The driving interest behind my work, both in the classroom and in my research, is the relationship between politics, ethics, and literature. I do not think that literature serves to represent a political stance so much as poses the question of what an ethical relationship with the world might be.

A number of the contributors to this special issue, myself included, were graduate students during the 90s and were only just beginning our very first academic positions at the turn of the millennium. For us, there is a sense of Latinamericanism as a potential site for politically-infused, theoretically-grounded intellectual work, but this impression is present only as a trace or specter— not of something that ever was, but of something that might have been, an as-yet unfulfilled demand. We have memories of a possible future of the past that is marked by catastrophe. I sat on the floor of a packed conference room, not fully grasping the implosion that was happening around me, just days before the attacks on New York and Washington, D. The decade that followed this moment of rupture has— because or in spite of the reactionary policies implemented by the U. I want, here, to take up some of the issues addressed in Latinamericanism— namely, the relationship between ethics, politics and aesthetics— in order to suggest that there might be some broad misunderstandings about what each of these http: The title of the present essay is intentionally ambiguous, split between two possible meanings. As we read in the epigraph to this essay, *Against Literature* was composed not only in ideological opposition to the institution of literature dominated by an elite community of letrados , but also against the backdrop of literature, that is, with literature as its very condition of possibility. The so-called ethical turn in literary studies and philosophy was greeted with a justified skepticism, principally from the left. What did it mean to posit the ethical as a new position from which to approach the literary, or the question of the subject? This is because the demand of the other is unreadable— “we cannot know what the other desires—” which is rendered even more unbearable by the fact that we can never properly identify the other. To be sure, Beverley raises an important point when he argues that the problem of ethics has to do with its reliance upon the decision of an individual. Levinas himself gestures in this direction when he describes the difficult passage from the ethical to the political, from the relation to the other to the appearance of the third party: At the same time, a Levinasian ethics renders obsolete the very notion of the individual: Instead, the subject comes into existence in relation to heteronomy, the law of the other, which is why the third party will always have to have appeared alongside the other. The way from ethics to politics, for Levinas, is a difficult but necessary problem; the political demand haunts the ethical demand. I would therefore define the dilemma of ethics and politics differently. Ethics, or a thinking of the ethical, encounters its limit when it is defined as an ethics of the other: But the same could be said of politics, or a thinking of the political. Latinamericanism provides an excellent example of such an approach. The job involved investigating and assessing compensation for personal injury to industrial workers; accidents such as lost fingers or limbs were commonplace at this time owing to poor work safety policies at the time. It was especially true of factories fitted with machine lathes , drills , planing machines and rotary saws which were rarely fitted with safety guards. I sat on the floor of a packed conference room, not fully grasping the implosion that was happening around me, just days before the attacks on New York and Washington, D. The decade that followed this moment of rupture hasâ€”because or in spite of the reactionary policies implemented by the U. The title of the present essay is intentionally ambiguous, split between two possible meanings. As we read in the epigraph to this essay, Against Literature was composed not only in ideological opposition to the institution of literature dominated by an elite community of letrados , but also against the backdrop of literature, that is, with literature as its very condition of possibility. The so-called ethical turn in literary studies and philosophy was greeted with a justified skepticism, principally from the left. What did it mean to posit the ethical as a new position from which to approach the literary, or the question of the subject? Beverley associates the turn to ethics with what he calls a neoconservative wave in Latin American literary studies. This is because the demand of the other is unreadableâ€”we cannot know what the other desiresâ€”which is rendered even more unbearable by the fact that we can never properly identify the other. To be sure, Beverley raises an important point when he argues that the problem of ethics has to do with its reliance upon the decision of an individual. Levinas himself gestures in this direction when he describes the difficult passage from the ethical to the political, from the relation to the other to the appearance of the third party: At the same time, a Levinasian ethics renders obsolete the very notion of the individual: Instead, the subject comes into existence in relation to heteronomy, the law of the other, which is why the third party will always have to have appeared alongside the other. The way from ethics to politics, for Levinas, is a difficult but necessary problem; the political demand haunts the ethical demand. I would therefore define the dilemma of ethics and politics differently. Ethics, or a thinking of the ethical, encounters its limit when it is defined as an ethics of the other: But the same could be said of politics, or a thinking of the political. Latinamericanism provides an excellent example of such an approach. For Beverley and if it could be said that the roots of this thinking are already present in his earlier work, it is most salient in his recent book we know who the subaltern is. And because we can identify the subaltern, we can or Beverley can suggest that the subaltern has finally entered the realm of the state. This was of course the goal all along: What possible future can be pursued in politics, beyond infinite re-election? Ohio gubernatorial election, On May 1, , Kasich filed papers to run for governor of Ohio against incumbent Democratic governor Ted Strickland. During a speech before Ashtabula County Republicans in March , Kasich talked about the need to "break the back of organized labor in the schools," according to the Ashtabula Star Beacon. On November 2, , Kasich defeated Strickland in a closely contested race to win the governorship. It was then followed by a ceremonial inauguration at the Ohio Theatre at noon on the same day. He won 86 of 88 counties. Kasich, who was elected with Tea Party support in , faced some backlash from some Tea Party activists. Zawistowski secured just three votes in his run for the chairmanship. Kasich cited the cost to taxpayers of defending the legislation in court, and the likelihood that the "Heartbeat Bill" would be struck down in federal court as reasons for vetoing the more restrictive bill. This veto won Kasich praise from environmentalist groups, and angered Republicans in the state legislature. Hagan and Nickie Antonio as adversaries of the plan.
