You can change the background picture on your desktop or opt to use no picture at all. If you would like to see something different, you can use a picture supplied with your operating system or you can use one of your own images.

Actually, there are two ways to go about it. Also, you can configure it so that one image type opens with one application and another image type opens with a different program. Note that in addition to changing the default picture viewer, you can follow the same steps below to change the default media player, default web browser, etc. For example, for the default media player, you would select your media player from the list, i. VLC Media Player, and then adjust the settings for it. In Windows 7 and higher, you can change which file types a program opens or you can change which program is used when opening a specific file type. Click on the Control Panel and then click on Default Programs while under the icons view. Here you will see the two options I mentioned above: Set your default programs and Associate a file type or protocol with a program. Select the program and Windows will tell you how many defaults this programs is set to open. You can then click on Set this program as default to have it open all the default file types or you can click Choose defaults for this program to choose specific file types. All other formats are set to open with Windows Photo Viewer. If you want to use a different program to open pictures, for example, select that program from the list and then choose Set this program as default. The advantage to this method as opposed to the first option is that here you can choose any program you like to open a file. In the first method, only programs that have registered with Windows will show up in that list and there is no way to manually add a missing program. You can also get to this same dialog by right-clicking on the any file in Explorer, clicking on Open With and then clicking on Choose default program. The former is a desktop app and will load there and the latter is a Windows Store app and will load as an app. You can follow the same procedures as for Windows 7, but the only difference is that you will see the Windows Store apps listed as options too. You do want to be careful changing these settings because there is no way to simply reset all default programs back to their original values. The only real way to reset default programs is to either download a registry file that will manually change each value or create a new user profile. 2: Setting screen size/position

Change the display picture to the one of your choice. Click on the "Browse" button to access your computer's hard drive. When the Windows Explorer dialogue screen opens, locate and select the picture you desire.

Read 78, times In Windows 8 the account picture is an image associated with your account that is shown on the login screen and in the Start Screen. Unlike previous versions of Windows, Windows 8 does not include any built-in images that you can use as your account picture. Instead if you wish to change your account picture you need to select an existing picture from your computer or take one using an attached web cam. This tutorial will explain how to assign a picture to your account in Windows 8. On the Windows 8 Start Screen, click on your account name in the top right corner of the screen. This will open a drop down menu where you will see the option Change Account Picture as shown in the image below. When you click on the Change account picture menu option you will be brought to another screen where you can see your current account picture and change it to a new one. At the above screen you have the ability to use an existing picture from your computer or create a new picture with an attached webcam. To use an existing picture, click on the Browse button. At the browse screen, simply find the picture you want to use and left click on it once to select it. Then click on the Choose image button to begin using it as your account picture. If you do not wish to use an existing picture then you can use a webcam that is attached to your computer to take a new picture for you. To do this click on the Camera button on the Account Picture screen. This will open a Window showing what your webcam sees as shown below. To take the picture simply click on the screen. If you wish to set a 3 second timer so that you can get yourself positioned in front the webcam, click on the Timer button and then click on the screen. When taking a picture with your webcam, do not stand close to the computer. Windows 8 will only use a portion of the picture that is taken, so the farther back you stand the more you will be able to show in your account picture. Once the picture is taken you will be presented with a screen where you need to select the portion of the picture you wish to use for your account picture. On this screen you will see a square with a white circle in each corner. The part of the picture that resides in the square will be what is actually used as your account picture. Using your mouse you can slide the square around the picture in order to capture the part of the picture you wish to use. You can also make the square larger and smaller by dragging the white circles outward. Once you are happy with the selection, click on the OK button to set your account picture to this new image. You should now have your selected picture as the new account picture in Windows 8. Furthermore, you can click the box beneath "Choose a fit" to change the way the picture is displayed (e.g., filling your entire screen). Solid color - Allows you to select a solid color (e.g., gray) to fill your Windows desktop.

Find the location of the picture you want to use and click OK. Put a check mark in the picture you want to set as the Windows background. Choose from Center, Tile, Fit, Fill or Stretch for the Picture position option, to select how the picture is displayed as the background on the desktop. Also, you need to choose how often the picture changes. The time range can be anywhere from 10 seconds to 1 day. Click Save changes to set your selected picture as the new Windows desktop background. If you have Windows 7 Home Basic or Windows 8 Basic on your computer, the "Personalize" option may be greyed out or not available at all. To change the desktop background, click the Start Menu button and type change desktop background in the Search box. In the returned search results, click the "Change desktop background" option. You can then use the steps above, starting with step 3, to change the Windows background. Windows XP users click the Desktop tab. After selecting a new background picture, click OK to save the changes. By default, Microsoft Windows has a listing of default Windows backgrounds. If you want to change the background to a different picture, such as a family picture, click the browse button and browse to the directory of the picture. Windows 95 users can only set BMP images as their desktop background. Therefore, if you have a different format of image, you need to convert it to a BMP image before setting it as the background. All other Windows users should be able to set a GIF image as their background. Why do I have no background image? Within the listing of the available backgrounds, the first background is None. Selecting this option will disable any background image on your computer desktop. However, it is important to realize that when you change the background to None, your background will be a solid color instead. Windows XP users can change this color from the same window as where they change their desktop. All other users need to change the color of their desktop through the Appearance tab. How do I make a small image tiled across the background? Within the desktop or background properties window, a user will be able to customize the layout of their image by selecting Center, Tile, or Stretch. Below is a brief explanation of each of these settings. Center - Centers the image in the middle of the desktop. Doing this enables the user to only have one image set as their background instead of having the image tiled. If the image is smaller than your computer resolution, then you may have a solid color border around the image. Tile - Tiling an image takes a smaller image and duplicates it multiple times across the Desktop. Stretch - Stretching an image sets a single image across the whole screen. The smaller the image size, the more distortion you will notice when stretching an image. It may also result in pixelation of that image. How do I make the background as only one small image and not tiled? Why am I unable to see my background? Your desktop background might not display if the image file has been deleted or if active desktop has been enabled on the computer. Verify the image being used as the background is still available on the computer and can be viewed.
