Here are six straightforward reasons to believe that God is really there. No statements of, "You just have to believe. But first consider this. Here then, are some reasons to consider The complexity of our planet points to a deliberate Designer who not only created our universe, but sustains it today. But here are a few: If Earth were smaller, an atmosphere would be impossible, like the planet Mercury. If Earth were larger, its atmosphere would contain free hydrogen, like Jupiter. The Earth is located the right distance from the sun. If the Earth were any further away from the sun, we would all freeze. Any closer and we would burn up. The Earth remains this perfect distance from the sun while it rotates around the sun at a speed of nearly 67, mph. It is also rotating on its axis, allowing the entire surface of the Earth to be properly warmed and cooled every day. And our moon is the perfect size and distance from the Earth for its gravitational pull. The moon creates important ocean tides and movement so ocean waters do not stagnate, and yet our massive oceans are restrained from spilling over across the continents. Plants, animals and human beings consist mostly of water about two-thirds of the human body is water. It has wide margin between its boiling point and freezing point. Water allows us to live in an environment of fluctuating temperature changes, while keeping our bodies a steady Water is a universal solvent. This property of water means that various chemicals, minerals and nutrients can be carried throughout our bodies and into the smallest blood vessels. Over the last few decades, polls have indicated that between 30 to 40 percent or more of Americans claim that they have been born again. If one third of our nation was truly born again, the moral condition in our land would be vastly different! We should be able to spot a Christian by his godly behavior and lifestyle. Genuine faith results in good works James 2: As 1 John 2: He is the source of light and life. We saw in 1: He has given us examples of early faith in the disciples. But now we read 2: But instead we read 2: I agree with John Piper, who explains desiring God. What it says, in essence, is that Jesus knows what is in every heart, and so he can see when someone believes in a way that is not really believing. Some belief is not saving belief. Has He entrusted Himself to me? These verses teach us that! We need to believe in Jesus in such a way that He believes in us. So the story of Nicodemus helps us to understand these verses and vice versa. There is such a thing as superficial faith that does not result in salvation. Chapter 6 reports a similar incident. After Jesus fed the 5, with five loaves and two fish, we read 6: These people get it! Superficial faith in Christ is based on the spectacular or on what He can do to relieve your problems, not on Jesus as Savior and Lord. They had seen Him clear out the merchants and money-changers from the temple. Maybe some of them had been healed or knew those who had been healed. They were ready to sign on with Jesus. We keep the Law of Moses. We just observed Passover. We see an example of superficial faith in Acts 8. A magician named Simon had built quite a following in Samaria, claiming to be someone great 8: When he saw the miracles that God was working through Philip, Simon believed and was baptized. He continued on with Philip, being constantly amazed by the miracles that he saw 8: Then, when Peter and John arrived and prayed for the people to receive the Holy Spirit, Simon was impressed. He offered money to the apostles so that he could obtain the same powers. But Peter strongly denounced him 8: You have no part or portion in this matter, for your heart is not right before God. Therefore repent of this wickedness of yours, and pray the Lord that, if possible, the intention of your heart may be forgiven you. For I see that you are in the gall of bitterness and in the bondage of iniquity. Superficial faith may have a high view of Jesus, but it is not high enough. These people were impressed with Jesus. While I believe that he later came to faith, at this point his view of Jesus was high, but not high enough. We see the same thing in John They had a high view of Jesus as a good man, but not high enough. The same is true of the Mormons. Superficial faith thinks highly of Jesus, but not highly enough. Superficial faith may be the starting point of genuine faith, but the test is whether it perseveres and bears fruit. Believing on the basis of signs miracles is better than not believing at all. Simon the magician believed, but he had not repented of his pride and love of power over the people. He was not saved. In the parable of the sower, it is only the seed that endures and bears fruit that is genuinely saved. Faith that perseveres sees with growing clarity the glory of Christ and what He did for us on the cross so that it perseveres when trials or persecution hit. They may be scholars, but their knowledge has never changed their lives. Others have their hearts touched, but their minds have not been in operation. In fact, they have been told that they should not try to understand. Often, they have not submitted their wills to Christ. There is a third group where their Christianity is almost entirely a matter of the will. They just want to be doing things to serve God. Lloyd-Jones argues that all three types have superficial faith because they have only picked out what appeals to them and believed in that. Their faith is partial, based on what they like about Jesus. Many of us believed in Jesus with a shallow or superficial faith. We trusted Him because we wanted healing or success or something other than salvation from sin. But to go on and develop into genuine saving faith, you have to see yourself as the Bible portrays you and see Christ for who He is. I believe there is a great danger of one thinking more highly of himself than he ought to think, and the Bible forbids such an attitude. He knows where you live. He knows where you work. He knows everything about you there is to be known. He knows what really makes you tick. Surely there is a great advantage of having a God like that watching over us, caring for us, and providing for us. He knows the need of everyone reading this article. And not only does He know all, but the Bible says He is in a position to provide our every need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus Philippians 4: The fact that God knows all there is to know about us can also be a disturbing thought. It means He knows all the bad things about us. He knows every time we think something in our heart that is impure and unholy and biased and prejudiced. He knows every time we have said some kind of word under our breath that was not to His honor and to His glory. And this can really disturb a lot of people. But we can be thankful we have a God who knows about all of our wrongdoings; about all of our shortcomings, our frustrations, and our anxieties in life. He knows the many times we have embraced some great ideal, and it has been smashed with the hammer-blows of reality. He knows there were times in life when we really purposed in heart to do our very best, to try and just pass through one day without marring the glory of God, and then we experienced a failure at the end of that day. My friend, it is not my purpose to be overly optimistic, but I am persuaded there is something wonderful and magnificent and expansive about the grace of God to one who has faith in Jesus Christ. It is so great that we in our weak finite minds are not really able to comprehend it all. God believes in you because He knows you thoroughly. They saw a despised tax collector who was a thief and a turncoat. When Jesus looked up in the tree, He too saw a thief and a turncoat. Christ saw one who was despised by the citizens of that community because he was working for the interest of the Roman Empire. And Zacchaeus was partly responsible for the suppression that the Jewish population was experiencing. But you know, Jesus saw the real person. He saw all that Zacchaeus was. He saw something in Zacchaeus no one else ever saw. He saw all that Zacchaeus might become. The same is true with you and me today. As people look to us, they only know a little bit about us from our conversation, our reaction, our

personality, and what we do and say and think out loud. But God knows all about you and me today. He knows all that we are and He knows all that we can be. Luther Burbank, the horticulturist, used to have a slogan, and it was this: Jesus walked one day beside the Sea of Galilee and saw four fishermen. Two of the fishermen were casting into the water and two were mending their nets. They were people just like us. We are told that at least one of them could be very profane. Of course, their hands were calloused by hard labor. Their faces were bronzed by the wind and the sun. Their remarkable contribution to the history of man has been so notable that we find their names in the New Testament. Michelangelo, the great painter and sculptor, went one day to the quarry and selected an ugly, misshapen piece of marble. Some of those who were looking on asked him why he chose that particular piece of marble. And he brought it about. Sometimes we look at people and see only the worst. Jesus looks at people and sees not only the bad but also the good, and He seeks to bring out the best in us. No one else dared dream that the selfish, little man by the name of Zacchaeus up in the sycamore tree someday would be an open-handed and generous-hearted benefactor. But Jesus saw all of this. One man stated it like this: His fame had preceded Him. All that Jesus had to do was walk through the streets of Jericho, and He could generate an impromptu parade. On that particular day, Jesus could have been the dinner-guest of any prestigious or reputable person in the city of Jericho. But instead, He chose to go home with the most despised, rejected citizen of the community. Why did He do it? There can only be one answer. Christ loved Zacchaeus with a love that exceeds human love. The love of God motivated Jesus Christ to love those who were unloveable. And if we are truly born again of the water and the Spirit, this same love can generate our hearts to love those who are unloveable. Some people think love puts on blinders, and refuses to see the flaws and the faults of the objects of affection. But perfect love sees with a clear-eyed vision. Perfect love is painfully aware of all the flaws and faults of those whom we love most. From childhood, many of us can remember the account which tells how Simon Peter denied the Lord. It is a tragic, but inspiring story. Jesus had predicted exactly what happened about twelve hours earlier. Jesus told Peter that before dawn he would betray the sacred bond of trust that had existed between them for three years. Just then Jesus turned His head toward Peter. And he went out and wept bitterly. What did Peter remember? Certainly he remembered what Jesus predicted just twelve hours earlier. But also, Peter realized that if Jesus knew about his denial then, he possibly knew it twelve months before. They talked together, they walked together, they ate together, and they traveled many miles on foot together. And all the way, Jesus just kept tenderly caring and loving this same Peter who at a given time in his life would deny Him and curse and swear that he had never known Him. Now Peter realized that Jesus loved him.

Believe in God, believe in yourself, and always follow your dreams. Enjoy each and every once-in-a-lifetime moment! Joining you in grateful prayer for the past and for Almighty's continuing blessings.

And it is an important conversation to engage in whether in our own minds or with others. What do we believe about God? But at the beginning of , I want to turn the issue around and ask: Belief and action are two sides of the same process and not separate entities. We too act as we do because of what we believe. For instance, I believe my children are worthwhile. Therefore, they are worth my investment in their lives – investments of time, love, care, interest and discipline – and much more. One way I did that was to help them financially through university. Another way is to be available to them when they are in difficulty. They could say I was really strict and they needed to get home right away -- or else! Sometimes they took advantage of my offer and sometimes they did not. So what does God believe about us as human beings? Psalm 8 is a significant place to begin. That is what so captivated the psalmist. Why take a second look our way? Humans seem so inconsequential beside this incomparable and vast creation. Who among us has not stood under the stars in awe and wondered about our place in this incredible universe? We might continue to wonder if it were not for what the psalmist tells us in this psalm about the place and the task of human beings. Yes, that is exactly what the psalmist says in verse 5. Jay Kessler described it this way: Virtually every one of us in this room is the result of an educational system that has, drip by drip, like dropping water on stone, made an impression on our lives as to who we are. We almost all think of ourselves as a little higher than the animals. When we see the final "naked ape" embarrassingly like us, we say, "This is my heritage. This is where I came from. We carry on the mammalian kind of processes: We do these things without consciously thinking about them, just like all the other animals. My friends, we are not an accidental by-product of an accidental evolutionary process. And we are not something. We humans are a deliberate creation by God – however God did that. God gives us glory and honour! The imagery here is significant. Another way to express this is to say: This is a place of wonderful responsibility. God believes in us enough to give us this remarkable assignment with serious responsibilities for caring wisely for other living creatures on this planet. No matter how human beings have failed in their assignment up to this point, the task still remains today. As followers of Jesus, we are not alone – we have never been alone – in the task God has called us to accomplish. The author of the Letter to Hebrews in Chapter 2: We do not, however, see human beings ruling over all things now. We see him now crowned with glory and honour because of the death he suffered. But God has not appointed humans to rule by exploiting this Earth and other human beings. In fact, throughout Scripture, God is clear we are not to destroy the Earth or oppress or take advantage of one another. Unfortunately, humans seem to possess an inner inclination toward exploitation and destruction. But think of it: What more does God believe about us as human beings? God believes we are capable of handling the tests and challenges of life that inevitably come our way. And who does not believe there will not be adversity and struggle for us in ? Here is the passage again from The Good News Translation: My brothers and sisters, consider yourselves fortunate when all kinds of trials come your way, for you know that when your faith succeeds in facing such trials, the result is the ability to endure. Make sure that your endurance carries you all the way without failing, so that you may be perfect and complete, [that is mature and well-developed in your faith and response to life]. We are capable because the faith in God and in Jesus that is within us shows its self in the way we handle the troubles and difficulties of our human condition. Our ability to succeed despite the troubles and difficulties we face does not come from thinking we can handle these circumstances on our own or in our own strength. Rather our willingness to exercise our faith and hope in God results in our being able to endure the challenges we are going through. And if we are not sure what to do when we find ourselves in challenging circumstances, God expects us to pray to him and ask for help and for the wisdom we need. God loves to help, says James. He loves to help. Ask boldly, believingly, without a second thought. God believes we are capable of trusting him -- that he loves to help us, that we can be bold in our asking for assistance and that we can believe -- without reservations -- God is there for us even when the trouble is not removed from our lives. God also believes we

are capable of doing what is good. Hear what Micah said in Chapter 6, verse 8: The LORD has told us what is good. What he requires of us is this: She has been doing her job for 43 years -- 28 of them on the night shift. She sees a steady stream of parents in her job, many of them frightened and weary. On one particular night in September , Miss Bettye as she is referred to by all who know her served food to a mother whose three-year-old had fallen out of a second-storey window that morning, another mother whose year-old was battling a rare form of leukemia and a third mother whose year-old had endured seven hours of brain surgery. Their stories broke the heart of Miss Bettye and, as one co-worker said: I am here for you. I start with the basement, and I go up, floor by floor, room by room. I pray for the children, I pray for the families, I pray for the nurses and the doctors. The one she stirs in every broth, and every whisper. The ingredient that makes her the perpetual light shining in the all-night kitchen. God believes in us. God acts in amazing mercy, in understanding compassion, in generous forgiveness and in constant love toward us. May this be so " may we believe this to be so -- in your eyes and mine.
