heaven, and as a literal record, they have a substantially different impact on what follows. This commentary leans toward the latter rather than the former understanding, though with a caveat or two. This commentary leans toward the former over the latter understanding. And there was light! The Lord God leaves no room for doubt in His Word. Discuss How does the belief that the Lord God literally created everything as described in Genesis impact your view of science? Share When have you contemplated what it means for the Lord to live outside of the constraints of linear time as we know it? Faith In Action Pray Ask the Holy Spirit reveal to you a specific place in your life where you are stuck; stuck because you are trying to deal with a challenge in your own strength and wisdom and keep failing, or stuck because you have asked the Lord God for intervention while at the same time doubting that He has the power to meet and overcome that which challenges you. Act Today I will confess my lack of faith, remembering that it was He Who created everything from nothing, and repent turn away from my doubt. I will request and receive His forgiveness and allow Him to be my strength as He is Lord of my life. God saw that it was good. He made the stars also. Your power and vision are beyond anything known to mere man, You not only designed an entire planet and populated it with life “ You did so in a way that was perfectly harmonious. May I find joy in the knowledge that our Lord Jesus is preparing a place for us that is as You originally intended. With a word God created the climate system: After creating an atmospheric shell so that the surface covered by water was surrounded by sky and contained by that shell the Lord God then separated bodies of land and sea. Each part, atmospheric shell, sky, water, and land served a different function, just as parts of the human body do, and each contributed to the whole ecosystem in a unique but critical way. The Lord God then called the plants and trees into being, each also with a unique purpose, and each reproducing only its own kind. As Moses recorded the story of Creation he used descriptive images and phrases from a primitive era, it is important as we read to not misunderstand his limited experience-based vocabulary as mere allegory, but rather allow the Holy Spirit to enhance our understanding. Until this moment in Creation, the earth was held together by the Lord-alone. He set in place the rest of the cosmos in order to make it a self-sustaining yet highly interdependent system, though at all times it exists only as He empowers and permits. In its fallen-away broken state all of Creation would collapse without His constant intervention. These can be challenging texts - one must approach them with awe for God and skepticism toward any effort to undermine the integrity of the whole Word The Lord God looked upon His Creation, water separated from sky and space, water and land separated, then plants and trees created upon the land; all of it deemed good “

perfect in harmony. He then decided that the sky and sea should also have living things, so the Lord created sea creatures and birds. The Lord God followed His decision to populate the sky and water with life-forms specific to those environments with a decision to populate the land with creatures as well. The plants and trees were given the gift of life then set free to multiply remaining true to their unique created form. Land and sea are both source for the critical elements of water and dry surface needed for growth; each were created in perfect balance and order. The land was self-sustaining without creatures in the air and water, it was only the creative Spirit of the Lord God Who envisioned, then perfectly-created them. Despite many unsupportable details imposed upon the text by mere men some fanciful, some venal, and some carelessly-conjectured by the rare few actually seeking truth the Bible is essentially silent as to details of the creatures the Lord God created and set loose upon the earth. We see only the distortions of His perfect Creation long after the Fall. We must remember that Eden was sealed "so nothing of perfection is visible to us. Discuss How might you help someone to recognize the literal physical massiveness of each step in Creation? How might your fellowship teach an appreciation for the difference between the original flawless Creation and the fallen-away remnant in which we live? Reflect Summer and winter, spring and fall, rain and snow, sunshine and darkness; each now far less perfect than the original pre-Fall creation, yet each is critical to the balance of the Created system; a miraculous work of God. Prior to day four of Creation, God had held everything in place by mere thought; then He added a multitude of interdependent solar systems, each with gravity, all in perfect harmony, and all contributing to the balanced whole. Diversity, independence, peaceful coexistence; this was the design - and then the Fall. The land animals were different in kind and purpose from the plants and trees, birds and sea creatures that came before them, yet were similar in that they were equipped and released to live and multiply. Previously He had merely spoken His Creation into existence and it had life, but breathing life in to man gifted him with the capacity for something very unique.

4: Should the Bible say "Lucifer" or "morning star" in Isaiah ? And does it refer to Satan?

A Garden of Roman Verse presents works by four of Rome's finest poets: Catullus, Horace, Ovid, and Virgil. Each poem appears in the native Latin and in English translation and is illustrated with a detail from Roman paintings or mosaics.

The main theological issue in these texts is that of the consequences of the Fall of Man, of which sickness and death are mentioned. Other themes include the exaltation of Adam in the Garden, the fall of Satan, the anointing with the oil of the Tree of Life, and a combination of majesty and anthropomorphism in the figure of God, involving numerous merkabahs and other details that show a relationship with 2 Enoch. The more striking resemblances are with ideas in the Second Epistle to the Corinthians: Eve as the source of sin 2 Corinthians. No direct relationship can be determined between the New Testament and the Life of Adam and Eve, but the similarities suggest that Paul the Apostle and the author of 2 Enoch were near contemporaries of the original author of this work and moved in the same circle of ideas. While Adam is dying, Seth asks what it means to be ill, as he has no concept of it. Adam must explain to his children what dying and death means, and what to do with his body when he dies. This title was given to it by Tischendorf, [6] its first editor, and taken up by others. Tischendorf [6] used four manuscripts for his edition: A, [8] the heavily Christian-interpolated B, [9] manuscript C, and manuscript D, [10] which has probably the best text. During the 20th century many other manuscripts have been found, of which E1 [11] and E2, which are similar to the Armenian version, merit special mention. Content[edit] After being banished from the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve go to the East and live there for eighteen years and two months. Eve gives birth to Cain and Abel. Eve dreams that Cain drinks the blood of Abel, but that it then came out of his mouth. Michael promises to Adam a new son, and Seth is born in place of Abel. As Adam falls sick and is in pain, all his sons and daughters come to him, and he briefly recounts to them the story of the Fall. Seth and Eve travel to the doors of the Garden to beg for some oil of the tree of mercy. On the way Seth is attacked and bitten by a wild beast, which goes away when ordered by Seth. Michael refuses to give them the oil at that time, but promises to give it at the end of time, when all flesh will be raised up, the delights of paradise will be given to the holy people and God will be in their midst. On their return, Adam says to Eve: Thou hast brought upon us great wrath which is death. In the Garden, she is separated from Adam: The devil persuades the male snake to rebel against Adam and his wife: The serpent seduces Eve, who swears to give the fruit to eat to Adam too. The serpent places in the fruit the poison of his wickedness, which is lust. When Eve eats it, she discovers that she is naked. All the trees of the Garden lose their leaves. Only a fig tree, the plant she ate of, still has leaves, and she hides her shame with its leaves. Eve looks for Adam and deceives him: His throne is set where the Tree of Life is, and all the trees break out in blossoms. He calls Adam, who hid because he was naked, and reproaches Adam, Eve and the serpent the order of the reproaches is the opposite to that of Genesis. When the angels are casting Adam out of paradise, he asks to be allowed to implore God, saying: God refuses to give him the fruit of immortality, but promises, if Adam will keep from all evil, to raise him up in the last day and give him the fruit. Before being cast out, Adam is allowed to take sweet spices to offer sacrifices and seeds for his food. He asks Eve to pray, because they do not know whether God is angry with them or merciful. While Eve is praying on bended knee, the angel of humanity probably Michael comes and shows her the spirit of Adam gone from his body and ascending to God. The seven heavens are opened and Seth explains to his mother who are the two fearful figures in mourning: God has mercy on Adam, who is cleansed three times in water before being carried before God. God stretches out his arm, and hands Adam over to Michael to be carried to the third heaven until the last day. Only Seth can see the scene. The body is covered with linen clothes and fragrant oil is poured on it. The body of Abel also, which until then the earth had refused to receive, is taken to the same place. Both bodies are buried in the place from which God took the clay to create Adam. God calls Adam, whose body answers from the earth. God promises Adam that he and everyone of his seed will rise again. Adam and Eve make Cain a husbandman and Abel a shepherd in order to separate them from each other. Seth is born in place of Abel, along with 30 other sons and 30 or 32 daughters. The Forgotten Books of Eden: The First Book of Adam and Eve: The Second Book of Adam and Eve: Adam continues to recount briefly to Seth the history of the world up to last judgment the Second Temple period is marked as a time of iniquity but the destruction of the Temple is not recounted.
