

## 1: Psalm Bless God in the great congregation, bless the Lord from the fountain of Israel.

*It was my first 'Music Assembly' today at my new job. Couldn't believe it, they're still using the Come and Praise song book that was used in the primary school I went to in the early 80s. I'm not religious at all, but it was a real blast from the past belting out 'Tha-a-a-ank you lord for this new.*

Beginning BBC , gives his personal views on the place of singing and music in assembly: A well-chosen song enthusiastically sung in assembly can have an important effect on the group and on individuals. My view on this changed after a series of visits to primary schools to research practice. Time and again children said that what they remembered most were the singing and the stories. I expected stories to feature, but the number who referred to singing as being important took me by surprise. Creating an atmosphere Almost everyone uses instrumental music, and occasionally commercial songs, to create an atmosphere of quiet reflection in assemblies, especially at the beginning and end, but assembly songs are used in this way too. Most Come and Praise songs are available on CD or cassette, so they can be played as listening music. A small group of recorder players or other instrumentalists also provide this sort of experience. Each of the Come and Praise books has an instrumental version different from the piano version , which comprises lines for recorders, guitars, unpitched percussion and other instruments. Sometimes the very experience of singing a song deepens awareness of an idea. As it is sung, the harmonizing of the two groups of children in the assembly becomes in itself an expression of unity; as the first part ends, the reduced volume of the second part in the last phrase creates a sense of greater peace. It is moving to follow the song with a few seconds of complete silence before anyone speaks or moves. A song for all seasons A song is able to create or reflect the mood of the school community. Celebration may call for exuberant, roof-lifting singing, but at other times a quieter, reflective atmosphere is what is needed. Two schools I have known well have had to face the tragic death of children within their communities. In one, the boy who had died had once played some of his favourite songs on his recorder: In the other school, a group of about 15 children sang to everyone else and helped to make it a deeply moving but celebratory assembly. These are read or sung as the moments of reflection or prayer. Sometimes the mixed faith nature of a school community makes it inappropriate to use specific prayers which assume a faith commitment. It may be, however, entirely appropriate for a song to be sung to the rest of the school or played from a CD with this sort of introduction: In fact, some of the Come and Praise songs have a dance connection. Adam and Eve began in a still position on the rostrum; then they gradually uncurled and began sinuously to rise up into movements reflecting their enjoyment of Paradise. Songs as the basis for complete assemblies Generally, we think of an assembly theme and only then think of songs that will fit. Encouraging singing It is useful to take stock with regard to the role and quality of the assembly singing. Can the words be clearly seen? If a CD or MP3 is being used, can it be heard at the back of the room? If a song is not well known, can time be found to teach it or could it be sung as follow-my-leader? Assembly singing has the power to draw the school community together – staff and children. Good listening and good singing!

Start with a guided fantasy. Everyone, close your eyes and imagine the scene. Which race it is is up to you, but you know that your parents have come to watch you, so you want to try and do your best. Are you confident that you will win? Are you dreading it, because you know full well that you will come last and would much rather go and hide. What thoughts are going through your head? Are you nervous, are you confident? On your marks, get set, GO!! Either way, you go to your parents afterwards. How do you feel? Which person do you think would feel more encouraged? By giving encouragement, we embolden and empower them to know that they are doing a good job or they are doing all right and their efforts are appreciated. Think how crushed the winner of the race we imagined would be because, instead of being congratulated for doing a great job and for winning, there was no encouragement, no uplifting words, just the expectation that he or she should have done better. Everyone thrives on praise and on being told that they are doing a good job, they are good at something. Why is it, then, that, most of time, the first thing we say is a negative word or a criticism? If you include your own self-talk in this, then I have no doubt that you are your own harshest critic. Why so often when we are given compliments do we simply shrug them off and find something negative to say about ourselves or our performance instead. Words of affirmation and encouragement are so important – in the way that we speak to ourselves, but also in the way we talk to others. Time for reflection So, your task for today – and, if you can try to develop it a little more, the day after and the day, week, weeks and so on after that – is to talk nicely to yourself, encourage yourself. Remember, there may be someone sitting next to you who is not capable of getting the grade you got, let alone the top grade. Try to catch those negative thoughts before they cause you to spiral into a day of negativity. If all else fails, take a deep breath and focus on one good thing that you can see. Give your friend some encouragement.
