Ecclesiastes Chapter 3 Verses These verses speak of an appointed time. Not only does God fix the standard and withhold or dispense satisfaction 2: Earthly pursuits are good in their proper place and time, but unprofitable when pursued as the chief goal. Verse 1 , is speaking of all the things collectively, that he will detail in the next few verses. Certain events are ordained from the foundation of the earth. A very good example of this very thing is the fact that Abraham the father of the faithful , was born years after Adam. Then Israel became a nation in our time. Another time I believe to be very significant, is the approximate years of work for the people of the earth, then God will set up a thousand year day of Sabbath of rest. We are nearing the end of the six year days of work. Jesus will come back to the earth as King and reign in perfect peace for six year day of rest. This will not change, until Jesus the King of Peace , comes and sets up His thousand year reign of peace upon the earth. God is not against war, when it is preserving the right. One of the most interesting examples of God blessing in war is found in chapter 17 of Exodus. Joshua fought while Moses lifted his arms in praise to God. *A time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; time to kill. Deuteronomy See now that I, even I, am he, and there is no god with me: I kill, and I make alive; I wound, and I heal: neither is there any that can deliver out of my hand.*

To bring ourselves to our state in life, is our duty and wisdom in this world. Then let us seize the favourable opportunity for every good purpose and work. The time to die is fast approaching. Thus labour and sorrow fill the world. This is given us, that we may always have something to do; none were sent into the world to be idle. It would seem that most of his own works described in Ecclesiastes 2: The rare word translated "season" means emphatically "fitting time" compare Nehemiah 2: Jamieson-Fausset-Brown Bible Commentary 3. Out of this time and order, killing is murder. To heal spiritually, before the sinner feels his wound, would be "out of time," and so injurious. A time to kill; when a man shall die a violent death, either by chance, as Exodus A time to heal; when he who seemed to be mortally wounded shall be healed and restored. A time to break down; when houses shall be demolished, either by the fancy of the owner, or by the rage of other men, or otherwise. A time to kill, and a time to heal, Aben Ezra interprets it "to wound", because of the opposite "to heal"; and so there is a time when wounds and diseases are incurable, and baffle all the skill of the physician, being designed unto death; and there is a time when, by the blessing of God on means, they are healed; the wound or sickness not being unto death: This includes in the induction the death which man inflicts in battle or single combat, in attack or self-defence, or in administering justice, and with it the verb that includes all the resources of the healing art which can raise men from all but actual death. This, rather than a fatalistic theory of Necessity, as being what man cannot, even if he will, resist, seems the thought expressed. The wise man knows when to slay and when to heal. Of the mere literal sense we have a striking illustration in the paraphrase of the words of Elisha to Gehazi 2 Kings 5: The time to kill might refer to war, only that occurs in ver. Some endeavor to limit the notion to severe surgical operations performed with a view of saving life; but the verb harag does not admit of the meaning "rebound" or "cut. And this possession, acquired with such labour and restlessness, he must leave to others; for equally with the fool he fails under the stroke of death:

Pervaded as it is with pessimism, paradox, and a multitude of contradictions, Ecclesiastes has long been one of the most difficult books of the Bible to understand.*

The Theophilus Project "I too decided to write an orderly account for you, dear Theophilus, so that you may know the truth He recalled, several years later, "One of the soldiers was not happy with how a nurse was taking care of his wound, and he slapped the nurse. A doctor came over, to speak with the man. The soldier pushed his head through a window. And he was teaching anatomy, so he had a very strong influence over the medical students," he said. The sitting president, "through this minister, appealed to us to keep the hospital open. So we, the medical students, took over the hospital. He was a student on a pediatric rotation, and he instantly became the head of pediatrics. Everywhere around him, he saw a health system that had been broken downâ€”or that had not been built up to begin with. The time to be broken down was over. The doctor switched fields completely, moving from being a general practitioner to practicing surgery, and he is now the chief surgical resident of a bed Christian hospital in Cameroon. There, despite low pay and relatively little prestige, he and 25 other doctors practice their craft. There, lives are saved so that they may be built up again. This is a new, but relatively brief, sermon series for us to begin. This series is only three weeks long, which I think is about as short as a sermon series can be and still be called a seriesâ€”otherwise, it would just be a two-volume set, right? The challenge is, just as the author of Ecclesiastes often looks back, we must, by nature of where we are, look forwards! Because spiritually, even if not physically, we have been there! Spiritually, we were in the situation that many third-world hospitals are in physicallyâ€”lots of worry that we did not have the means to meet the needs of the community in which we lived. And believe it or not, misery loves company for a reason. The writer of Ecclesiastesâ€”traditionally believed to be King Solomon, the son of Davidâ€”would definitely have been one such person today. If books in the Bible were Dr. Seuss characters, Ecclesiastes would be the Grinch. If books in the Bible were Sesame Street charactersâ€”well, you get the idea. And as much as we might want to write of Solomon today as a Debbie downer, he is becoming increasingly a part of our target audience for today. And I say this precisely because of this poem in the third chapter of Ecclesiastes. But all the others are left to the option of man, though God continues to overrule them by his providence. What Adam Clarke is saying is that, much how Solomon himself would likely see things, what is done is done, and it is that way precisely because that is how God created the world to be. But, he says, we always have the option of doing all other manner of things. There is a time to plant and a time to sow, but we are the ones who actually choose when to sow and when to reap. And I absolutely, without a doubt, believe that God has given us this time as a time to build up after having been broken down. Much like the world itself, we are capable of rising from the ashes of fire and dust and creating a new thing! One is a change to our Constitution to reflect how one formally becomes a member at FCC. These loans are most often offered by credit unions or community banks; at least one lender offers them online. Find out whether the card issuer reports authorized user activity to the credit bureaus. Not every credit score takes these payments into account, but some do, and that may be enough to get a loan or credit card that firmly establishes your credit history for all lenders.
