The car failed to negotiate a curve, side0swiped five guard posts and crashed into a concrete bridge abutment near the Bauneg Beg Grange Hall about 6: The youth would have graduated with the last Wednesday evening. Ronald Mosher, 17, son of Mr. Clyde Mosher, 7 Riverside Avenue, received a concussion, abrasions of the right side of his face and a badly bruised ankle and knee. Paul Dumont, 16, son of Mr. Emile Dumont, Lebanon Street, was badly shaken up, in a state of mild shock when first treated, complained of chest pains and had a bruised left hand. Maurice Dube, 17, son of Mr. Dube, 7 Douglas Street, received a concussion, fractured jaw and a lacerated chin in the accident. Dube was taken to Portland Tuesday to have his jaw wired, and was expected home Wednesday, according to Dr. Lincourt, who treated the injured. Robert Dugre, 16, son of Mr. Dugre, Dumont and Mosher have been discharged from the hospital, Dr. The dead youth had swapped cars with teammate Roger Valliere in order to reach Sanford in time to make the services. Death was caused by a fractured skull and a ruptured liver, Medical Examiner Dr. Dugre and Dumont, the only ones of the six who were capable of action, gave what first aid they could to their companions, then Dugre ran to the nearest telephone to call an ambulance. Doucette is survived by his parent, his stepfather, Jeremiah Creedon, maternal grandfather, Jean-Baptiste Thibodeau, a sister, Mrs. Doris Benvie, all of Sanford, and by his paternal grandparents, Mr. George Doucette, Wakefield, Mass. He was born in Sanford, December 8, He was secretary of the graduating class, played center field on the baseball team and was a half-back on the varsity football team. LeBlanc, the sad event occurring at his home here on Saturday, June 29th at 7 p. He passed quietly and peacefully to his eternal rest after a long and trying illness borne with his usual fortitude and courage. He was a patient at the Infirmary, Halifax for several months, and leaving that institution he was conveyed to Inverness, where he was tenderly cared for by Mrs. He arrived home about the middle of May accompanied by his wife and his nephew, J. His condition was most serious and in a few short weeks after his arrival he succumbed to the Grim Reaper and entered into that bourne from which no traveller returns. LeBlanc was in the 67th year of his age. Deceased was one of the most popular physicians that ever practiced his profession in Richmond County, and his patients were numbered by the hundreds. He possessed a most winning personality and his patients were attracted towards him by his kindness and his deep salicitude for their physical welfare. When the announcement of his death was made deep sorrow entered into the hearts of his many friends and many tears were shed over his passing. No matter at what hour of the day or night he was called to attend any of his numerous patients, be they well-to-do or poor, he would come from even a sick bed to attend them. It is little wonder, then, that his death has caused such profound sorrow among people he served so faithfully and skillfully for so many years. The Doctor was a son of the late Capt. Benjamin LeBlanc, honoured residents of this town for many years. LeBlanc was for some years a prominent politician, representing Richmond County in the Provincial Legislature for several terms. He was a member of the Rhodes Government without portfolio for a time. Ready of utterance, keen of wit, eloquent in expression and vigorous in thought, his platform work was always inspiring. All citizens of Isle Madame and many people elsewhere throughout the province will join, in spirit, in this tribute to the memory of Dr. He was a life-long Conservative and his colleague in two elections was the late Dr. Jack MacDonald, of St. Peters, who later was appointed to the Senate. They were a strong team and unbeatable. Those were hectic days in the political history of Richmond County. French Acadian residents of Isle Madame turned out on Tuesday to pay a stirring tribute to one of their most beloved sons, Dr. LeBlanc, family hysician and friend to thousands during his 39 years as a medical practitioner in this district. Funeral services were held in the historic Arichat church which was constructed in to replace the church on the same site which had served as the Diocesan seat. Present in the sanctuary was Rev. Mombourquette, who retired recently after serving as parish priest at Arichat for 40 years. The careers of Father Mombourquette and the late Dr. LeBlanc were closely interlocked in matters of life and death in this Richmond County shiretown. The church was draped in purple and white in mourning for a beloved son. Pall bearers, all life-long friends of the deceased were: The sympathy of the whole community goes out to the widow in her hour of deep affliction. LeBlanc, 67, one-time Minister without portfolio in the Nova Scotia Government and one of the best known medical practitioners in the province, died at his home here Saturday night after an illness of 17 months. A native of Arichat, he received his early education in Richmond County schools and was graduated with the degree of bachelor of arts from St. He qualified for his medical degree at Dalhousie University. During the First Great War Dr. LeBlanc held the rank of captain in the medical corps and for some time was stationed at the old Moxham Castle in Sydney. After demobilization he returned to Arichat where he practised for more than 39 years and became one of the most beloved and most widely esteemed residents of Richmond County. A powerful figure in the Conservative Party in Richmond County, he was a member of the Provincial Legislature for 12 years, being first elected in From to he was minister without portfolio in the cabinet of the late Hon. Rhodes, who later became Minister of Finance in the Federal Government. Another brother, Gus, a mechanical engineer, died at New Victoria a few years ago. LeBlanc was a member of the Knights of Columbus. The funeral will be held Tuesday morning at 9:
