Those collecting data from more than 5k EU citizens per year will be considered accountable, regardless of company location. Needless to say, this massive fine has attracted serious attention to the regulation. Companies have already started preparations to comply. Legal Background Personal privacy and data protection are currently legislated and enforced in the EU through a patchwork of individual member state laws and independent supervisors. The current lack of a single privacy framework complicates compliance and data transfer for multi-national corporations, while also preventing EU supervisors from addressing privacy violations in a unified manner. More to the point, overly aggressive data driven business models, ineffective lobby strategies and underinvestment in data protection have resulted in a market failure argument stimulating what is a stepwise regulatory change. The GDPR will become the law of the land across the EU, replacing for the most part the current member state regulations. Finally, and significantly, companies can be held in violation if their profiling algorithms are not sufficiently robust. Requirements in storing data. There are some significant issues here. The GDPR will require not only compliance but also accountability, meaning that corporations must be prepared to demonstrate to the supervisors that they are compliant. This will require extensive preparation, undoubtedly including an extensive up-front data audit, documenting the location, type and accessibility of the three types of customer data volunteered, observed, and inferred by data science techniques. Thus, companies will need to know the location of all copies and destinations of any data that may be tied to an individual. Document what data are personal and what may be made personal through various data science techniques. Ensure that user consent is properly implemented before the GDPR takes effect. The reason this is so key is that the current status of the GDPR allows user consent to be grandfathered in. Your ability to use any data that you have collected may be severely limited under the GDPR if you do not have proper user consent. Ensure that all product roadmaps comply with the principles of Privacy by Design. Communicate with product owners so that products developed in the future maintain full functionality while still complying with the restrictions on data collection required by the GDPR. Design these products so that business critical data can be collected in a way that honors privacy laws while still enabling the business to be data driven to the fullest possible extent. Initiate dialogue with your corporate privacy officer or external expert. The stakes have become quite high, and the subject matter is complex. There will need to be strong 2-way communication between legal and technical experts, and that communication should start very soon.

Writing conventions, and especially point-of-view POV shifts, are ignored, leaving the puzzled reader often uncertain about the position and status of forces relative to each other in the fast-paced battle environment. Fans of the techno-thriller willing to overlook repeated amateur errors in written English might like to give this story a try. I do not recommend this novel. The novel sets up a political situation I found at best implausible. The story relies on a sidelined United States military even in the face of bald Asian intervention in South American military and strategic affairs, as well as an overly simplistic, almost 19th century understanding of naval power and geography-based economic power. On the Western political side, the novel evinces a strong bias in favor of well-worn conservative positions. While such a stance is common in the sub-genre, short shrift is given to the politics, and the driving force for heroic conservatives to overpower the caricatures of sniveling Labour Party liberals in their midst is not well supported. But these are minor considerations. This unfortunate mismanagement of writing norms was strongest in the fast-paced battle scenes that absolutely demand clearly articulated facts. I found this sloppiness very hard to swallow, indeed. If I had not been obliged to review this poorly written novel, I would have rejected it after just a few pages of reading. If this were the case, anyone who has ever served on a submarine, aircraft carrier, or special forces regiment could pen a story worth reading. No, the techno-thriller demands such mastery of the written language as to allow the reader to understand rapid-fire give-and-take in the heat of battle. Masters of the sub-genre, like Tom Clancy, take great pains to guide readers through the most technically challenging battle sequences. Storm on the Horizon fails in this regard in almost every scene. The writing was uniformly amateurish and difficult to read. It took me until about a quarter of the way through the book to understand the very peculiar use of italicization, which seemed at first willy-nilly. Basically, whenever a common English word was used in military context requiring a specialized definition, or when a code name or slang expression was used, the word or phrase was italicized. I found the practice distracting and irritating long after I understood the bizarre affectation. Sometimes British characters spoke British English, but more often than not, they spoke some variant of American English. Quotation marks often pointed in the wrong direction, especially after an em dash.
