My esteemed colleague, Dr. Bedelia Richards, wrote a terrific essay on the matter: See my blog post on the matter here. I am grateful, but admittedly annoyed, for a few reasons. Calling out institutionalized racism and cissexism falls to individual students, staff, and faculty when the university neglects to do so; and, such work looks and is brave. These invitations are kind gestures, but they require more and more time and emotional labor, including the back-and-forth of multiple emails just to find a time that works for our schedules. And, finally, these interactions demand of me that I absolve white, heterosexual, cis people of failing to speak up in the face of injustice. I resent when privileged people confide in me about why they refuse to fight against the systems of oppression that constrain my life chances and quality of life, systems from which they benefit. So, I took to Twitter once again to speak to white people on challenges yet importance of talking about race and racism. You can see the rant in its original Twitter form here. White privilege allows you to feel like an individual who made a difficult decision. But, in reality, most white people choose silence. And, those individual decisions to remain silent add up to collective white silence, to white complicity in racist oppression, or even white consent to racist violence. The impact of your silence is literally the same as that of Klansmen, Nazis, most white Republicans, and other garden-variety racists. Very few of us are well-versed on the topics of race and racism. Even as a race scholar academic expertise and person of color personal experience, I struggle to communicate the complex, structural, pervasive nature of racism to other people—even other academics. It may seem like people of color can talk readily, freely, and endlessly about race, but we just have lots of practice given our everyday lived experiences in a racist nation. It has never been a skill that white families desired to or felt it necessary to teach their children. There is no widely accessible script afforded to white people for talking about race or fighting racism. But, worse, racism makes it so that there are risks inherent to white people talking constructively about racism. The system is designed to protect itself from white individuals attempting to undermine it. So, of course you are clueless about how to talk about racism. In doing so, the responsibility typically falls to whichever people of color are present for that conversation or incident. Too often, I see white people defer to others people of color to talk about race and act in the face of racial injustice—and, then never make an effort to educate themselves about race and racism. But, while unnecessary replies-to-all are annoying and inconvenient, collective white ignorance about racist oppression literally has dire and deathly consequences for people of color. We do not get paid for this labor—and it is labor that is requested often. So, with the labor of educating you about how you benefit from our domination, we risk your anger, frustration, cluelessness, dismissal, co-opting, resentment, etc. That time and energy adds up and, honestly, for too little payoff. You need to note that these conversations may be taxing, upsetting, or even triggering for us because it can feel like our safety and livelihood depend upon the outcome. There are countless books written, documentaries and films and TV shows produced, and courses offered on race and racism, many by people of color. I recommend becoming a student of these fields to minimize the labor tasked to individual people of color to respond to the infinite questions asked by white strangers, friends, relatives, neighbors, students and teachers, medical professionals, law enforcement officers, etc. Racism is a system of oppression. As such, I encourage you to get comfortable with being uncomfortable. Your comfort in the face of the inhumane system of racism is an example of white privilege. Being comfortable with racism or ignoring it is not a luxury people of color enjoy. Your discomfort is a reasonable feeling. But, I want to caution you against confiding that fear in the few people of color in your life. People of color have to be brave in the face of racism because our survival literally depends upon it. The consequence of your silence and inaction is not death; in reality, the main consequence is maintaining your white privilege. Strategies For Addressing Racism White folks, if I may offer some strategies to those who genuinely want to

challenge racism: Have a relative or coworker or friend who can echo your concerns when you speak up to minimize the risk of being the lone voice of dissent or concern. So, please act accordingly. Stop being surprised when it rears its ugly head “because it will, over and over again. To the extent that you are trying to get the approval of other whites, you are only maintaining your white privilege. The beauty of white privilege is that you can piss off other white people by constantly talking about racism, calling other whites on their blindspots and biases, and not lose out or be harmed in the huge ways that we do violence, termination, exclusion, dismissal, etc. Remember, white privilege is like a boomerang. You can attempt to relinquish it “for example, by confronting a racist uncle “but, it will always come back to you. In fact, I encourage you to learn to be OK with being called racist by people of color. So, thicken up that skin, please. Take your ego out of it. Do it because it is right. We lack enough power for our feelings to be of much consequence for you “but, your silence and inaction makes you complicit in the system that devastates our lives. One big challenge is that you cannot try to retain the comforts of white middle-class life and challenge racism. The former exists because of white privilege. That is by design. Our social institutions reinforce that luxury: K and college curricula overwhelmingly feature the lives and contributions and histories of white people; mainstream TV, film, pop culture are so, so, so white; and, businesses cater to upper- and middle-class whites tastes. You have access to spaces and relationships to which we are denied full access. Even if you still lack the language and courage to readily engage in, for example, a discussion of mass incarceration as a modern day form of Jim Crow racism, you can at least invite other white people to talk about race, or even call bigoted whites on their racist comments and behaviors. Closing Thoughts White people: I recommend thinking about fighting racism as akin to going to war. But, ya gotta do it. Ending racism necessitates real effort by white people to bring the system down. August 19, His crime “being born Black. The punishment “execution. The name "The Isis Papers" was inspired by an ancient Egyptian goddess. According to Welsing, all the names of the gods were significant; however, Osiris means "lord of the perfect Black". Welsing specifically chose the name Isis for her admiration of "truth and justice" that allowed for justice to be stronger than gold and silver. The minority status of whites has caused what she calls white genetic survival. She believed that injustice caused by racism will end when "non-white people worldwide recognize, analyze, understand and discuss openly the genocidal dynamic. According to Welsing, the cause of these issues are her definition of racism white supremacy. She wrote that due to this "defective" mutation, they may have been forcibly expelled from Africa, among other possibilities. She attributed AIDS and addiction to crack cocaine and other substances to "chemical and biological warfare " by whites. She refers to racism and white supremacy synonymously. Her definition is "Racism white supremacy is the local and global power system dynamic, structured and maintained by those who classify themselves as white; whether consciously or subconsciously determined, which consist of patterns of perception, logic, symbol formation, thoughts, speech, action and emotional response, as conducted simultaneously in all areas of people activity: Welsing was against white supremacy and the emasculation of the Black man. Criticisms[edit] Welsing stated that the emasculation of the Black man prevents procreation of Black people. According to Welsing, this is one of the goals of racism white supremacy. Cryss Benefit or Bane? Critique of the Usefulness of Research about Women Superintendents. An analysis of the benefits and the drawbacks of such research is presented here. The text opens with 10 reasons why such research is of use to women and men. On the other hand, some men and women are offended by research that is female-specific. They may view such research as essentialist in nature; some women wishing to be superintendent may doubt themselves after comparing themselves to successful women superintendents; and such research is dominated by women. The voices of women aspiring to the superintendency Grogan, It pissed them off. His chin was up, a clear indication that he felt he had me. The purpose of this brief commentary is to list a few of the reasons that such research may be helpful or harmful. To that end, the paper is organized in two sections "Benefit" and "Bane" that draw on some of the literature relative to women superintendency research. Benefit While this list is incomplete, I have identified 10 reasons why I believe research about women in the superintendency is of benefit to women and men. Perhaps most obvious, research on women in the superintendency helps answer the glaring question: As Hochschild , p. Clearly, any research on women in the superintendency is evidence that women can be superintendents, are superintendents, and are able to perform the tasks required of anyone in the role. Without such research, the overwhelmingly prevalent practice of hiring men rather than women has the tendency to create or continue the belief that women must somehow be inferior to men and unable to succeed in the position. The evidence that women can succeed in the position of superintendent, and examples in the literature of women who are succeeding help provide "at least in print" the important role models that are so necessary for any woman aspiring to the position. The written record, then, in research of the way women see, value, and know is important to all women who may wonder if their way of doing things is somehow inferior or somehow misses the mark. The feminine discourse needs to become an accepted part of the discourse of educational administration in order that women assume their own place in the superintendency see Grogan, The different ways that women see, value, and know the world of educational administration are important for the much talked about transformation of the role of the superintendent of schools. With this in mind, research on women in the superintendency becomes vastly more important to anyone interested in educational administration. To be sure, calls for public school reform fall at all points along the ideological continuum. Spector, , high-performance schools Odden, , and connecting schools and communities Crowson, A small portion of the literature on decentralized decision-making focuses on administration and points out how successful superintendents spend time enhancing and supporting various collaborative decision-making efforts Murphy, that facilitate reforms, which in turn advance high academic achievement for all students Odden, A second major thrust of reform highlights the moral issues facing public school educators. Some of the issues dealt with are social justice Purpel, with an emphasis on academic achievement for every child Capper, ; higher-order democratic values exemplified by equality of input and equality of opportunity Tyack, ; and the notion of an "ethic of care" Noddings, , which combines caring, administration, and academic achievement Beck, This literature admonishes superintendents and other administrators to care enough about people "to listen to them, suggesting the replacement of the current pyramidal governance structure with a circle model within which no point is in a superior position Beck, , p. Despite this thrust, there is no literature to help superintendents transform their practice in a way that addresses these moral issues. Given the nation-wide concern that superintendency positions will be emptied faster than they can be filled during the next decade Brockett, , research reflecting the abilities and availability of women administrators has the potential to open the minds of women as candidates and open the minds of those hiring superintendents. Even an awareness of the numbers of women credentialed and degreed in educational administration "who have not been hired because of gender bias" could affect the attitude toward the concern around the supposed lack of candidates. Could it be that the feared dearth of candidates is actually a dearth of male candidates rather than the fuller reality of a larger pool that includes women? Some research on women in the superintendency identifies gender-specific expectations of the role see Brunner, , , in press. This research prepares women to meet these typically unarticulated and important expectations which at times either prevent their access to the position or their success in the role. Such research reveals that career paths, selection, and retention of women in the role can be different than that of men. Knowledge of these differences is valuable for women as they think about moving into the superintendency. Research on women superintendents has the potential to help change educational administration preparation programs. Indeed, as noted in the dialogue that opens this paper, at the very least, it broadens and deepens discussions in educational administration classes. Bane My own advocacy for research on women in the superintendency may have limited my thinking, for I find my "Bane" list relatively short. Please contact me if you think of things that should be added to the list. Some people "men and women -- are offended by research that is female-specific, even when they are comfortable with research that has been done solely on or with men for decades. This discomfort creates anger in some and can create a backlash against women see Faludi, Some of the research on women in the superintendency focuses on the differences between men in the position and women in the position. This discussion tends to essentialize women and men. A number of feminists are critical of any essentialized notion of women see for example, Weiler, and suggest that no empirical evidence exists to support the notion that women operate in the workplace in a way that is different than men. There is the possibility that women wishing to be superintendents or even women who are superintendents may come to doubt themselves after reading accounts of successful women superintendents who are in no way or only in a few ways like themselves. I am not aware of any research that addresses this possibility. As with all research, there is the possibility that the written accounts of women in the superintendency do not actually match the experiences of women in the positions. Research methods tend to distance researchers from their participants. There have been attempts to work against this tendency see Brunner, in press; Grogan, in press; Jackson, in press. The seemingly different ways of viewing the role of superintendent of schools see Benefit 5 can create contradictions, conflicts, and tensions in educational administration preparation programs. In my view, this is a benefit, not a bane, but there are those who believe it a negative. Not surprisingly, the research done on women in the superintendency has been done primarily, if not only, by other women. This in itself is problematic. If only women find the topic important enough for further investigation, the cries for changes in the role or changes in the number of women in the position will remain marginalized. The normative

assumption that only men can be superintendents is far stronger than any female voice advocating that women of all races belong in the position.
