First published in , And Never Said a Word is one of Heinrich Böll's finest works, a novel that explores the extremities of marriage with depth and compassion. Böll evokes an entire emotional world in the space of a day and a half as husband and wife alternately relate this story of love and isolation, poverty and injustice.

The publicity surrounding the award of the Nobel Prize has led to a renewed interest in the U. It is therefore not surprising to see this new edition of one of his early works, but it is a pleasant surprise that the publisher decided to release the novel in a new translation. This has proved a worthwhile effort. In this early attempt at a new genre, the author chooses a narrow and finely delineated theme; namely, a marriage in danger of breaking apart. The structure is as simple as the theme. The time is limited to one weekend beginning as Fred is on his way from work on Saturday and ending very shortly after he returns to work on Monday morning. In the center of this picture stands the Bogner family. Fred Bogner has left his wife and children because he, by nature peace-loving, opposed to any form of violence, now finds himself turning violent against his loved ones. The hopelessness, inhumanity, and injustice around them pervert their natural emotions. Fred Bogner is incapable of keeping a job, he is doping himself with smoke and drink. When he is at home, he suddenly explodes and beats his defenseless children. Because of these uncontrollable fits of violence, he has left home and now roams the streets. He sleeps in bombed-out houses, stairways, and wherever he can find warmth without human obligations. He attends funerals of strangers and is often invited home by the bereaved to listen to the life story of people of whom he knows nothing but their coffin. On the one end of this spectrum is Mrs. Franke, who serves on all church and social committees. She is always on the move but only displays tenderness when she talks about money. At the other extreme are the people who are seen in some of the public places depicted in the novel. They merely sit there and let the world pass them by. They do not react to anything around them as they apparently have given up hope of ever influencing the course of events. His anger may not be directed very rationally, but it shows some residue of life and hope, conscious or subconscious—he may still be able to change things. This may be seen in his entire lifestyle, but is illustrated most clearly in his addiction to playing the slot machines. This addiction has gone so far that even money obtained at great sacrifice will end up in the machine. He will work extra hours or swallow his pride, asking acquaintances for loans to rent a room for a meeting with his wife. In most cases he will end up in front of a slot machine and not leave until all the money is gone. The initial fascination with winning has ceased, however. He has found a machine which almost never comes up with a winning combination, and even when it does, no money is paid out. Jesus does voice his opinion on matters of sex and marriage. When Jesus is answering a question about divorce in Matthew 19, Jesus cites the creation account where it says that a man will leave his parents and be united to his wife and they shall become one flesh. In other words, God Himself is ordaining this heterosexual union of man and wife. That would include fornication, adultery, and of course even homosexuality. In other words, by Jesus taking a stance on what sex and marriage is about, heterosexually speaking, then therefore, this disqualifies all other forms of sexual behavior, including homosexuality. Jesus does basically say that homosexuality is a sin, and we see this in Mark 7 where Jesus is talking about what makes a man unclean and what defiles a man. He says sexual immorality, theft, murder, and a whole bunch of other things. Saying that Jesus never said anything about homosexuality presumes that the words of Jesus are somehow more authoritative than the words of Scripture elsewhere. Since Jesus and the Holy Spirit are part of the Trinity, they have been living in perfect holy communion for all eternity past. Chances are, Jesus and the Holy Spirit agree with each other. Any one of those seven responses is sufficient to respond to this challenge, but when you combine all seven of them together, it leaves no possibility for sustaining the idea that just because Jesus never said anything about homosexuality in the Bible, therefore Jesus is ok with homosexual behavior.

Thomas Hall When assignments were being handed out at a recent ministerium, I was told to preach Luke What a momentous passage. Jesus, King of another kingdom, has been impaled on a cross and is certainly feeling excruciating pain; yet he utters an absolutely kingly prayer: And then it happened right in the middle of verse On Christ the King Sunday. Always some textual critic in the crowd to go and mess with our Bibles. Jesus crucified with a bunch of thugs while the soldiers throw dice to get the last of his earthly belongings? Why did it have to question the authenticity of this powerful prayer of forgiveness? What happens when we omit forgiveness from our own stories? In the book Knot of Vipers, an old man spends his last decades sleeping down the hall from his wife. A rift had opened thirty years before over whether the husband showed enough concern when their five-year-old daughter became ill. Now, neither husband nor wife is willing to take the first step. Every night he waits for her to approach him, but she never appears. And every night she lies awake just waiting for him to approach her, but he never does. Such happens in small ways to all of us when forgiveness is missing from the text of our lives. It keeps us prisoners of the past, unable to change. Something about two pieces of rough steel slammed through one of the most tender parts of the body that can reduce forgiveness to a footnote. Blatant injustice can replace our verse thirty-fours with silence too. And to his silence we could add our own silence when it comes time to forgive: Except for one thing. It simply is so Jesus to forgive. Later, those words were removed from some Bibles because some scribes did not want their Jesus to offer forgiveness to everyone. Kind of that ungrace thing again. But beyond that, I wonder if maybe Jesus understood something that we are just getting around to discovering. Forgiveness offers a way out. From the cross, Jesus prayed to forgive the soldiers, the people, the leaders, the criminals, you and me, because it offered us a way out of our own prison camps. For wherever and to whomever we have withheld forgiveness, there we sit in prison. Jesus understood as few do, the power of forgiveness to free others. Philip Yancy tells of a conversation that he once had with an immigrant rabbi. In prison he becomes a hardened convict. No one can beat him up, no one can break his will. Finally out of jail, he has to carry a convict card and so no innkeeper will lodge him. He finally gains shelter from a kindly old bishop. That night ex-con Jean Valjean, gets up and ransacks the family silver closet and creeps off into the darkness. Next morning, three policeman knock at the door with this ex-con and the stolen silver. You forgot that I gave you the candlesticks too! Did you forget them? Forgiveness is the quality of divine kingship that defies every human instinct for revenge and frees us to begin again. One act of forgiveness pays forward through our lives one forgiving act after another. His whole kingly life was one long prayer of forgiveness. So you too, go and preach the gospel of forgiveness.
