Prehistoric neckware[edit] Prehistoric peoples often used natural materials such as feathers, bone, shells, and plant materials to create necklaces, but by the Bronze Age metallic jewelry had replaced pre-metallic adornments. Upper-class Ancient Egyptians wore collars of organic or semi-precious and precious materials for religious, celebratory, and funerary purposes. Amulet s were also turned into necklaces. Gold and silver necklaces were often ornamented with foreign and semi-precious objects such as amber , pearl , amethyst , sapphire , and diamond. Bronze amulets embossed with coral were common. Early European barbarian groups favored wide, intricate gold collars not unlike the torc. In the Gothic period necklaces were uncommon, though there are a few records of diamond, ruby, and pearl necklaces. During the Renaissance it was fashionable for men to wear a number of chains, plaques, and pendants around their necks, and by the end of the 15th century the wealthiest men would wear great, shoulder covering collars inlaid with gems. Long pearl ropes and chains with precious stones were commonly worn. Few men in the Baroque period wore jewelry, and for women necklaces were unsophisticated, often a simple strand of pearls or delicately linked and embellished strands of metal with small stones. Portrait pendants were still worn, and in extravagantly jeweled settings. The low necklines of the court gowns fashionable at this time led to the use of large necklaces set with precious jewels. The Edwardian era saw a resurgence of pearl necklaces, in addition to a dog-collar style of necklace made of gold or platinum with inset diamonds, emeralds, or rubies. Chanel popularized costume jewelry , and ropes of glass beads were common. The Art Deco movement created chunky, geometric jewellery that combined multiple types of gems and steel. Princess necklace A princess necklace is 45 centimetres 18 in to 50 centimetres 20 in long, longer than a choker, but shorter than a matinee. Opera necklace An opera necklace is 75 centimetres 30 in to 90 centimetres 35 in long and sits at the breastbone. Rope necklace A rope necklace is any necklace longer than opera length. Lariat necklace A lariat is a very, very long variation on the rope, without a clasp, often worn draped multiple times around the neck; the ends can be crossed over, looped, or knotted in various ways. This type of necklace sometimes incorporates a loop at one or both ends to allow it to be worn in the style of a lasso , or it may be worn doubled over with the ends passed through the loop formed in the middle.

Reportedly, a Necklace of Waterbreathing tends to spawn through a pattern most common in random women or rarely on male characters per game such as Gerdur of Riverwood , Betrid Silver-Blood of Markarth , and so forth. It has also been found in the possession of Mikael of Whiterun , and in the ending chest before exiting Bleak Falls Barrow. It is likely unrelated, but in both of those situations, the player was level 3. The chance to steal one is pretty low: The easiest albeit costly way to obtain a Necklace of Waterbreathing is to get it at level 1 from any general goods merchants or Khajiit traders. Avoid leveling up from the Skills menu and save at least gold to purchase it. Assault the merchant with any attack or Battle Cry to reset their inventory and reload if needed. One way to find a piece with the enchantment is to utilize a skeleton at Cradlecrush Rock that always holds a random piece of enchanted helmet. Simply save somewhere far from Cradlecrush Rock, travel to the area, and check the skeleton. Repeat until an item with Waterbreathing is found. However the odds are very low and it can take a long time to get it. Alternately, one can discover the location, loot the place especially the helmet , travel somewhere far, wait for 10â€”30 days or continue the game normally , and fast travel back to Cradlecrush Rock to get the desired item. A similar way to acquire a piece would be to return to the Shrine of Mehrunes Dagon. Every three game days, the loot will reset. Some form of helmet is the most likely to have the waterbreathing enchantment. Typically, there are two randomly generated enchanted helmets on opposing sides of the treasure chest.
