Oct. 9 update: The Fort Wayne-South Bend diocese has added two names to the list of deacons and priests accused of sexual abuse.

The list, published Tuesday, contains the names of men who at some point served in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend. The list was compiled by the church review board, comprising mostly lay people, according to a diocese news release. That board investigated all abuse allegations in their district. The men whose names appear on the list were accused of actions that appeared "more likely to be true than not in the judgment of the Diocesan Review Board" and were "accepted as credible by the bishop. The decision to release the names comes as the Catholic Church faces thousands of new abuse allegations, and law enforcement agencies are opening investigations into parishes around the country. A Pennsylvania grand jury in August released a report that found around priests in the state molested at least 1, children since the s. In the determination of credibility for the purpose of the list, Bishop Rhoades followed the recommendations of the Diocesan Review Board. Bishop Rhoades expressed gratitude for their expertise and counsel. A full list of the Diocesan Review Board members and their bios can be found on the diocesan website. The number of credible accusations received against each priest or deacon is noted. The ordination date for each priest and deacon named on the list is noted. Changes in the clerical status of each priest and deacon named, including dates of the changes, are noted. If the accused is deceased, his date of death is noted. This list will be supplemented as appropriate based upon any future determinations of credible allegations. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend stands firm in its commitment to investigate any allegation of sexual abuse by a member of the clergy and to listen to and support anyone who has been abused.
