To the contrary, opposition by the Academic Senate, faculty unions, the California Community College Consultation Council, and the RP Group underlines the general opposition to their policies and practices. The other huge issue raised is the shocking preponderance of sanctions given by ACCJC compared to their peer agencies. From to the six United States regional accrediting bodies issued a total of sanctions to community colleges in the United States. ACCJC has continued to be out of step with the other accrediting agencies.
