

## 1: How to stop calculate during opening excel file? - Microsoft Community

*Hello all, I am new at designing forms in PDF style so please bare with me if this is an ignorant question. I am very fluent in creating documents and workbooks in excel and have basically used that in the past.*

A search can be broad or narrow, including many different kinds of data and covering multiple Adobe PDFs. See [Creating PDF indexes](#). Search and replace features overview You run searches to find specific items in PDFs. You can run a simple search, looking for a search term within in a single file, or you can run a more complex search, looking for various kinds of data in one or more PDFs. You can selectively replace text. You can run a search using either the Search window or the Find toolbar. In either case, Acrobat searches the PDF body text, layers, form fields, and digital signatures. You can also include bookmarks and comments in the search. Only the Find toolbar includes a Replace With option. Find toolbar with Find and Replace options The Search window offers more options and more kinds of searches than the Find toolbar. When you use the Search window, object data and image XIF extended image file format metadata are also searched. PDFs can have multiple layers. If the search results include an occurrence on a hidden layer, selecting that occurrence displays an alert that asks if you want to make that layer visible. Access the search features Where you start your search depends on the type of search you want to run. Use the Find toolbar for a quick search of the current PDF and to replace text. Use the Search window to look for words or document properties across multiple PDFs, use advanced search options, and search PDF indexes. Replace With expands to provide text field Open the Search window Do one of the following: Search appears as a separate window that you can move, resize, minimize, or arrange partially or completely behind the PDF window. Acrobat resizes and arranges the two windows side by side so that together they almost fill the entire screen. Clicking the Arrange Windows button a second time resizes the document window but leaves the Search window unchanged. If you want to make the Search window larger or smaller, drag the corner or edge, as you would to resize any window on your operating system. You can selectively replace the search term with alternative text. You replace text one instance at a time. Type the text you want to search for in the text box on the Find toolbar. To replace text, click Replace With to expand the toolbar, then type the replacement text in the Replace With text box. Optional Click the arrow next to the text box and choose one or more of the following: Whole Words Only Finds only occurrences of the complete word you type in the text box. Case-Sensitive Finds only occurrences of the words that match the capitalization you type. Include Bookmarks Also searches the text in the Bookmarks panel. Include Comments Also searches the text of any comments. Acrobat jumps to the first instance of the search term, which appears highlighted. Click Replace to change the highlighted text, or click Next to go to the next instance of the search term. Alternatively, click Previous to go back to the previous instance of the search term. The Replace With option is not available in the Search window. If documents are encrypted have security applied to them , you cannot search them as part of a multiple-document search. Open those documents first and search them one at a time. However, documents encrypted as Adobe Digital Editions are an exception and can be searched as part of a multiple-document search. Open Acrobat on your desktop not in a web browser. Do one of the following. In the Find toolbar, type the search text, and then choose Open Full Acrobat Search from the pop-up menu. In the Search window, type the search text. From the pop-up menu directly below this option, choose Browse For Location. Select the location, either on your computer or on a network, and click OK. To specify additional search criteria, click Show Advanced Options, and specify the options. During a search, you can click a result or use keyboard shortcuts to navigate the results without interrupting the search. Clicking the Stop button under the search-progress bar cancels further searching and limits the results to the occurrences already found. To see more results, run a new search. Review and save PDF search results Review search results After you run a search from the Search window, the results appear in page order, nested under the names of each searched document. Each item listed includes a few words of context if applicable and an icon that indicates the type of occurrence. Jump to a specific instance in the search results single PDFs only If necessary, expand the search results. Then select an instance in the results to view it in the PDF. To view other instances, click another instance in the results. Sort

instances in the search results Select an option from the Sort By menu near the bottom of the Search window.

Icons shown with search results The icon next to an instance of the search results indicates the search area in which the instance appears. Selecting an icon has the following effect: Document icon Makes the document active in the document window. Expand the list to show the individual search results within that document. The instance of the search term is highlighted in the document.

This font is assigned by default to the Styles in MathType upon installation. The default font used for Greek characters and many other special mathematical symbols is the Symbol font, which you will not need to embed because your recipients will already have it installed. You will need to be familiar with Styles in MathType to fully understand this process. If you have changed the fonts assigned to the Styles in MathType, or used either the Insert Symbol command in the Edit menu or Other command in the Style menu of MathType to include unusual characters into your documents, you should inventory the fonts in your document. To determine which fonts you need to embed in your document with, do the following: Choose Define from the Style menu of MathType. Select Advanced on the Define Styles dialog. Make a list of every font which is assigned to at least one style. If you have used Other command from the Style menu of MathType, add those fonts to your list. If you have characters from other fonts which you have saved in your symbol or macro bars in MathType and have used them in your document, add those fonts to your list. Remove the Symbol font from your list if it appears. Remove common text fonts such as Times New Roman, Courier, Arial, or other fonts that were included with your word processor or are present in the text of your document. It explains how to embed fonts in PDFs. Reading through this section provides all the information necessary for configuration, but we provide references to important sections here for the benefit of our customers who require quick answers. At some point, however, we recommend reading the parts of the Acrobat Guide which are relevant to the process you use to create PDFs so that you can get the most out of Acrobat and its many features. Ensuring your font environment is unambiguous Problems result when both the PostScript and TrueType versions of the same font are installed. Bitmap fonts should not cause problems. When an application needs to use a font, if two different versions of the same font are installed, the one that should be used by an application is ambiguous. Please note that many application installers and updaters will install fonts on your system, so you may not know they were installed. It is necessary to reopen and resave your MathType equations and then the document containing them, before successfully creating a PDF free of ambiguous font references. In the Print dialog, click Properties, and make sure the PDF Settings include the embedded fonts from your list above. PDFMaker will usually provide good results, but some users with large, complex mathematical expressions may experience formatting problems in the equations in their PDFs other than simple font substitution. By using PostScript technology exclusively, more consistent results can be achieved. You must either activate the PostScript fonts before creating your equations, or update your equations afterward. MathType will default to the TrueType versions of its fonts if both versions are available. Click OK to begin the conversion process. Once finished, try the PDF creation process again to see if the results have improved.

## 3: Searching PDFs, Adobe Acrobat

*Hi, everyone. I use Adobe Illustrator CS4 in a MAC. I want to establish a chemical formula  $NO_3^-$  with Illustrator. It seems that I can only first type  $NO_3$ , and then set 3 as subscript, afterwards I input -, and set it as superscript.*

Since I am more comfortable designing in AI, I needed to figure out how to save my files so I could still use them with my Silhouette Cameo. The DXF files are for basic line drawings only though. I will show you how to save both ways! If you are using text, make sure the text is expanded by selecting Object - Expand, then select OK. Now you will see the blue lines and anchor points around the outside of the text. Around each individual letter. If you saved the file like this, everywhere you have a thin blue line will be cut with your Silhouette blade so you will not end up with one continuous design. You will need to combine any overlapping parts of the design by selecting Pathfinder - Unite this is the same as Merge in the Silhouette Studio. Now you will see one continuous design that is ready for cutting. Before we get to saving I want to talk about outlines. Say you wanted to cut an outline of an object so you made the stroke of your design thicker. Well you see that thin blue line, that is where your Silhouette will cut, not on the outside of the black line. So you are not going to get an outline of the text like you were thinking. To make the Silhouette cut around the black lines of your design, select Object - Expand, and OK again. Now you will have those thin blue lines and anchor points around the black design again. You will be cutting the outline of the text. When you are finished with your design and happy where the cut lines will be, select File - Export to save your file as a DXF for the Silhouette. In the Export Box, name your file and select where you want to save it. Select OK to the default save settings. Now it is time to open your new file in Silhouette Studio. Once you open your file you will only see the lines. All the fill is gone. This is because AutoCAD files are for lines only. You will also notice that all the different lines are ungrouped you can easily group them in Silhouette Studio. But your design will be ready for you to resize as needed and cut with your Silhouette Cameo. You will also need to upgrade your Silhouette Studio. Group things together for more complex designs, because SVG files will keep those groups when transferred to Silhouette Studio. Also, make sure to expand any text and borders like we did in the above example. Those same rules apply with those thin blue lines becoming your cut lines. And use dotted lines for areas you want to fold instead of cut. In the Save As box, name your file and select where you want it to save. Then change the format to SVG svg and hit Save. Open your new file in Silhouette Studio Designer Edition. Once open you will notice that the different parts of the design are grouped together. To ungroup them right-click on the selection and select Ungroup. If you click on Cut Setting, you will notice that SVG files are not immediately designated for cutting. The vector lines are there, but you will need to tell Silhouette Studio which lines you want cut and how. To tell Silhouette Studio which lines to cut, select the line or group and in the Cut Setting box select Cut. Now you will see these lines highlighted in red and they will be cut with your blade. With CC, Radish Lab designed and created the visualizations, developing an automated system to simplify the process. For each city we had the current number of dangerously hot days per year, as well as the predicted numbers for and According to the model, numbers are significantly rising for most cities. We needed to take those figures and show them in an impactful way, making them easy to comprehend and compare. The real challenge was that we needed to do it for all cities. A simple bar chart would do the trick, but to update such a chart for each city would take way too long. Luckily, Adobe Illustrator, although not primarily a data-centric application, does allow some nifty tricks for dynamically editing images, text, and graphs based on imported data. It also lets you automate tasks to simplify exporting data sets as separate files. Cleaning the Raw Data As with any good data visualization, one of the first steps is assessing and cleaning the data you have. Then, we created a column for the Data Set Name which would become our filename, using another Excel formula to combine text with a prefix and suffix. Data Sets must have different names in Illustrator, which was fine with us because so must filenames. Formatting Data for Use The next step was the tricky part and does require a bit of coding know-how. We created a simple bar chart in Illustrator with three vertical bars. Next, we selected the entire graph and in the Variable palette window, clicked on the Make Graph Dynamic icon in the lower left and named the variable. Then we clicked the Capture Data Set button camera icon in the Variable palette and chose Save Variable Library from the Variable palette dropdown menu. The library is exported as a data format known as XML. So, our plan was to use that XML file as a template for converting our existing data into the correct structure. The good news is that Excel actually allows you use an external XML file as a schema for mapping data from a spreadsheet. So, we had to employ a workaround. First, we copied the data from Excel to a TextEdit document formatted for plain text to get rid of any underlying formulas or formatting that might cause trouble always a good habit. Then, we converted the comma separated text to XML using this handy web app. Lastly, we opened the XML file exported from Illustrator and dropped our newly converted code in the appropriate place. Visualizing and Styling In Illustrator, you can change some visual characteristics of a graph by control-clicking on it and choosing Design. This way, we made the horizontal tick marks full-width and specified other formatting attributes of our X and Y axes. We also added the gradient to our bars here and set their width and distance from each other. Styling a graph this way does have its limits though so, next we needed to select individual elements manually. However, if you ungroup a graph object in Illustrator, you lose the ability to update that graph with data. It essentially becomes just another collection of shapes. In our case, we wanted to give the axes and tick marks a white stroke. Using the Group Direct Selection Tool white arrow with plus sign , you can click two or three times on an element to select grouped elements, for example all the bars of a particular color in a bar graph. Elements in a graph object are nested in multiple groups and can be tricky to isolate. Styling a graph in Illustrator can be tricky but there are some good resources out there to help you. Just remember, you want to finalize the design and the data before you start automating anything, so customize the look completely before proceeding. The Narrator goes over linking up objects and text with an XML file as well as creating an action for saving your file in the desired format and applying that action to batch process by data sets. In other words, you can individually save all your newly generated elements in a single step. This is the XML converter he uses, quite handy for updating text and images, as he did. The graph may not change at first, but you can confirm it worked by choosing any of the newly created graphs from the Data Set dropdown at the top of the palette. When cycling, you may get the following error: Automating Export The last step was to convert all those separate data sets into separate files. Once again, we were going to automate the process. First, we recorded a save action. From the Actions palette, we created a new action, named it, and hit record. Then, we saved the file with our desired settings, location, and file format. We ended the recording, being sure to turn off the dialogue box second column from

the left in the Actions palette. This tells Illustrator to process each Save Dialog Box with the default setting used originally and not pause with each dialog box. Then we wanted to use that action to batch process all the data sets. From the Actions palette dropdown menu, we selected Batch and chose the action we just made. One parting tip, you may not know this but newer Mac operating systems allow for batch renaming files so if you wanted to edit the names of a lot of files all at once, use this handy trick. In Acrobat X, exporting to Excel is super simple and works great. I received this email from a paralegal at a large law firm recently: An attorney has asked me to convert PDFs we received in discovery to Excel. The PDFs are tabular in nature probably originated in Excel. Some are scanned in from paper and others appear to be converted electronically. How do I do this? Fortunately, Acrobat 9 offers a couple of different ways to export to Excel. Select table and open in Excel This allows you to select a portion of a page and open it in Excel. It works best on files which were converted directly from Excel to PDF. Office Acrobat generally will usually do a pretty good job converting the text, but formatting and column widths will look different than the original. Acrobat only copies over the text. Formulas will not convert. Converting to Excel from PDF: How to use it: Your cursor will change shape to: Copy as Table will copy the data to the clipboard. From there, you can paste it into Excel or another document. Only Copy as Table and Save as Table are available. It seems to work best on documents which were: Make sure you update. Depending on your file associations, you may not be able to double-click the resulting XML file to open it in Excel. Each page in the PDF is converted to a different worksheet in the Excel file. Look at the tabs at the bottom of the screen. This works in any version of Acrobat 9.
