Viggo Mortensen plays the Spanish soldier-turned-mercenary Captain Alatriste, a heroic figure from the country's 17th century imperial wars.

The plot is simple, and the action scenes relatively few. The strong points are the recreation of the Madrid society around and the evocative language. The story alternates between first person narration by the young page Inigo Balboa and third person view. I wish I was fluent in Spanish and could read this in the original, especially the poems. The language used in this novel is full of slang and colloquialisms, requiring use of a Spanish dictionary and also a translator app on my iPhone. Yet I did not struggle excessively. Candidly, however, my mastery of Spanish is as yet too rudimentary for me to be able to comment on the literary quality of the writing. But it was certainly entertaining. I found the book of interest on several levels. It is an engaging yarn in and off itself. It also portrays a place and period in history about which I have had little knowledge. I also found the author to be perceptive to psychological issues, effectively presenting his main characters as people wrestling with quotidian concerns as well as existential issues. I would be receptive to reading more books in this series.
