Rand replied, "What if I went on strike? What if all the creative minds of the world went on strike? The working title throughout her writing was *The Strike*; but Rand having thought this title would have revealed the mystery element of the novel prematurely, [11] she was pleased when her husband suggested *Atlas Shrugged*, previously the title of a single chapter, for the book. The novel closes as Galt announces that they will later re-organize the world. Robert James Bidinotto wrote, "Rand rejected the literary convention that depth and plausibility demand characters who are naturalistic replicas of the kinds of people we meet in everyday life, uttering everyday dialogue and pursuing everyday values. But she also rejected the notion that characters should be symbolic rather than realistic. My characters are persons in whom certain human attributes are focused more sharply and consistently than in average human beings". If it turned out to be me, I have no right to complain". John Galt further explains the principle: The action in *Atlas Shrugged* takes place at a time when society has reached the stage of dictatorship. When and if this happens, that will be the time to go on strike, but not until then". The looters are proponents of high taxation, big labor, government ownership, government spending, government planning, regulation, and redistribution". Both use force to take property from the people who "produced" or "earned" it. Have you ever asked what is the root of money? Money is the material shape of the principle that men who wish to deal with one another must deal by trade and give value for value. Money is not the tool of the moochers, who claim your product by tears, or the looters who take it from you by force. Money is made possible only by the men who produce. Is this what you consider evil? Not an ocean of tears nor all the guns in the world can transform those pieces of paper in your wallet into bread you need to survive tomorrow. Destroyers seize gold and leave its owners a counterfeit pile of paper. This kills all objective standards and delivers men into the arbitrary power of an arbitrary setter of values Paper is a mortgage on wealth that does not exist, backed by a gun aimed at those who are expected to produce it. Paper is a check drawn by legal looters upon an account which is not theirs: Watch for the day when it bounces, marked: Rand illustrates what a relationship between two self-actualized, equal human beings can be Rand denies the existence of a split between the physical and the mental, the desires of the flesh and the longings of the spirit.
