Admission Requirements Admission Requirements. Admission to the program requires a master's degree (thesis based) with an overall average of B+. In addition the applicant must hold a medical degree and certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada or its equivalent in other countries.

Grades are, however, converted to their McGill equivalent. Conversion charts, as well as required admission documentation for each country, are provided by Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies and prospective students should refer to these in order to determine if they are admissible to our program. All supplemental application materials and supporting documents must be uploaded directly to the McGill admissions processing system. All students must be matched to a supervisor to be admitted to our graduate programs; this matching will occur during the application process i. After the application has been received, the applicants will have an opportunity to be chosen for an interview with one of our supervisors if the minimum admission requirements have been met. Application form and fee: All applicants must complete the Online Application. The application must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee payable by credit card Visa or Mastercard ; fee amounts and details are listed on the Student Accounts website. Please ensure you apply for the M. All relevant research experience should be included in your CV since you are essentially applying for a research position in the Department. Two 2 or three 3 letters of reference must accompany any application to our program. These letters must be no more than six months old, must be on letterhead paper, and are required to be uploaded to the admissions processing system. Referees will also be asked to rank each applicant and to provide a size of the comparison i. Any applicant having undertaken previous graduate studies whether at McGill or elsewhere should make sure that one of the letters of reference is from their graduate supervisor. On the application form, applicants must provide the names and

email addresses of referees. Neither of these reference letters should be from the proposed supervisor. Applicants must submit a personal statement in which they: The statement should be no more than two 2 pages long. Writing Assessment Interview Official Transcripts: Applicants must submit one 1 official copy of all transcripts for all post-secondary education undertaken Quebec students need not submit CEGEP transcripts. Unofficial transcripts may be uploaded to the McGill admissions processing system and an official transcript must be sent at a later time when the letter of acceptance has been sent by Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies via Minerva since this will be a condition of the letter. Official transcripts are not required for studies conducted at McGill University students may upload a Minerva copy of their McGill transcript with their application and this will be sufficient. 2: Residency Requirements "B" School of Medicine University of Louisville

Admission Requirements "B" in undergraduate work MD; Residency in Family Medicine and CCFP or equivalent; Applicant must be currently practicing Family Medicine in the country in which they reside.

In addition the applicant must hold a medical degree and certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada or its equivalent in other countries. Applicants must also be currently practicing Family Medicine in the country in which they reside. All applicants must be fluent in spoken and written English. Applicants whose first language is not English must provide proof of English proficiency. In this option students must be recommended by their supervisor, have completed the four core courses and have completed a research project of limited scope. Applicants must submit the following items with their online application: Original transcripts sent directly from issuing institution are required once an offer has been made. A current curriculum vitae A written statement maximum of 6 pages double spaced detailing the following: Admission is effective in the fall term September. After you submit your application with payment of the application fee , the online application system will contact your referees and provide a link where they may add their reference. Once you have submitted your application, you are not able to access it to make changes. Paper based reference forms are no longer used. On the online application, please enter your score. We will look for the official report using the details provided by the unofficial report. The minimum acceptable score is 86, with no individual score below 20 for the internet based version, or for the paper and pencil version, although some programs require a higher minimum score. The minimum acceptable score is 6 out of 9. Students must have at least 80 on each of the sections and an overall score of at least The minimum acceptable score is Western English Language Centre. 3: Family Medicine

Admission Requirements All applications will be screened through the ERAS on-line service for consideration of an interview. We will appoint only those candidates who intend to complete the full three-year training program except in instances where candidates are being considered for admission with advance standing.

Admission Requirements Prior to matriculation each applicant must meet the following requirements: Applications from students with at least three years of exceptional undergraduate work will be considered. Eight semester hours of Biology, including two semester hours of laboratory. Eight semester hours of Physics, including two semester hours of laboratory. Six semester hours of English composition and literature. Prospective students are urged to take the test as early as possible and no later than September of the year prior to matriculation. For those who are submitting an updated test score, a January test date will be accepted. The MCAT must be taken within three years of the desired date of matriculation. Although the requirements and the processes are the same, each application is evaluated for that particular campus by the individual Faculty Committee on Admissions for each campus. There is no pre-screening process; all applicants receive the supplemental. However, early submission is strongly recommended as interviewees are selected and decisions are rendered on a rolling basis. For enrollment, exams taken before August will not be accepted to complete an applicant record. OR Three faculty letters of recommendation: The remaining required letter can come from any other faculty member. All Recommendation letters must be on letterhead and preferably signed by the recommenders. We cannot accept letters from other sources. If a letter of recommendation has been added to AACOMAS after you have received this message, please notify us via email to admissions pcom. Your Online Application Summary portal login sent via email upon receipt of application will not list each letter received. Rather, those listed will only reflect those that will help satisfy the Letter of Recommendation requirement. The PreHealth letter will remain required until received OR all three faculty letters have been received. Candidates are expected to review the applicant portals frequently and to exercise patience during the processing of all application materials. Once required items are received and processed, a received date will be populated in each appropriate field. The Office of Admissions cannot verify if applications are complete by phone or email. Interviews Qualified applicants selected by the Faculty Committee on Admissions are invited for a personal on-campus interview on a rolling basis. Interviews begin in mid-September and will be conducted through March. If you are selected for an interview, we will send you an email with a proposed date for your interview. Please add these addresses to your directory so they will not be captured in any email filters. Please check your account on a regular basis. It is your responsibility to notify us, in writing via e-mail to admissions pcom. Postal Service within weeks of their interview date. To ensure that students accepted to PCOM will be permitted to perform clerkships during their third and fourth clinical years, and thus ensure them the opportunity to successfully complete their DO degree requirements, as well as to ensure the safety of the PCOM community, PCOM requires all first year students to complete a criminal background check prior to matriculation using only the PCOM vendor of choice. This process must be completed by the student prior to the start of their first year classes by the posted deadline or the candidate will not be permitted to begin their course work. Directions for this process will be forwarded to accepted and confirmed students in the spring prior to matriculation. English Proficiency Proficiency in written and oral English appropriate to graduate and professional study is expected of all PCOM students. Any applicant whose native language is not English or whose undergraduate instruction was not in English must demonstrate objective competency in English within the past two years by satisfactory performance on the Test of English as a Foreign Language TOEFL. The minimum required score for the IBT Internet Based Testing is 79 and a minimum score of 26 is required for the speaking component. Your score is considered too old, and will not be accepted, if it is more than 2 years old from the start of your admission term. Country of citizenship does not exempt applicants from this requirement. Language of instruction at the college or university level, and how recent it has been, are the determining factors in meeting this requirement. General writing assistance is available for theses and dissertations, however, as an institution offering only graduate and professional programs, PCOM does not

offer remedial ESL coursework. Applicants are exempt from this requirement if: English is the exclusive language of instruction at the undergraduate level; or they have earned a degree from a regionally accredited U. Transfer Students PCOM does not routinely accept transfer students; however, a transfer application may be considered under extenuating circumstances and depending on seats available in the class. Consideration will be given only to a student who is in good standing at an AOA-accredited college of osteopathic medicine or who is eligible for re-admission to the previously attended college of osteopathic medicine. The initial request for transfer must originate from the dean of the college or university from which the student wishes to transfer and must be directed to the dean of the PCOM campus to which he or she is applying. Application materials must be submitted and a formal interview with the Faculty Committee on Admissions will be required once this conversation has occurred. For all other students entering the DO program, PCOM does not grant advanced standing or credit for prior learning or for courses completed at other institutions.

4: Admission Requirements - Northeast Iowa Family Practice Center

Family Medicine Residency. After graduation from medical school, the next step is to complete a residency in family medicine. Students apply to and interview for residency program placement during.

The requirement states that each resident must have a minimum of 2 nursing home patients for 24 consecutive months, in addition to any rotational experience. To meet this requirement, the residency program has created a continuity nursing home service at Renown Skilled Nursing-supervised by clinical faculty who are the Medical Directors of Renown Skilled Nursing. Each resident will be assigned a minimum of 2 patients to provide continuity care during the entirety of the PG 2 and PG 3 years. All residents must see their new Nursing Home continuity patient within 24 hours of admission to the Nursing Home or within 24 hours being assigned to the Nursing Home patient. Communication with the supervising faculty to review the plan of care is essential after the initial visit. Newly admitted patients should be seen again within two weeks. All new Nursing Home patients will be assigned to the resident by the Medical Director. Residents must see their Nursing Home patients at least once per month with no more than a six week lapse between visits. Residents must see their patients more frequently as needed for problems. In the event of a rural or out of town rotation, the resident should see their patient shortly before starting the rotation and shortly after returning in order to meet the requirement. Residents are to coordinate their visits with the supervising faculty. Residents may block out up to one hour per month from FMC time in order to see their nursing home patients. This must be approved in advance by the Office Manager. If there is a scheduling snafu and you have patients scheduled at FMC, that takes priority. After each visit to the Nursing Home, the resident must discuss the visit with the supervising faculty. The attending physician must co-sign the resident note within seventy-two 72 hours. This call may be delayed until reasonable hours. The on call faculty can be called with any urgent issues. If a resident is unable to see their Nursing Home patient for the month for any reason, the resident must make arrangements with their Pod resident partner or another resident if needed to see the patient. Continued problems will be addressed by the program director and Education Committee and may result in further action on a case by case basis. Problems with failure to respond to pages or phone calls will also result in disciplinary action as above. All patients need to be entered into physicianslounge. The resident is responsible for putting a yellow or candy striped sticker on the front of the patients chart with the correct pager number listed. During office hours, the Nursing Home staff has been instructed to page using the answering service for any issues. If the phone call is not returned within 30 minutes or if there is urgency, the Nursing Home will call the FMC Nurses at The resident is expected respond to the Nursing Home on their patient within thirty 30 minutes. The attending physician will investigate the failure to respond and report to the program director. After hours weekends, holidays and weeknights , the Nursing Home will contact the Resident Physician on call using the answering service for issues regarding FMC Nursing Home patients. For many urgent problems that we could normally handle in our office the resident may need to refer the patient to the Emergency Dept. In those cases, the resident should call the ED and assist with transfer of care. If the patient is admitted, the admission should be to the Family Medicine Service.

5: Admission Requirements - Family Medicine - Western University

The School of Public Health and Family Medicine was established in with the aim of becoming a public health institute of excellence in training, research and outreach in Malawi as well as the SADC region.

The section includes a list of required coursework, evaluation of foreign studies, the Medical College Admissions Test MCAT , letters of recommendation, and applying as an early decision applicant. The education of a physician is lifelong. Applicants are encouraged to have a broad educational background; no specific major is deemed superior to another. The premedical studies required for admission are set in order to provide the student with a firm grounding in subjects considered essential for the study of medical sciences, while providing the Admissions Committee a means to evaluate aptitude for scientific work, and to determine interest in the sciences. It is also preferred that course work is taken in a classroom setting. An accepted student is responsible for completing all prerequisite course work prior to matriculation. The following courses must be included in undergraduate study Note: No online science courses, however, online math courses and AP courses are accepted only if displayed on your academic transcript from your undergraduate institution. There is no set designation of time, but having a good understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a physician is extremely important. Applicants who have completed coursework or hold degrees from, a postsecondary institution in Australia, Canada except Quebec , New Zealand, or the United Kingdom will normally not need to have their academic transcripts evaluated and certified for equivalency. Any applicant seeking transfer of credits from an institution outside the United States into a MSM program must have a course-by-course evaluation of relevant transcripts completed by a member of NACES. Applicants are encouraged to have a broad educational background, yet no specific major is deemed superior to another. Applications and information about the test may be obtained from the website <http://www.westernu.edu/medschool/admissions>. Students are emailed a secondary application by invitation only. MCAT Scores that are over three years old from entering class will not be considered. Results of the test must be received by MSM before an applicant can be completely be evaluated by the Admissions Committee. Applicants are strongly urged to take the test in the Spring of the calendar year proceeding the year of entrance into medical school, so that the score can be considered earlier and the test can be taken again in the Fall if improvements in performance are desired. Applicants must submit one of the following: Selected applicants are invited for a personal interview. Following the interview, final decisions are made by the Committee on Admissions. To receive this special consideration the applicant must: Apply only to MSM prior to receiving its admission decision. Applicants must be Georgia residents currently enrolled as seniors or graduates of an accredited regional university or college in the United States. Have a superior academic record and correspondingly strong scores on the MCAT. If invited, appear for a personal interview on a mutually convenient date prior to October 1. Accept a position in the class, if offered one.

6: Baton Rouge General Medical Center

Admission Requirements Applicants for the MPH degree program should have either an advanced degree in a health related discipline (medicine, nursing, social work, etc) or a minimum of 2 years of appropriate post baccalaureate experience in a health related field as determined by the admissions committee.
