Peel off the cable from the system. Remove the cloth tape from the card reader board edge. Skip this step if the cloth tape is not present. Peel off the double sided tape and attach the rubber bumper to the system. Peel off the double sided tape from the hard drive flex cable. Press down the cable to attach the double sided tape to the card reader board.

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**P16S Working on Your Computer Before Working Inside Your Computer** Use the following safety guidelines to help protect your computer from potential damage and to help to ensure your personal safety. Unless otherwise noted, each procedure included in this document assumes that the following conditions exist: Before working inside your computer, read the safety information that shipped with your computer. For additional safety best practices information, see the Regulatory Compliance Homepage at [www.dell.com](http://www.dell.com). Many repairs may only be done by a certified service technician. You should only perform troubleshooting and simple repairs as authorized in your product documentation, or as directed by the online or telephone service and support team. Damage due to servicing that is not authorized by Dell is not covered by your warranty. Read and follow the safety instructions that came with the product. To avoid electrostatic discharge, ground yourself by using a wrist grounding strap or by periodically touching an unpainted metal surface, such as a connector on the back of the computer. Handle components and cards with care. Do not touch the components or contacts on a card. Hold a card by its edges or by its metal mounting bracket. Hold a component such as a processor by its edges, not by its pins. When you disconnect a cable, pull on its connector or on its pull-tab, not on the cable itself. Some cables have connectors with locking tabs; if you are disconnecting this type of cable, press in on the locking tabs before you disconnect the cable. As you pull connectors apart, keep them evenly aligned to avoid bending any connector pins. Also, before you connect a cable, ensure that both connectors are correctly oriented and aligned. The color of your computer and certain components may appear differently than shown in this document. To avoid damaging your computer, perform the following steps before you begin working inside the computer. Ensure that your work surface is flat and clean to prevent the computer cover from being scratched. Turn off your computer see **Turning Off Your Computer**. If the computer is connected to a docking device docked such as the optional Media Base or Battery Slice, undock it. To disconnect a network cable, first unplug the cable from your computer and then unplug the cable from the network device. Disconnect all network cables from the computer. Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets. Close the display and turn the computer upside-down on a flat work surface. To avoid damaging the system board, you must remove the main battery before you service the computer. Remove the main battery see **Battery**. Turn the computer top-side up. Press the power button to ground the system board. To guard against electrical shock, always unplug your computer from the electrical outlet before opening the display. Before touching anything inside your computer, ground yourself by touching an unpainted metal surface, such as the metal at the back of the computer. While you work, periodically touch an unpainted metal surface to dissipate static electricity, which could harm internal components. Remove any installed ExpressCards or Smart Cards from the appropriate slots. **Recommended Tools** The procedures in this document may require the following tools: To avoid losing data, save and close all open files and exit all open programs before you turn off your computer. Shut down the operating system: Click Start w , then click the arrow in the lower-right corner of the Start menu as shown below, and then click Shut Down. The computer turns off after the operating system shutdown process is complete. Ensure that the computer and all attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button for about 4 seconds to turn them off. **After Working Inside Your Computer** After you complete any replacement procedure, ensure you connect any external devices, cards, and cables before turning on your computer. To avoid damage to the computer, use only the battery designed for this particular Dell computer. Do not use batteries designed for other Dell computers. Connect any external devices, such as a port replicator, battery slice, or media base, and replace any cards, such as an ExpressCard. Connect any telephone or network cables to your computer. To connect a network cable, first plug the cable into the network device and then plug it into the computer. Connect your computer and all attached devices to their electrical outlets. Turn on your computer. **Battery Removing The Battery** 1. Remove the Secure Digital SD card. Remove the base cover. Lift the black cable-release clip to release the battery cable from the

connector on the system board and disconnect the battery cable. Remove the screws that secure the battery to the computer. Lift the battery up and away from the computer. To replace the battery, see *Installing The Battery*. To remove or locate the battery, see *Removing The Battery*. Place the battery into the battery bay. Replace and tighten the screws that secure the battery to the computer. Connect the battery cable to the system board and press down the cable-release clip to lock the battery cable. Install the base cover. Follow the procedures in *After working inside your computer*. Press in on the SD card to release the SD card from the computer. Slide the SD card out of the computer. Slide the SD card into its slot until it clicks into place. Remove the screws that secure the base cover to the computer. Slide the base cover towards the front of the computer. Lift it up and away from the computer. To replace the base cover see, *Installing The Base Cover*. To remove or locate the base cover, see *Removing The Base Cover*. Slide the base cover to align the screw holes correctly with the computer. Tighten the screws that secure the base cover to the computer. Install the Secure Digital SD card. Disconnect the speaker and system board cables from the audio board. Remove the screws that secure the audio board and the hard drive to the computer. Lift and remove the hard drive and audio board assembly from the computer. Slide the audio board from the hard drive. Remove the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive. Remove the hard drive from the hard-drive bracket. Attach the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive. Tighten the screws to secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive. Connect the audio board to the hard drive. Tighten the screws to secure the audio board and hard drive to the computer. Connect the hard-drive data and speaker cable to the audio board. Follow the procedures in *Before Working on Your Computer*. Remove the card-reader board. Disconnect the coin-cell battery cable from the system board. Release and remove the coin-cell battery from the computer. Place the coin-cell battery in its location. Connect the coin-cell battery cable to the system board. Install the card-reader board. Install the secure digital SD card. Disconnect the antenna cables from the WLAN card. Remove the screw that secures the WLAN card to the computer. Slide and remove the WLAN card out from its slot on the system board. Insert the WLAN card into its connector at a degree angle. Replace and tighten the screw that secures the WLAN card to the computer. Connect the black and white antenna cables to their respective connectors marked on the WLAN card. Remove the audio board and hard drive.

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Remove the Secure Digital SD card. Remove the base cover. Remove the audio board and the hard drive. Remove the wireless local area network WLAN card. To remove or locate the heat sink and fan assembly, see Removing the Thermal Fan. Place the fan into its slot on the computer. Replace and tighten the screw to secure the fan to the computer. Connect the thermal fan cable to the system board. Remove the wireless wide area network WWAN card. Disconnect the camera, thermal fan, coin-cell battery, hard drive, SD card reader, SIM card reader, LED board and touch pad flex cables from the system board. Remove the screws that secures the system board to the computer. Lift the system board up and away from the computer. To replace the system board see, Installing The System Board. To remove or locate the system board, see Removing The System Board. Place the system board in its location on the base of the computer. Tighten the screws that secures the system board to the computer. Connect the camera cable , thermal fan cable, coin-cell battery cable, hard disk cable, SD card reader cable, SIM card reader cable, touch pad flex cable, and LED board cable to the system board. Slide the SIM card holder out from the system. Use your fingertips to spread apart the securing clips on each end of the memory module connector until the memory module pops up. Remove the memory module from its connector on the system board by drawing the module from the system board at degree angle. Starting on the right side of the system, use a plastic scribe to pry up the LED cover from the computer. Pull the LED cover toward the keyboard and remove it from the computer. Disconnect the antenna cables from the WWAN card. Remove the screw that secures the WWAN card to the computer. Insert the WWAN card into its connector at a 45° degree angle. Replace and tighten the screw that secures the WWAN card to the computer. Connect the antenna cables to the WWAN card. Remove the screws that secure keyboard to the computer. Flip the keyboard over and lay it on the palm rest. Lift the clip to release the keyboard cable and disconnect it from the computer. To install the keyboard, see Installing The Keyboard. To remove or locate the keyboard, see Removing the Keyboard. Place the keyboard on the palmrest with the bottom side up. Connect the keyboard cable to its connector on the system board. Turn the keyboard over and lay it on the palmrest.
