Why America Is in Jeopardy Secularization and its consequences. It is easy to respect secular Americans who hold fast to the Constitution and to American values generally. And any one of us who believes in God can understand why some people, given all the unjust suffering in the world, just cannot believe that there is a Providential Being. But one cannot respect the view that America can survive without the religious beliefs and values that shaped it. The argument that there are moral secularists and moral atheists is a non-sequitur. Of course there are moral Americans devoid of religion. There were moral people who believed in Zeus. But an America governed by Roman religion would not be the America that has been the beacon of freedom and the greatest force for good in the world. How will we go about "checking and controlling the anti-social passions of man" without traditional American religious beliefs? There are two possible responses: One is that most Americans or people generally, but we are talking about America here do not have anti-social passions. The other is that most Americans again, like all other human beings do have anti-social passions, but the vast majority of us can do a fine job checking and controlling them without religion as it has been practiced throughout American history. These are the views with which virtually every American who attends secular high school or university is explicitly and implicitly indoctrinated. And not just wrong, but foolish and lethal to the American experiment. To deny that human beings are filled with anti-social passions betrays a denial of reality and a lack of self-awareness. One has to be taught nonsense for a great many formative years to believe it. Only moral primitives, the argument goes, need either a judging God or a religious set of rules. The Enlightened can do fine without them and need only to consult their faculty of reason and conscience to know how to behave. Our prisons are filled with people whose consciences are quite at peace with their criminal behavior. As for reason, they used it well to figure out how to get away with everything from murder to white-collar crime. But our prisons are not filled with religious Jewish and Christian murderers. On the contrary, if all Americans attended church weekly, we would need far fewer prisons, and the ones we needed would have very few murderers in them. Meanwhile the record of the godless and Christianity-less crowd is awful. I am not simply referring to the godless and secular Communist regimes of the 20th century that committed virtually every genocide of that century. I am referring to those Americans and Europeans who use reason to argue, among other foolish things: And that is a short list. For proof of the moral and intellectual consequences of the secularization of America, look at what has happened to the least religious institution in America, the university. The game involves three contestants providing the questions to trivia answers. There are three players each game and the game is run by a host who calls on contestants and reads the clues. The first round consists of six categories with five answers each worth, , , , and 1, dollars, respectively. When a clue is read each contestant who knows the answer tries to buzz in first. If the first buzzer gets it incorrect, another contestant may try. When a clue is answered correctly and in the form of a question the player gains its dollar amount, if they guess it incorrectly or buzz in and fail to answer at all, that dollar amount is deducted from their score. The contestant who answers the clue correctly gets to select the next category and question. Hidden throughout the game are "Double Jeopardy! These can be answered only by the contestant who selects them, and the contestant may wager any amount of money they have. The Jeopardy round is played under a time limit, meaning all the clues might not be played before time runs out. At the end of the Jeopardy round the category for double Jeopardy is revealed. Contestant decide how much of their money they want to wager depending on the category. Once the clue is revealed, the contestants have thirty seconds to write their response. The person with the most money at the end wins, which means a contestant can win the game even if they do not answer Final Jeopardy correctly. Reception The show has been won 31 Daytime Emmy Awards. Gameplay[change change source] Unlike regular trivia games, the questions are given as clues, and players come up with questions as an answer. For example, a clue would be "one of our Founding Fathers , he was our first president", and the correct response would be "who is George Washington? The game of Jeopardy! In this round there are two Daily Doubles instead of one. During the commercial break, players write their wagers based on their knowledge of the given category. After the commercial break, the host reads the clue. The players have 30 seconds to write their answers, again in the form of a question. During this time the lights dim, and the "Think! The player with the most money at the end of the game keeps his or her winnings and comes back to the next show. Most of these were composed by Merv Griffin. The best known theme song is "Think! It has served as the countdown music for the Final Jeopardy! When the series was revived in , "January, February, March" served as the opening theme, and "Frisco Disco" served as the closing theme, both of which were composed by Merv Griffin himself. The original version of the main theme consisted of saxophones and synthesizers along with the original recording of "Think! In , the main theme was remixed to include congas. It was used for tournaments in Season 8, and then it was put permanently into use in Season 9. In , both the main theme and "Think! In , the theme was rearranged, and its tempo increased. Set[change change source] Like the theme music, the Jeopardy! The original game board was exposed behind a curtain. The clues were printed on clue cards, which were shown as a player asked for a certain clue and its value. In , the cards were dropped in favor of flipping panels which had the dollar value on one side and the clue on the other. Also, the curtain was changed to double-slide panels. When the show came back in , the game board was changed again. This time it was made up of 30 television screens for each clue in the categories. In , the original screens were changed to larger screens. In , the screens were changed to a projection video wall. The contestants compete in a quiz game comprising three rounds: First two rounds[edit] The layout of the Jeopardy! On the original Jeopardy! The underlying clue is revealed and read aloud by the host, after which any contestant may ring-in using a hand-held signaling device. The first contestant to ring-in successfully is prompted to provide a response to the clue, phrased in the form of a question. Since September , contestants are required to wait until the clue is read before ringing-in. To accommodate the rule change, lights were added to the game board unseen by home viewers to signify when it is permissible for contestants to signal; [10] attempting to signal before the light goes on locks the contestant out for half of a second. In pre episodes, a buzzer would sound when a contestant signaled; according to Trebek, the buzzer was eliminated because it was "distracting to the viewers" and sometimes presented a problem when contestants rang in while Trebek was still reading the clue. The second round, Double Jeopardy! Clue values are doubled from the Jeopardy! The contestant with the least amount of money at the end of the Jeopardy! A "Daily Double" is hidden behind one clue in the Jeopardy! Whether or not the contestant responds correctly, he or she chooses the next clue. In the Double Jeopardy! If, after a game is over, a ruling change is made that would have significantly altered the outcome of the game, the affected contestants are invited back to compete on a future show. On at least one episode hosted by Art Fleming, all three contestants finished Double Jeopardy! At the end of the Double Jeopardy! Contestants write their wagers using a light pen to write on an electronic display on their lectern. In the event that either the display or the pen malfunctions, contestants can use an index card and a marker to manually write their response and wager. Visually impaired or blind contestants use a Braille keyboard to type in a wager and response. If there is a tie for second place, consolation prizes are awarded based on the scores going into the Final Jeopardy! The strategy for wagering in Final Jeopardy! An exception is provided for returning champions who must make several flights to Los Angeles. This was changed in order to make the game more competitive, and avoid the problem of contestants who would stop participating in the game, or avoid wagering in Final Jeopardy! The current cash consolation prize is provided by Geico. Originally, a contestant who won five consecutive days retired undefeated and was guaranteed a spot in the Tournament of Champions; the five-day limit was eliminated at the beginning of season 20 on September 8, The tied contestants are given the single clue, and the contestant must give the correct question. A contestant cannot win by default if the opponent gives an incorrect question. That contestant must give a correct question to win the game. If neither player gives the correct question, another clue is given. A tie occurred on the January 29, , episode when Arthur Chu , leading at the end of Double Jeopardy! This has happened on several episodes, [31] [32] most recently on January 18, A triple zero has also occurred twice in tournament play Seniors and Teen , and also once in a Celebrity Week episode in In tournament play, an additional high scoring non-winner will advance to the next round but all three players with a zero score in that game are eligible for that position should the score for that non-winner be zero; all tie-breaker rules apply. The player scoring the highest in the preceding round will be given the chance to select first in the semifinal and finals. Variations for tournament play[edit] Tournaments generally run for 10 consecutive episodes and feature 15 contestants. The first five episodes, the quarter-finals, feature three new contestants each day. The winners of these five games, and the four highest scoring non-winners "wild cards" , advance to the semi-finals, which run for three days. The winners of these three games advance to play in a two-game final match, in which the scores from both games are combined to determine the overall standings. This format has been used since the first Tournament of Champions in and was devised by Trebek himself. If two or more contestants tie for the highest score greater than zero at the end of match first round, semi-final game, or end of a two-game final , the standard tiebreaker is used. However, if two or more contestants tie for the highest score at the end of the first game of a two-game final, no tiebreaker is played. If none of the contestants in a quarter-final or semi-final game end with a positive score, no contestant automatically qualifies from that

game, and an additional wild card contestant advances instead. Conception and development[edit] In a Associated Press profile released shortly before the original Jeopardy! My wife Julann just came up with the idea one day when we were in a plane bringing us back to New York City from Duluth. I was mulling over game show ideas, when she noted that there had not been a successful "question and answer" game on the air since the quiz show scandals. Why not do a switch, and give the answers to the contestant and let them come up with the question? She fired a couple of answers to me: I loved the idea, went straight to NBC with the idea, and they bought it without even looking at a pilot show. Alex Trebek has hosted the daily syndicated version since The first three versions of the show were hosted by Art Fleming. Clue Crew, introduced on September 24, , is a team of roving correspondents who appear in videos, recorded around the world, to narrate some clues. In addition to appearing in Jeopardy! In the " season, Deb Dittmann and Brett Schneider became the producers, and Finneran, Schmidt, and Johnson were promoted to supervising producers. The original game board was exposed from behind a curtain and featured clues printed on cardboard pull cards which were revealed as contestants selected them. When the Trebek version premiered in , the game board used individual television monitors for each clue within categories. The original monitors were replaced with larger and sleeker ones in At the beginning of season 8 in , a brand new set was introduced that resembled a grid. On standard-definition television broadcasts, the shows continue to be displayed with an aspect ratio of 4: The main theme for the original Jeopardy! They were briefed and auditioned together in groups of ten to thirty individuals, participating in both a written test and mock games. Individuals who were successful at the audition were invited to appear on the program within approximately six weeks. This exam is administered online periodically, as well as being offered at regional contestant search events. Since season 15 "99 , the show has used a Winnebago recreational vehicle called the "Jeopardy! Brain Bus" to conduct regional events throughout the United States and Canada. Those who are approved are notified at a later time and invited to appear on the show. From the original NBC daytime version, archived episodes mostly consist of black-and-white kinescopes of the original color videotapes. Copies of 43 Trebek-hosted syndicated Jeopardy! He confessed that he only watched the Trebek version infrequently, and then only for a handful of questions; and also criticized this new iteration mainly for its Hollywood setting. Fleming believed that, in contrast to New Yorkers who Fleming considered to be more intelligent and authentic, moving the show to Hollywood brought both an unrealistic glamour and a dumbing-down of the program that he disdained. He also disliked the decision to not award losing contestants their cash earnings believing the parting gifts offered instead to be cheap and expressed surprise that what he considered to be a parlor game had transformed into such a national phenomenon under Trebek. Fleming observed that other game shows would have contestants phrasing their answers in question form, leading hosts to remind them that they are not competing on Jeopardy! Non-tournament events held regularly on the show include Celebrity Jeopardy! Each of the countries that aired their own version of the show in those years could nominate a contestant. The format was identical to the semifinals and finals of other Jeopardy! The tournament was recorded in Stockholm on the set of the Swedish version of Jeopardy!
