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Following the success of his two books on the castles and ancient monuments of England and Scotland, Damien Noonan has now crossed the Irish Sea to explore the many and varied historic (and prehistoric) sites which are to be found in Ireland. Since many of these are little known and often.

In these verdant lands, there are tombs older than the Egyptian pyramids; while knights, kings, monks and vikings star in the most extraordinary stories. The massive stone megaliths would have dominated the skyline for miles, stamping their authority on the landscape and all who dwelt in it. The Neolithic people were like us – not cave-dwellers but a complex society of engineers, astronomers, farmers and priests. We can no longer hear their voices, for they left no written records. Yet we can still know them. We can stand where they stood, see the contours and skylines they saw, feel the sun and rain they felt, hear the same cry of the winds and song of the birds. Walk in their footsteps: At dawn on the equinoxes, the rising sun shines directly into the entrance and irradiates the carvings – perhaps a sign to farmers that it was time to begin planting their crops. Grange Stone Circle is the largest and finest prehistoric circle in Ireland, its stones aligned to sunrise on the summer solstice. Constructed circa 2500 BC, this Bronze Age ritual site also served as an astronomical calendar. At dawn on the equinoxes, the rising sun shines directly into the entrance and irradiates the carvings. Around the tranquil lake history is laid out like a map. Even the heritage centre across the water is based on a thatched Neolithic farmhouse. Come in May and you can immerse yourself in the annual Festival of the Fires. And every weekend afternoon from April to October a local guide will take you for a walk and share the secrets of the hill. On a clear day, the view stretches across 20 counties. If you are lucky, you may be the only ones communing with past generations as you explore the Neolithic tombs, hut sites and admire the ancient rock art. This was a place of veneration for a thousand years. The greatest tomb is Newgrange. It is almost 100ft across and 40ft high, and swirling, darting carvings decorate the interior. Access to the chamber is limited and decided by lottery. At winter solstice, the rising sun shines magically through a perfectly engineered roof slot and people gather at dawn on the mornings of December to witness this amazing event.
