Jul 17 Sacrament Talk: I think it turned out pretty well: Whether or not we have great grandparents who pulled handcarts across the plains, whether we were born into the church or were baptized yesterday, as Latter-day Saints, we all get to draw from this great well of pioneer devotion and sacrifice to fill our hearts. This is not the only dispensation where pioneer stories have been helpful in strengthening the Saints. In Alma chapter 5 in the Book of Mormon, the prophet Alma gives a great talk where he does the same thing. Then Alma reminds them of the hardships faced by those previous generations who had founded their church, starting in verse 5: I say unto you, they were in captivity, and again the Lord did deliver them out of bondage by the power of his word; and we were brought into this land, and here we began to establish the church of God throughout this land also. Just as Alma reminded the Nephites, our own ancestors in the church made great sacrifices to follow their testimony of the truth of the restored gospel of Jesus Christ. Many were separated from family, many had to leave their homes, and when they joined with the church, they faced nearly constant adversity, until they had to leave all, and follow the prophet into the wilderness of the pioneer trail. Then, in verses 6 and 7, Alma asks them the question that we ask ourselves and each other every July: And now behold, I say unto you, my brethren, you that belong to this church, have you sufficiently retained in remembrance the captivity of your fathers? Yea, and have you sufficiently retained in remembrance his mercy and long-suffering towards them? And moreover, have ye sufficiently retained in remembrance that he has delivered their souls from hell? Behold, he changed their hearts; yea, he awakened them out of a deep sleep, and they awoke unto God. Behold, they were in the midst of darkness; nevertheless, their souls were illuminated by the light of the everlasting word; yea, they were encircled about by the bands of death, and the chains of hell, and an everlasting destruction did await them. Perhaps we could remember that the Lord blesses us physically and spiritually, just as He has always saved those who love Him. It was the power of God that led the early Saints in their trials with mobs and starting new lives in the church, and then guiding them across the wilderness, and then still as they struggled to turn these deserts into a home. How do we find such great faith? How do we keep it throughout our lives? The same chapter of the Book of Mormon we were discussing before, chapter 5, verses , contains the answer. After Alma taught the Nephites about their own pioneer forefathers, he taught them about the faith, both in the past and the present: And now I ask of you on what conditions are they saved? Yea, what grounds had they to hope for salvation? What is the cause of their being loosed from the bands of death, yea, and also the chains of hell? Behold, I can tell youâ€”did not my father Alma believe in the words which were delivered by the mouth of Abinadi? And was he not a holy prophet? Did he not speak the words of God, and my father Alma believe them? And according to his faith there was a mighty change wrought in his heart. Behold I say unto you that this is all true. And behold, he preached the word unto your fathers, and a mighty change was also wrought in their hearts, and they humbled themselves and put their trust in the true and living God. And behold, they were faithful until the end; therefore they were saved. And there it is. When we go to the words of the prophets, in scripture and in the church today, and strive to make those teachings a part of who we are, we come nearer to our Savior and Redeemer and are blessed by Him. Doctrine and Covenants And, finding there was greater happiness and peace and rest for me, I sought for the blessings of the fathers, and the right whereunto I should be ordained to administer the same; having been myself a follower of righteousness, desiring also to be one who possessed great knowledge, and to be a greater follower of righteousness, and to possess a greater knowledge, and to be a father of many nations, a prince of peace, and desiring to receive instructions, and to keep the commandments of God, I became a rightful heir, a High Priest, holding the right belonging to the fathers. What did Abraham want in life? Happiness and peace and rest. To have a great family and to keep the commandments. And what did Abraham do to find these blessings? According to the same verse, he studied the gospel that his own spiritual ancestors had been given, he lived righteously and exercised the priesthood. Ultimately, Abraham was given all the blessings he sought,

just as we know the Lord wants to pour out great blessings upon us. The lives of all these pioneers testify to the promise of the Lord found in Doctrine and Covenants Draw near unto me and I will draw near unto you; seek me diligently and ye shall find me; ask, and ye shall receive; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. I know that Jesus Christ lives and loves us and blesses us through His restored church and the gospel. I know that He will save all of us as we love Him and serve Him, just as He has always done, for pioneers past, present, and future, for God is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. In the name of Jesus Christ, amen.

As most are aware, the cold behind the system was record setting at some location, but regardless was cold enough to do damage to some of the fall crops, most unfortunately. I saw some readings down into the single digits, especially where there was decent snow cover. The snow was not unexpected either as I did mention that too. However, unexpectedly there was light rain yesterday and last night across much of the high plains. More on that later. In the meantime, here is the latest satellite image There are a couple of interesting and possibly important features on this map. First, as I mentioned the rain that fell yesterday and last night had been unexpected when I did the post on the 11th. It was a weak feature that was "left over" from the pattern that brought the cold. I did not foresee this moving into the plains and providing support for precipitation. Presently there is another weak system the X over central California. This could be one of those signals for things to come this winter. Also on the satellite image is the red x on the southeast bottom right side of the image above. This is yet another tropical system in the Pacific that will impact Texas as it moves north and northeast as it weakens. Wow this flooding across central Texas has been unreal and these additional system will extend and even worsen the flooding. Here is the precipitation outlook through the end of next week that is provided by the Weather Prediction Center In general, it appears somewhat favorable going into the first week of November with just a few minor rain events i. Again, just a wag. It depends on where the forcing for the pattern is located and how much contribution each area is providing that is producing the pattern. Other things will be considered too. But what is causing those outcomes? I disagree with it! Mild to me implies warm with many days of golfing opportunities. But mild for winter might really mean above normal temperatures compared to winter temperatures that are generally pretty cold. Really to have a good idea, I would still need another weeks to watch this new pattern unfold. My initial gut feeling and thoughts is this winter should be much snowier or maybe more freezing rain with temperatures at or below normal. I should say snowier from October 1 through April As time gets into November, I should have a much better idea so will fine tune or completely throw out that initial gut feeling.

Share via Email The fiercest tornadoes to hit the United States for more than a decade left a huge trail of death, devastation and damage across the central plains states of Oklahoma and Kansas yesterday. Thousands of homes were turned into piles of shattered wood and glass as the tornadoes swept through the area. In some areas, whole neighbourhoods looked as though they had been hit by bombs. Hundreds of residents evacuated their houses after warnings were broadcast on Monday night. This made it difficult for the emergency services to give an accurate account of casualties. The overall death toll was one of the worst from storms in the US mainland since tornadoes killed 90 people in Ohio and Pennsylvania in . Severe thunderstorms continued to hit the area yesterday, hampering rescue and clean-up efforts. Tornado warnings were in force for parts of central Oklahoma. Far to the north, in Kansas, a fellow fire chief added: One tornado was said to have stayed on the ground for more than four hours, far more than the average lifetime of such storms, which rarely last more than half an hour at full force. The largest storm formed approximately 45 miles to the south-west of Oklahoma City and sliced a path more than half a mile wide. Local television stations carried live pictures of the progress of the storms, giving viewers up-to-the-minute calculations of the likely routes across the state. With power lines down and the area in darkness, and survivors hunting for loved ones and lost belongings, it was a terrifying night. In the worst hit district in the community of Moore, survivors told of saving their lives by sheltering in metal bath tubs covered by mattresses or bedclothes. God had all of us in this street in his hands. Two of his companions in the mobile home were severely injured. In Oklahoma, the dead included 11 people in the Bridge Creek area, about 30 miles from Oklahoma City. In Kansas, the twisters were centred in the Wichita area, where one storm tore across a mile stretch of the state, and was reported to be three miles wide at times. The Kansas governor, Bill Graves, declared a state of emergency. Tornadoes kill an average of 80 people each year in the US, mainly in the spring months and predominantly in the plains states and the south-east. Last year, a tornado killed 42 in Florida, and another storm killed 34 in Alabama. Around people were killed by tornadoes which hammered eleven midwestern states in April
