Fewer women run big companies than men named John. But change is happening, and not just in the conventional corridors of power. In fact, the nature of power in itself is changing, becoming less top-down, less institutional and less predictable. From an astronaut to an executive campaigning for gay rights at work, from scientists to social entrepreneurs, these women are challenging what is expected of their gender and changing the world around them for the better. A one-hour show hosted exclusively by women, Kalam Nawaem is credited with pushing social boundaries on Arab television, discussing controversial topics such as homosexuality, gender equality, sexual harassment and divorce. Currently head of directions and a partner in Glowork – a website for Saudi women to find employment – she is a committed advocate for gender equality. She has also championed projects and fundraising for refugees. Yet women still lag behind in income parity, opportunities for promotion and the ability to tap into government resources to balance home and work duties. Worldview is just a term meaning how you interpret reality, or what you believe to be true. As far as I can tell, we each have one " and though it has been vastly influenced by the thoughts of those we read, watch or associate with, we each actually have a unique perspective on what is going on. Worldviews can and do change. In general, worldview has been most influenced by religion and science. If science teaches us that the planet is part of a closed system and the Earth is winding down, with limited resources and in time will simply use itself up, then a worldview of scarcity is likely to result. If science were to teach that the Universe is alive, and this planet is part of a living infinitely abundant universe " and that the energy winding down is matched by energy winding up, in a dynamic of expansion and contraction, that can be tapped in to cleanly and harmoniously to provide for all people everywhere, we are likely to believe that evolution is ongoing and there is plenty to go around. The key is that our belief system determines what we think is possible, and what we think is possible influences the results we create or allow in life. The interactions of all our individual worldviews shapes the condition of humanity and therefore, given our technologies, of planet Earth. And cells awoke one morning to find that molecules were actually inside them, as part of their very being. And you might awake one morning and find that nature is a part of you, literally internal to your being. You are not just a part of nature, nature is a part of you. And for just that reason, you treat nature as you would treat your lungs or your kidneys. A spontaneous environmental ethics surges forth from your heart, and you will never again look at a river, a leaf, a deer, a robin, in the same way. The only question is whether World Government will be achieved by conquest or consent. So what creates a Worldview? Burning a finger on a hot stove informs our future behavior. Being told what to eat by our parents shapes our early diets. Being abused triggers avoidance and kindness engenders trust. On a larger scale, however, our beliefs are predominantly determined by those who control our access to information media and our social structures, including schools , because these institutions dictate what beliefs and behaviors are rewarded and which are punished. My research has convinced me that the prevailing worldview of the 21st century, in which war is considered a viable or necessary means of problem solving, that starvation is inevitable for some people on this planet, and that it is right for some people to tax and control others against their will, is the result of well-organized elite who own the systems through which information and values are disseminated. They use the media, education, pharmaceutical and military pyramids they control to shape our thinking, and therefore our behavior " ideally through subtle mind manipulation, but, if necessary, through coercion and violence. It is vital to consider the motivation and funding sources of those who are shaping our worldview: We are careening into a world of a few haves and billions of suffering have-nots. If you were intimidated as a child and taught that you were either going to be in control or be controlled, it would make some sense that you would choose control, and devote your life to getting and staying in charge over others. Unfortunately our political and economic systems reward this. How do I discover what my own Worldview is? I suggest you create a personal profile of your belief system with a list of questions something like this: Do I have a body or does my consciousness arise from the combination of cells that is my body? Should I believe what seems popular or strategic to believe, or can I truly think for myself and trust my direct experience? Am I part of a larger power or intelligence than me? If so, how do I relate to or communicate with it? Is it separate from me? What gives meaning to my existence? What is my purpose and the purpose of life? What is the nature of my connection with others? What does it mean to love and be loved? What do I need to be fulfilled? What are basic human rights? Should others be able to tell me what I can exchange, ingest, or do Is the universe basically trustworthy or not? Is there such a thing as good and evil? What is integrity, and does it matter to the quality of life? What moves any one of us from one worldview to the next? Only when there is a sufficient combination of

compelling evidence, emotional completion, and an adequate sense of future security do we let ourselves actually change our minds. If someone thinks that what they have is who they are, and it goes away during a great depression, they might jump out a window. If they think they are their reputation and they have a setback or get slandered, they might decide life is not worth living. If they think they are their position in the power structure, and it is threatened, they might sell out their core values to keep their status. If they are scientists who have believed something all their lives and a more compelling argument or evidence challenges their theoretical foundation, they might become hostile or think they are going to die. This latter example I have witnessed first hand. Our era is intensifying the almost daily choice for each of us "faced with a moment of unknowing, a new challenge, do I: They virtually all describe an octave of stages in the process of becoming a mature species living in harmony with our environment, and seem to independently agree that we are about in the middle of a whole process, facing a lethal challenge with a profound urge to survive and yet without any guarantee of success. That was then around 80 million adults. Similar percentages were seen in Europe and Japan. He describes this as the largest leaderless spiritual movement in history. The universe is not an aggregate of objects, but a communion of subjects. The world is a dangerous place and it always will be, because there is evil out there in the world. What is needed in this kind of a world is a strong, strict father who can: Protect the family in the dangerous world, Support the family in the difficult world, and Teach his children right from wrong. What is required of the child is obedience, because the strict father is a moral authority who knows right from wrong. It is further assumed that the only way to teach kids obedience "that is, right from wrong" is through punishment, painful punishment, when they do wrong. This included hitting them, and some recommend sticks, belts, and wooden paddles on the bare bottom. Without such punishment, the world will go to hell. There will be no morality. Suppose you are a real moral authority. As a moral authority, how do you deal with your children? Do you ask them what they should do or what you should do? What the father says, the child does. It is the same with the White house. That is, the president does not ask: IF you are a moral authority you know what is right, you have power, and you use it. You would be immoral yourself if you abandoned your moral authority. Map this onto foreign policy and it says that you cannot give up sovereignty. The United States, being the best and the most powerful country in the world- a moral authority "knows the right thing to do. We should not be asking anybody else. Those are the backward ones. And what should we do? If you are a strict father, you tell the children how to develop, tell them what rules they should follow, and punish them when they do wrong. That is, you operate using, say, the policies of the International Monetary Fund. The strict father worldview is so named because according to its own beliefs, the father is the head of the family. The nurturant parent worldview is gender neutral. Both parents are equally responsible for raising the children. The assumption is that children are born good and can be made better. The world can be a better place and our job is to work on that. If you have a child, you have to know what every cry means. You have to know when the child is hungry, when he needs a diaper change, when he is having nightmares. And you have a responsibility "you have to take care of this child. Since you cannot take care of someone else if you are not taking care of yourself, you have to take care of yourself enough to be able to take care of the child. If you empathize with your child, you will provide protection, you want your child to be fulfilled in life, to be a happy person. It is your moral responsibility to teach your child to be a happy, fulfilled person who wants others to be happy and fulfilled. This is because it performs certain functions for that society – creating a mobile workforce, socialising children into the society and creating the stable adult relationships needed in a modern society and economy. The traditional nuclear family is the only correct and normal type of family – with a mother, father and children and clear cut roles between the male and female. This family type is the foundation of society and if it declines then society itself will be in danger. The modern decline of this traditional family is the cause of social problems and social breakdown – drugs, crime, disrespect for authority etc. It also leads to welfare benefit dependency. Return to traditional values and the traditional nuclear family. Others challenge their claim that children of lone parents are more prone to crime and poor behaviour – this depends on other factors like neighbourhood and environment not on the fact that the child has one parent. Most people still live in a nuclear family headed by a married couple. Most people still marry and then have children. Most marriages go on until one partner dies ie do not end in divorce. Even divorcees tend to re-marry and set up another nuclear family. Couples who co-habit usually intend to marry eventually – and usually do when they have children. So the traditional nuclear family still dominates – family change and variety has been exaggerated. Each one has a slightly different family structure eg Asian families tend to have more extended families, Caribbean families more female headed families. She means that at different stages in their life people have different choices to make – the choices they make then decide the kinds of families we have. Each decision will lead to a different kind of life and a different kind of family situation. This view is supported by other sociologists like Holdsworth and Morgan. Their view is that: The real reasons will be found in their values and attitudes and how they see their relationships with other members of the family. Human beings decide their own future and have free will to make choices. So to understand what they do you have to understand their ideas, beliefs and experiences. However, Morgan does accept that a lot of these values come from the wider society around us – if the dominant view is that men and women should now be equal then this will be reflected in the family relationships. The important point is that what people believe about the family and how it should be is what decides the kinds of families we have. This gives people more choices about how they live their lives than ever before – and so people increasingly freely CHOOSE the kinds of relationships and families they wish to live in. This in turn leads to much greater diversity in family types – the traditional nuclear family is no longer dominant. Freedom of choice rules. He argues that – The main reason why men and women have relationships today is not simply to reproduce have children but it is based more on love and intimacy made possible by contraception. Women have become more independent because of work, education and feminists values. You can now choose to live together, to break up, to have or not have children as you please and not have the pressures of tradition or social expectation. The downside – relationships are now less stable because people demand so much more from them than they used to. In the past social expectations and traditions pretty well determined your life for you – you were expected to get married, have children, stay married. Today these expectations have gone and we have more freedom of choice in our lives. The downside is that we are also now freer to break up these relationships and family ties – so families are now more unstable. Equality has particularly give more choice to women – they are no longer simply the junior partner in the family. It is mainly women who have changed the family and rejected the traditional housewife and child carer roles. Because their expectations are so much greater they are more willing to divorce if they are unsatisfied – and often re-marry. This is a long term but permanent change. This may lead to less stable families – because people who are dissatisfied will break up their families and relationships and seek new ones. This is not bad but an expression of personal choice and preference.

They can pursue a lifestyle available only to the wealthy. The dual career family is a social and economic elite within a capitalist society. Increased personal fulfillment has meant sometimes that there is not as strong a commitment to home life and traditional marital relationships. In all probability this type of family will not only survive but increase in the 21st century. It will bring with it its strengths and weaknesses, its needs and gifts. For one thing, it has a larger supporting cast, including former spouses, former in-laws, and absent parents, as well as assorted aunts, uncles and cousins on both sides. Stepfamilies must deal with stress that arises from losses as a result of death or divorce, which can make both children and adults afraid to trust and to love. A welter of family histories complicates present relationships. For example, previously established bonds or loyalty to an absent adult may complicate new bonding. Present and Projected So, how many families are there in this group? According to the latest available census figures, there were close to seven million children living in stepfamilies in In the early s death was the major cause of marital dissolution. Prosen and Farmer reported that every year one-half million adults become stepparents and that one out of every six American children under 18 is a stepchild. They also predicted that by the stepfamily could well be the norm. Research conducted by Glick shows that Questions and Issues Often Faced Couples planning on remarriage do not spend much time talking together about such things as previous marriages, finances, doubts about the relationship, etc. Many of them live together before remarriage because they think that is the best way to discover whether the marriage will work. In the study by Ganong and Coleman, very few persons contacted professionals before entering remarriage. Those who did go to a pastor said that the pastor did not bring up specific issues that would be relevant to remarriage or stepfamilies. That is a significant omission. This particular study indicates that the couples who remarry are either overly optimistic or naive Ganong and Coleman, Few potentially important issues were discussed prior to marriage. They expect, for example, their new partner to have a good relationship with their children. For those who did seek help, much of the counseling received was oriented toward solving divorce-related problems rather than focusing on remarriage and stepfamily issues. Stepchildren and finances were the two concerns most often mentioned. There tends to be an assumption that unless there is overt conflict prior to remarriage, then nothing needs to be done. Problems and Strengths Disagreements over stepchildren appear to be a frequent problem, as do relationships with former spouses. These two items alone may create considerably more conflict than in a nuclear family. The lack of societal guidelines for stepfamily roles is confusing at times, and there may be certain legal problems, for example, the rights of stepparents to sign for medical care for stepchildren and access to children following a subsequent divorce. Economic reintegration can be complicated, and commitment and cohesiveness may decrease. Difficulties in merging two different lifestyles and blurred boundaries can also create problems. How do children experience living in a stepfamily? Of all of these categories, the teenagers only noted two of them as stressful: Interestingly, none of the other items were felt to be stressful. It appears that once the initial adjustment is made this usually takes about two years, living in a stepfamily may not be that difficult for teens. There are also some significant strengths of stepfamilies. The biological parents may be happier as a result of the remarriage, making life more pleasant for the children. A happy remarriage presents to children a positive model of adult intimacy and marriage. They learn that love is not just automatic; it takes time to grow and develop. The stepfamily may help individuals to have a more realistic view of marriage. There may also be some long-term advantages; some people feel that stepchildren potentially become more adaptable and are able to deal more flexibly with life as adults. An Opportunity for the Church The kind of integration that is called for in a remarriage creates many opportunities for the church to step in and help with education, ministry and support. The church needs to broaden its models of family relationships in the church, so that all experience greater openness. A lot of the remarriage concerns are not identified, either by the couple entering it, or by the church, or by those who may be parenting these persons who are remarrying. So it seems

this is an opportunity for the church to enter much more fully, both in premarital sessions and in providing individual and group support and counsel. This is the family with a single parent. Jeryl 12 and Kirk She divorced her husband Frank, after 15 years of marriage. Jeryl reported that her father had touched her inappropriately over a long period of time and had physically forced himself upon her on numerous occasions. When he continued to deny it publicly and at the same time became physically abusive to Sharon in private, Sharon filed for divorce. She works as a clerk in a shopping center. While Frank had finished some years of college and begun a career, Sharon had raised the family. She completed a year of college before marriage and now has no marketable skills. Both children attend school but carry the emotional scars of abuse and their difficult divorce. Jeryl is withdrawn and finds it hard to make friends. Kirk has been a problem in school. He is not doing well academically and has been unruly in class. Shortly after the divorce, Sharon moved from their modest home into a rather cramped apartment since house payments were beyond her means. The children changed school systems, and thus left behind old friends and teachers. Sharon has sole custody of the children but the father has visiting rights every other weekend. Jeryl refuses to see her father. Since Frank sees Kirk only occasionally, he plans special events. He places no restrictions on Kirk and so Sharon has considerable difficulty setting limits when he returns. When Sharon first approached her pastor regarding the sexual abuse of Jeryl, she found him sympathetic and understanding. He encouraged her to confront Frank with the truth. He did not feel it was his responsibility to notify the authorities. When she indicated that she was filing divorce papers, her pastor encouraged her to continue in the relationship. Reluctantly, she agreed to return. Sharon has felt like a second-class citizen in the congregation. There have been some individuals who have reached out to her in friendship. She has received no financial assistance. Single Parent Stresses This home has multiple stressors. The children need additional discipline and support. A single parent lacks the validation and parental authority which tends to exist in two-adult homes. They also indicate that this was not offset by the gains of autonomy and competence. The Church and the Single Parent Reed has suggested concrete ways in which the church can respond to the needs of single parents: Redefine family to include single parents and their children. Provide respite by taking the children for an evening or a weekend. Arrange childcare for church events. Plan support groups for single parents. Give workshops on parenting, discipline, communications and finances. Organize resources for sharing clothing, childcare, etc. Find appropriate role models for the children. Reach out and respond in a friendly manner to single parents. Understand and accept the single parent. For some it is a time of completion, fruition, and opportunity; for others it may be overwhelming loss, general disintegration, and may even lead to disruption through divorce. Today more marriages are ended by divorce, but couples who manage to stay together can look forward to twenty or more years of married life after the last child has left the home. For some it may be thirty to forty years. Four- and five-generation families may become quite common. The Census Bureau report includes in middle age all those between 45 and In in the U. Nine out of 10 live in families and the vast majority with spouses U. Bureau of Census, Financially the empty nest families are the group who are most well-off. The kinds of work the women are doing is significant. Problems and Strengths Launching children and moving on is the newest, the longest stage and in many ways the most problematic of all phases.
