Contemplating the Cross
Contemplating the Cross Pope Benedict XVI, in his encyclical on hope offers us, once again, an insight into the mystery of the cross and the hope that enables us to embrace our own: Certainly we can recognize in our lives, right now, the heavy burden—whether it is financial concern, poor health, concern for loved ones, or even the heavy burden of our own sinfulness and its consequences. To put it in the form of a question: What is the goal, the hope, which will strengthen us to embrace our cross? It is by His death on the Cross that God has revealed this Love. When we look with the eyes of faith upon the Cross and we see Jesus saving us, loving us; we can then turn with the same eyes of faith and see also within our own lives that our cross is a gift of love. This then is our HOPE: We need Him and He is here. He will help us. He has proven His love. He is all-powerful and He wants to help us. Knowing this, believing this, what can we not face? We are not alone. I do not have to rely upon myself anymore; Jesus is God and He has set me free! I do not have to rely on my own plans, my own ways, my own strength, my own understanding. Suffering has shown me that all of these are fleeting and unreliable. Jesus is God and He will care for me and aid me in all my struggles and sufferings. The joy of knowing that I am loved deeply by One Who is so good; One Who is present to me in the midst of my pain. Jesus Himself has already taken on my pain so that I may find Him and His strength there waiting for me. When I embrace the cross I am embracing the One who is upon it. But if we can learn through faith to discover the Gift hidden within the pain, our burden will be lightened. We will not feel so heavily the weight of the cross because we will not be carrying it on our own. Jesus is with us. We will hear His Voice speaking to us. Do not be afraid! That is the joy and the hope of the Cross. She trusted that He would give her the grace needed to carry this cross, and that a true resurrection would ensue. I took her hand. I am so confused. But Jesus is with me, and I pray to Him, pray to Him every moment of the day and pray to Him at night. Later, thinking back on that visit and what she had said during it, I was reminded of a conversation I once had with a religious who often experienced deep interior suffering and desolation. When it comes my way I can either get focused inward and loose myself in the hatred, anger, revenge or I can look outside and offer it for those who are hurting me, or for souls. It is also a good way to focus on God because the little things that I thought were important seem to disappear in the face of the pain, only what is really valuable remains. It becomes a path to Him.

As catechists renew their commitment to leading others to Jesus Christ, the one who stands at the heart of all catechetical efforts, they will hear the anguished voices of the faithful in these challenging times. Patients bearing the pain of their physical afflictions found spiritual comfort as they gazed on the crucified Jesus and identified with the mystery of his unjust suffering. It is thought that *The Small Crucifixion* was a personal devotional image, intended either for a domestic setting or a private chapel. His body bears scars of torture while his lean face and bowed head evoke the injustice of his torment. The depravity of his tormentors is evidenced by his tattered loincloth. The crossbeam pulls downward under the mass of his body and the weight of divine mercy that takes the form of crucified love. John, the beloved disciple of the Lord. Their place at the foot of the cross is now ours as the faithful share in the unspeakable pain of survivors of abuse and beg God for their healing and for the renewal of the Church. As the canvas bends outward this sacred scene moves into our space. Only Christian faith gives access to this kind of participation. Sometimes a catechist might hear the question "why did Jesus suffer? But the Son of God offered himself on the cross for all our sins. No one, not even the saintliest person, can take on the sins of all or offer himself as a sacrifice for sinful humanity as a whole. Only God can and did on the cross. By your holy cross you have redeemed the world. From the cross, Jesus looks now on the faith of the Church, nourished by many faithful, holy priests and catechists in parishes across this local Church.
