He came to make a way for lost sinners to get to God. He achieved every purpose He had for coming into this world, Isa. He came to save us and to give us a message of salvation that we could share with lost souls. It is not about our preacher or about our standards of dress and music. It is not about our style of worship. All of those are important, but none of them can save a lost, hell-bound soul. Our message is a simple message. It is a message of hope to hurting; of life to the dead; of peace to the tormented. It is a message that is universal in its application. It is a message that has the potential to change every life and every eternity that falls under its power, John 1: Our message is this: Sharing this Gospel message is as easy as telling lost people what Jesus did for you and what He can do for them, Mark 5: It is the most powerful message the world has ever heard and it is a message that must be delivered to a lost world by the people of God. There is no other message that God will use to draw the sinner to Himself and there is no other message He will use to save lost souls! And that our mission field is the entire world. He may call someone from this fellowship to leave this country and reach a certain people group. He did this with George and Christine Braidwood. Of course, He may just ask us to send our money to support those whom He has called to reach those in other parts of the world. While He may never call you to go to a foreign land to tell the story of salvation, He expects you to tell it where you live. He expects us to reach out to all people without regard to their ethnic heritage, their race, their past, their lifestyle, their economic standing, etc. If they are sinners, they are candidates to hear the message of the cross. If they are lost, they need a Savior. If they do not know Him, they need to and we have been authorized and commanded to reach them! Are we active in our Jerusalem? Are we fulfilling The Great Commission? Or, are we guilty of committing The Great Omission? In fact, these verses give us to of the greatest resources we have as witnessed of the Gospel. He will help you; enable you; embolden you and use you if you will simply obey Him and share the Gospel with others. You will never share the Gospel alone if you are a child of God! Obviously, He is talking about being arrested for the faith. When that happens, He will give the words to speak. The same principle applies to our witness. When we witness, we are on trial for our faith. He will give us the words we need when the time comes. The Lord took what was supposed to be a trial and turned it into a testimony time for Paul on more than one occasion! He will take our feeble words and He will attach power to them. The Spirit of God will take our efforts and He will use the words we share to convict the hearts of the lost, John I am not a powerful witness and I do not have a stunning testimony, but if I will faithfully share what the Lord has done for me and what He has said in His Word, He will put His power on my weak message and draw sinners to Himself for salvation. Moody made an covenant with God that he would witness for Christ to at least one person each day. It was the man he had witnessed to. He apologized for the way he had treated Moody and said that he had had no peace ever since that night on Lake Street when Moody witnessed to him. Moody led the man to Christ and he became a zealous worker in the Sunday school. On a dangerous seacoast where shipwrecks often occur, there was once a little life-saving station. The building was primitive, and there was just one boat, but the members of the life-saving station were committed and kept a constant watch over the sea. When a ship went down, they unselfishly went out day or night to save the lost. Because so many lives were saved by that station, it became famous. Consequently, many people wanted to be associated with the station to give their time, talent, and money to support its important work. New boats were bought, new crews were recruited, a formal training session was offered. As the membership in the life-saving station grew, some of the members became unhappy that the building was so primitive and that the equipment was so outdated. They wanted a better place to welcome the survivors pulled from the sea. So they replaced the emergency cots with beds and put better furniture in the enlarged and newly decorated building. Now the life-saving station became a popular gathering place for its members. They met regularly and when they did, it

was apparent how they loved one another. They greeted each other, hugged each other, and shared with one another the events that had been going on in their lives. But fewer members were now interested in going to sea on life-saving missions; so they hired lifeboat crews to do this for them. About this time, a large ship was wrecked off of the coast, and the hired crews brought into the life-saving station boatloads of cold, wet, dirty, sick, and half-drowned people. Some of them had black skin, and some had yellow skin. Some could speak English well, and some could hardly speak it at all. Some were first-class cabin passengers of the ship, and some were the deck hands. The beautiful meeting place became a place of chaos. The plush carpets got dirty. Some of the exquisite furniture got scratched. So the property committee immediately had a shower built outside the house where the victims of shipwreck could be cleaned up before coming inside. At the next meeting there was rift in the membership. Other members insisted that life-saving was their primary purpose and pointed out that they were still called a life-saving station. But they were finally voted down and told that if they wanted to save the lives of all those various kinds of people who would be shipwrecked, they could begin their own life-saving station down the coast. And do you know what? That is what they did. As the years passed, the new station experienced the same changes that had occurred in the old. It evolved into a place to meet regularly for fellowship, for committee meetings, and for special training sessions about their mission, but few went out to the drowning people. The drowning people were no longer welcomed in that new life-saving station. So another life-saving station was founded further down the coast. History continued to repeat itself. And if you visit that seacoast today, you will find a number of adequate meeting places with ample parking and plush carpeting. Shipwrecks are frequent in those waters, but most of the people drown. That is a parable of the condition of the modern church. We have become more concerned about buildings than about people. We are more interested in having our meetings than we are in fulfilling our mission. We are more interested in our personal comfort than we are about who is drowning in the sea of sin just beyond our walls. We want to see people come into the church, as long as they are the right kind of people. That can change and it must! It will change only when we come to the Lord and ask Him to change our own hearts!

What is the Great Commission? Are Christians commanded to obey this commission? What is the purpose for the Great Commission and the Christians part in it? And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age. Today, the Great Commission is still being fulfilled by international missionary work, by local churches in actively seeking the lost in their community, in outreach activities and by believers witnessing for Jesus Christ to their next door neighbor. The Great Commission will not end until the consummation of the Kingdom of Heaven. That is, during the church age today, all believers are commanded to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ and to go into all the world, even if it starts next door. Making Disciples By the way, when I share the gospel, I am not responsible for the outcome. A disciple is literally one that is disciplined or taught about the Kingdom of God and these disciples are to make disciples or students of other people once they have put their trust in Christ. No believer is supposed to be an underground or private believer. Christianity is not a covert operation! We must all tell others the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ. This is not optional. To be disciplined is to be instructed or to learn from one who is a disciple themselves. To be a disciple means to be a learner of, a student of, and to discipline root word for discipline oneself in the things that Jesus Christ taught. Since God wants us to be holy just as He is holy, we are to be constrained to be more like Christ over time. An Imperative Command When Jesus told His disciples to go into all the world, was this an imperative command? Yes, it is the same type of command that a parent would yell to a child in the street: If He is not Lord of all then He is not Lord at all. By the way, as some have believed, there is no gift for sharing the gospel. We are all to proclaim the Lord Jesus Christ to those who are lost. The good news must be shared. To not share the gospel is to be negligent to our duties. When we keep this good news to ourselves it reminds me of the Parable of the Talents. The one servant buried his talent in the ground. When we do that we are robbing others of the chance for eternal life. How awful to not share this news and participate in rescuing the perishing. There is no excuse for not doing it. What keeps most from doing this is the fear of man which is a snare. Should we not fear God more and understand that He will hold us responsible someday on the Day of His Visitation? The Great Omission Only a small fraction of the church actively shares the faith with the lost. Less than 1 in 10 will share their faith with at least one other person in a lifetime. Only 1 in 20 will ever lead someone to faith in Christ during their life. By the way, when I share the gospel, I am not responsible for the outcome. I can only sow the seed of the Word and leave the results up to God but I must tell youâ€”after I do, I feel such joy and peace. I can not compare it to any feeling in the world. Sadly, for so many years in my Christian faith I was simply a pew potato. Conclusion Are you ashamed of being embarrassed by sharing the good news? Here is a serious warning from Jesus Christ about that. He repeats this warning in Mark 8: That should be a wake up call for all of us because many profess Christ to other Christians but not to the lost. Let me leave you with a true story that is a great analogy as to why we need to be participating in the Great Commission. About 20 years ago a man was walking his dog about in the morning when he spotted smoke coming out of a two-story house. When he looked around he saw that there was no chimney for a fireplace and so he thought the occupants may be endangered. He went up to the porch and peeked into the living room window and saw smoke coming out of the kitchen area. This is when he knew that there was a fire and he started pounding on the door. He rang the door bell furiously but got no response. Then he started pounding so hard on the front door that he thought it might break it down and the neighborhood dogs started barking and the lights started coming on in the neighborhood. Finally, a light went on in the second floor of the house and when a man came down to the living room only then did he realize that there smoke coming out of the kitchen. This was long before smoke detectors were commonly used. The man then ran upstairs to evacuate his family.

The family escaped with what could have been a disastrous fire. Here is the analogy. There is a fire coming. There is another fire coming. Jesus spoke of it more than heaven and in fact, more than just about anything else that He ever taught in the gospel. Hell is very real. Who cares if you are embarrassed or you are humiliated? Remember that the power is in the message and not in the messenger. If God can use even a shy, timid, tongue-twisted person like me to go into the streets, door to door, in the stores or anywhere that there are people then He can use you.
