She had no trouble getting out of the water, but would drop the tow line after only 40 feet. Duvall has hardly let go since. In the national championships held last August in Destin, Fla. Could you pass a US citizenship test? For example, during the winter months the air temperature in central Florida can drop to 50 degrees F. Duvall-Hero says one reason she continues to work hard is her desire to leave the sport on her own terms. Duvall-Hero says she is the first active female water-skier to generate a six-figure income from prize money and endorsements. And she continues to ski even though she is married to Byron Hero Jr. To keep fit, Duvall-Hero spends hours in the gym power lifting and stretching. In the slalom event, for example, Duvall-Hero battles speed and distance. As a motorboat roars down the middle of a slalom course at 34 miles per hour, she tries to go around buoys set just a bit farther away from the center of the course than the rope will reach. Then she turns the ski on its edge and slows down around the buoy. Since the rope is too short to reach the buoys, she has to stretch out, using her body to extend her reach around the buoy. Coming out of the turn, the rope whips Duvall-Hero back across the course. Slaloming is not without risk: At the end of a grueling season with the chance to win a championship, Duvall-Hero miscalculated a turn and hit a buoy, breaking her shoulder. The tow boat pulls the skier through the water at 32 mph, but Duvall-Hero uses the slingshot effect to increase her speed to 70 mph right before the ramp, the top of which is five feet above the water. She springs off the top of the ramp and may soar feet before gravity pulls her back into the drink. How does it feel to go that fast across the water? Duvall-Hero giggles, then replies: Duvall-Hero compares it to playing tug of war - except that in her case the opponent is a horsepower engine. She ran a water-ski camp for eight years. She works with the Big Brother program and is trying to encourage minority children to take up the sport. She also does some modeling, mostly for the water-ski industry. Duvall-Hero has also been active in trying to make water- skiing an Olympic sport. Water- skiing was a demonstration sport in and The sport is popular in the US, with 15 million recreational skiers. When Duvall is not skiing or promoting the sport, she is raising her son, Alexander, who is nearly three. At 16 months, he was water-skiing.

Camille Duvall American waterskier Camille Duvall, "The Golden Goddess" of professional water skiing, holds more titles in slalom than all other women waterskiers combined. Her impact is so great that it is difficult to pinpoint just where the legend of Camille Duvall can be separated from the sport of professional water skiing. Growing Up Camille Duvall started water skiing when she was only four. Born July 11, 1954, to Sam and Diane Duvall, Camille and her brother were provided every opportunity to achieve success as a professional waterskiers. The single-mindedness with which the family went about their pursuit of excellence was stunning. Camille won her first tournament when she was six years old, and her determination to be better than everyone else was already apparent. She practiced near Greenville, South Carolina, on a private lake that her father, an executive with a construction company, leased for the sole use of his two athletically gifted children. For hours on end each day, Camille worked with private coaches on courses that had been set up for her and her brother, complete with ramps and a variety of boats to simulate any of the variables they might face in a competition. His intense desire to see his children succeed at any cost helped mold Camille into one of the best talents the world of water skiing has ever known. Perhaps one of the most talented sister-brother duo in any sport, Sam and Camille Duvall early on earned the nicknames "Golden Boy" and "Golden Girl." Many believe her rising fame was due in no small part to her beauty. Duvall matured into a tall, statuesque woman whose physical presence, many said, was as impressive as her skiing feats. Her looks earned her the moniker "The Golden Goddess. In fact, Duvall was often unhappy and rightly so about the attention paid to her appearance. She wanted the emphasis on her achievements and what she could accomplish as an athlete. She soon suffered a knee injury that, though not serious, pushed her away from the sport for a few years. After a brief hiatus from water skiing, Duvall returned to the sport in 1971 and surpassed her former accomplishments. She rejoined the U.S. Elite Water Ski Team, and from 1971 to 1976 she helped that team to world championship victories. Olympics Only A Dream Unfortunately the sport of water skiing would not become an Olympic event until a few years after Duvall left the spotlight due to neck injuries and after her decision to retire in 1976. She is a mother of two who wears many hats. Some of the work with which she is currently involved includes coaching the U.S. She is also the cofounder and marketing director for Duvall Competition Skis.
