Each month I met with my group I watched as a group of ladies who had only met a short time ago became closer to each other and to the Lord. And these relationships were not superficial, but they became friendships with depth and breadth—we shared our lives and watched God knit us together. At the end of our time together, I had grown and matured and had the confidence to walk alongside and mentor other women. I can say when the weekend started I was wondering where I was going to find healing? And then Saturday night came and “wow” God clearly showed me the stronghold my sister had over me. Forgiveness was never thought of, because she is who she is. The soul-tied prayer had a powerful impact. Ever since I prayed that prayer I do not feel the sense of judgement when I speak to my sister. I am sure she has no clue and that is fine, but the healing that has begun in me is awesome. Thank you for following your calling to serve God.

"Deborah was a prophet, the wife of Lappidoth. She was judge over Israel at that time. She held court under Deborah's palm between Ramah and Bethel in the hills of Ephraim.

She was judge over Israel at that time. The People of Israel went to her in matters of justice. Luckily the few that are listed depict women of strength, endurance, faith, and loyalty. No female leader is depicted so strongly as Deborah. Here, Deborah serves in the highest level of leadership – not only as judge and prophet, but also one that led in battle. She reflects wisdom and strength. I have often said that she is two going on thirty. Ask anyone in my family who the boss is and they will most likely point to her. It requires more than that. At a recent PCUSA gathering, we as racial ethnic clergywomen were asked to reflect on our leadership as daughters of Deborah. Not a bad woman figure to look up to. I spent last week at two very different gatherings. One was on building up and equipping racial ethnic clergywomen in roles of leadership and the other was meeting with representatives from the six agencies of the General Assembly office Office of General Assembly, Board of Pensions, Presbyterian Publishing Corporation, Presbyterian Church Foundation, Investment and Loan Program, and Committee on Theological Education to plan a consultation on leadership in the 21st Century Leadership Initiative Launch Team. Two very different gatherings but all having to do with some type of leadership. Out of the two, there was one gathering where I was looking forward to being nourished and inspired, while the other one I was a little hesitant to why I had agreed to be a part of it. At the racial ethnic clergywomen gathering, we discussed how as women and specifically racial ethnic women, we may lead in different ways – egalitarian using consensus and team building, sharing wisdom through our experiences and stories, and a greater capacity to express empathy and compassion with those that are marginalized. The training included workshop after workshop regarding finance and budget, interview skills, Board of Pensions, and hearing stories from those in higher positions. Ironically, none of this modeled what we had previously discussed as women leaders. After all, right in that room were women who had been solo pastors and Heads of Staff for over 12 years, some serving in large congregations, some in urban ministry, and some as chaplains in a college or hospital. I soon left this gathering to attend a meeting for the Leadership Initiative Launch Team. Here were people that were very used to sitting in meetings to get the job done. At some point in the meeting, I had to make a confession that I had no idea why I was invited to be a part of this team. I am an Associate Pastor at a small congregation in an urban setting. By no means, do I feel qualified to figure out how GA can better support leaders in the 21st century. They listened and they were open to using a different method of discernment. The conversations were surprisingly wonderful and thoughtful. As a young-ish, racial ethnic woman, I am sensitive to why I am being asked to be part of something. Is it because I exude some leadership qualities? Or is it because I have a particular skill-set that is needed and appreciated? I also recognize that my identity make-up shapes the lens in which I view the world, God, and my faith. But I do wonder for a person like myself what does it mean to be a leader in the 21st century in this particular denomination – PCUSA? After all, that is the question that the six GA agencies are asking. One thing that is perfectly clear is that there is diversity within the racial ethnic community; as well as the younger generation; as well as the sisterhood. For example, when I go to a racial ethnic gathering, I often feel the generational divide between those that have struggled and paved the way and those like myself that have benefitted from their fight and accomplishments. In February, the Leadership Initiative Launch Team will host a consultation, inviting about 30 leaders in the PCUSA denomination, to have conversations about leadership in the 21st century. Those invited will be a diverse group given age, racial ethnicity, ministry context, and location. Representatives from the six agencies are tasked to listen and observe while those present will have opportunities to share, discuss, and discern. I understand this sentiment. I remember when I was in college and hearing the Church ask how do we do ministry that is relevant to youth and young adults? My hope is that by giving space to hear and discern what the common values of leadership today looks like, we will begin to see the change that has been so longed for.

But may they who love you be like the sun when it rises in its strength. After greeting me, she enthusiastically told me about the exciting ministries God was allowing in and through her life. Then she concluded with a puzzling statement: Someone had taught her that a godly woman leading meant a man had failed somewhere. We talked further and she explained more, pointing out that Barak was supposed to be the judge, but when he turned out to be a wimp, God raised up Deborah. And we know God would prefer to use a man to lead instead of a woman. I shook my head. So we considered another prophetess in the Bible. We find her story in 2 Kings Hilkiyah the priest, Ahikam, Acbor, Shaphan and Asaiah went to speak to the prophetess Huldah, who was the wife of Shallum son of Tikvah, the son of Harhas, keeper of the wardrobe. She lived in Jerusalem, in the Second District. I am going to bring disaster on this place and its people, according to everything written in the book the king of Judah has read. Because they have forsaken me and burned incense to other gods and provoked me to anger by all the idols their hands have made, my anger will burn against this place and will not be quenched. Because your heart was responsive and you humbled yourself before the LORD when you heard what I have spoken against this place and its people, that they would become accursed and laid waste, and because you tore your robes and wept in my presence, I have heard you, declares the LORD. Therefore I will gather you to your fathers, and you will be buried in peace. Your eyes will not see all the disaster I am going to bring on this place. The first person mentioned in the list of those who consulted with Huldah was Hilkiyah the priest 2 Kings Interestingly, we find him mentioned in the Book of Jeremiah, which begins with these words: The words of Jeremiah son of Hilkiyah, one of the priests at Anathoth in the territory of Benjamin Jeremiah 1: Are we to conclude all of these men were spiritual wimps? Consider the many female leaders and prophetesses in scripture starting with Miriam Micah 6: In the New Testament we find Anna Luke 2: This is far from being an exhaustive list. Apparently God sometimes decides to use a woman as the Plan A, first-best, nobody-failed option. Are you willing and ready to be that woman? Going back to Deborah, note in Judges 5: She would sit i. The Israelites would come up to her to have their disputes settled. First she was a prophetess and probably a wife. But most likely Deborah was married. Deborah was a prophetess. Barak had faith, but with hesitancy. We have here a great example of a man and woman partnering as they obey the commands of God. Is there someone in your life whose faith you can bolster by your presence? If so, who is it and what can you do? Now the plot thickens. Has not the LORD gone ahead of you? But Barak pursued the chariots and army as far as Harosheth Haggoyim. All the troops of Sisera fell by the sword; not a man was left. Sometimes people say Deborah was not a judge because Hebrews And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions. Gideon fought, Barak fought, Samson fought, and Jephthah fought. David killed Goliath, and Samuel killed Agag, king of the Amalekites. But did Deborah conquer with the sword? Or they say that a woman leading was wrong, so she was excluded from the list. Yet the writer of Judges refers only to Deborah as the judge to whom the word of the Lord came Judges 4: While Deborah went with the army, she did not engage in battle. Perhaps the New Testament writer meant to list only those who literally conquered kingdoms. Joseph, Daniel, and Maryâ€”to name a fewâ€”are not mentioned, either. In fact it appears that in most cases the writer of Hebrews 11 seeks out the more flawed characters to highlight as people of faith. What an encouragement to us! We find no indication in the text that Deborah did anything but follow God with a whole heart. Sadly the focus from Judges 4 can become so limited to gender issues that we miss the overall message of the story, which is not about gender at all. Unconditional Obedience Deborah was a judge and a prophetess. And Deborah was a singer and songwriterâ€”she had an impressive resume. So when Deborah warned Barak that his conditional obedience would mean that the glory for defeating Sisera would go to a woman 4: But Deborah was not speaking of herself at all. Elizabeth had more faith than Zechariah. Mary is better remembered than Joseph.

Several times Paul mentioned Priscilla before her husband, Aquilla. Another American tennis star, Bobby Riggs, 55, had been considered the best player in the world years earlier, when he won Wimbledon and three U. S. Open titles. Riggs was humiliated, as the match actually advanced the argument that a young woman could beat an older man—something few people today would even question. Clearly the honor went to a woman. Was Riggs humiliated because a woman winning goes against nature? Or was his humiliation due in part to his erroneous views of women? God got His message through to Barak in a way that Barak would understand: You lack faith, you lose honor. Rather than seeing this as a battle-of-the-sexes message, we need to see the much more significant spiritual message: Heavenly Father, thank You for making me a woman. Thank you for using Deborah and Jael to help deliver Your people from oppression. Use me in the battle against evil. Remove the obstacles in my life that keep me from absolute obedience to you. Help me never to put conditions on my obedience, but always to be ready to immediately respond to the promptings of the Spirit. In the name of Your Son I pray, Amen.
