Balinese Architecture Philosophy Balinese architecture is heavily influenced by Hindu religion elements, ranging from space organization from the beginning of the gate to the layout of the space, as well as details of the carvings. Broadly speaking, Balinese architecture is designed with 7 philosophies, namely: Typical Balinese Architecture 1. Harmony with Nature The concept of harmonization with nature becomes the character and basic character of Balinese architecture. This harmony is strengthened through the utilization of natural stone materials, wood carvings, and bamboo. This natural material is expected to create harmony between humans with the environment, among humans, and human closeness with the Creator. Harmony with nature is displayed with natural stone as the floor of the sitting area, banana fan as the point of interest of the back garden, and the use of a little plant to show the impression of simplicity and modern minimalist concept. Carving in stone and wood Bali carvings get influence from the Hindu religion of Majapahit. Originally carvings are placed in places of worship, but over the times, sculptures with unique sculptures become architectural style that is identical with Bali. Zoning room is neat The balance of space distribution is obtained from the application of the philosophy of Tri Angga with three levels, namely primary, middle, and nista. Implementation of Tri Angga in modern concept has shifted into public space, semi public, and private space. The courtyard as a public space, the patio between the yard and the bedroom as a semi-public area with a long wooden chair at the foot of the bed as a barrier of semi-public areas, and beds in private areas. Ceilings with wooden framework as a characteristic Balinese architecture blend harmoniously with modern open-plan style while still showing a neat zoning between living room and dining room. Sturdy Foundation The philosophy of Tri Loka presupposes a house like a human body with legs as a solid foundation. The exposed structural poles become the symbols of human bones that strengthen the building. The head is manifested by the shape of the ceiling that attaches to the roof with the exposure of the rafters and battens as a strength and aesthetic element that shows the beauty of an honest simplicity.
