

1: How to Change Your Text Size and Color in WordPress - The Blog Starter

To change the color on existing text, select the text you want to recolor, click on the font color icon -- which usually looks like a colored letter -- and choose from the available color listings. You can also press the button proactively to select a font color for text you are about to write.

Select a different tool in the toolbox. Select characters Select a type tool. Select the text layer in the Layers panel, or click in the text flow to automatically select a text layer. Position the insertion point in the text, and do one of the following: Drag to select one or more characters. Double-click to select a single word. Triple-click to select an entire line of text. Click a point in the text and then Shift-click to select a range of characters. To use the arrow keys to select characters, hold down Shift and press the Right Arrow or Left Arrow key. Choose a font family and style A font is a set of characters—letters, numbers, or symbols—that share a common weight, width, and style. When you select a font, you can select the font family for example, Arial and its type style independently. A type style is a variant version of an individual font in the font family for example, regular, bold, or italic. The range of available type styles varies with each font. A faux font is a computer-generated version of a font that approximates an alternative typeface design. To change the font of all characters in a layer, select the text layer in the Layers panel, and then use the buttons and menus in the options bar to change the font type, style, size, alignment, and color. Do one of the following: If the font family you chose does not include a bold or italic style, click the Faux Bold button, Faux Italic button, or both. The type you enter gets its color from the current foreground color; however, you can change the type color before or after you enter text. When editing existing text layers, you can change the color of individual characters or all type in a layer. Choose a font size The type size determines how large the type appears in the image. The physical size of the font depends on the resolution of the image. Higher resolutions reduce a given text point size because the pixels are packed more tightly in higher resolution images. To change the size of all the characters in a layer, select the text layer in the Layers panel. Select the Horizontal Type tool or the Vertical Type tool. In the options bar, enter or select a new value for Size. You can enter a size larger than 72 points. The value you enter is converted into the default unit of measurement. To use an alternate unit of measurement, enter the unit in, cm, pt, px, or pica after the value in the Size text box. The default unit of measurement for type is points. Change text color You can change the type color before or after you enter text. You can also apply a gradient to text in a text layer. To change the color of text before you type it, select a type tool. To change the color of existing text, select a type tool and then drag to select the text. To choose a color from a list of color swatches, click the the Color menu in the options bar. To select a color and add it to the palette, click. Apply style to text You can apply effects to text. Any effect from the Effects panel can be applied to text in a layer. Before top and after middle and bottom applying styles to text. For new text, write and commit the text you want to apply a style to. Then, select from the available presets in the Tool Options bar. For existing text, select a layer that contains text. Open the Effects panel, and double-click the thumbnail of a style you want to apply to the text. Warp type Warping allows you to distort type to conform to a variety of shapes; for example, you can warp type in the shape of an arc or a wave. Warping applies to all characters in a text layer—you cannot warp individual characters. Text layer with warp applied In the Edit workspace, select a text layer. Select a type tool, and click the Warp button in the tool options bar. The style determines the basic shape of the warped text. Select an orientation for the warp effect—Horizontal or Vertical. Optional Specify values for additional warping options to control the orientation and perspective of the warp effect: Bend to specify the amount of warp. Horizontal Distortion and Vertical Distortion to apply perspective to the warp. Select a text layer that has warping applied to it. Change the orientation of a type layer Do one of the following: Select the text and then click the Toggle Text Orientation button in the options bar. This tutorial is for WordPress. If you are still using a WordPress. To utilize the full power of WordPress you may want to consider transferring your WordPress. When writing a post in WordPress you will see a few text options on the post editor screen like bold, italics, and strikethrough. But what if you want to change the size of the text? There is seemingly no simple solution for this on the post editor screen, so I am going to show you some workarounds to get it done. This will involve some light HTML coding, but even if you are a beginner you should be able to copy and paste the examples I give to get your desired effect. The method I am going to show you should only be used if you want to make changes to just a few words in your post. This is because, for some reason, the developers of WordPress decided to hide this feature. Here is how to get to it: This will bring up some extra options in the toolbar above your post. Choose whichever color you like. Changing Text Size Changing your text size follows a process similar to the one we used to change the text color. This one is a little more complicated though. Here is how to do it: Once you choose a text size you will notice that it not only changed the text you highlighted, but all of the text in that paragraph! To fix this, we need to get into the HTML code of the post. Look at the paragraph where we changed the text size. Just prior to the paragraph you will see this: In order to change this, and only change the size of the text we want, we need to move those codes to the appropriate place. Take a look at the screenshots below to see how to do this: As you can see, all you need to do is copy and paste the codes to surround the text that you want to change.

You can correct typos, change fonts and typeface size, adjust alignment, add superscripts or subscripts, and resize text or paragraphs. You edit a PDF one page at a time. For more extensive editing or to make global formatting changes across the entire document, edit the original document. Then edit, and re-create the PDF. Each text box is independent, and inserting text in one text block does not push down an adjacent text box or reflow to the next page. Outlines identify the text and images you can edit. Select the text you want to edit. Edit the text by doing one of the following: Type new text to replace the selected text, or press Delete to remove it. You can create new list items, convert an existing paragraph to a list item, convert an existing list item to a paragraph, and convert from one list type to another. Select a font, font size, or other formatting options under Format in the right pane. You can also use the advanced format options, such as line spacing, character spacing, horizontal scaling, stroke width, and color. Formatting options in the right pane Note: For legal reasons, you must have purchased a font and have it installed on your system to revise text using that font. You can edit text only if the font used for that text is installed on your system. Click outside the selection to deselect it and start over. Add or edit a numbered or bulleted list You can add items to a numbered or bulleted list, create new list items, convert an existing paragraph to a list item, convert an existing list item to a paragraph, and convert from one list type to another. Acrobat detects paragraphs and lists separately. Therefore, both paragraph and list may appear in the same bounding box while editing. After you save or save as the changed file and reopen it, the paragraph and list items are displayed in separate bounding boxes. To add or remove items from a numbered or bulleted list: You can add or remove items to the list at all nested levels using the same familiar controls that you use in MS Office. For example, press Enter at the end of a list item to insert a new row. Press Backspace to remove the new row and position the cursor back to the end of the previous list item. To create a numbered or bulleted list: Place the cursor in the document at the location where you want to add a new list. To convert an existing paragraph to a list item: To convert an existing list item to a paragraph: Select all items in the list. The appropriate list type is highlighted under Format in the right pane. Click the highlighted list type. To convert from one list type to another: Place the cursor in the list item or select all items in the list. Choose the appropriate list type bulleted or numbered under Format in the right pane. You can also use Keyboard to add a list item. Drag to define the width of the text block you want to add. For vertical text, right-click the text box, and choose Make Text Direction Vertical. The Add text tool intelligently detects the following text properties of text close to the point of click: Font name, size, and color Character, paragraph, and line spacing Horizontal scaling These text properties are automatically applied to the text that you add at the point of click. You can change the text properties using the options under Format in the right pane. To resize the text box, drag a selection handle. To move the text box, place the pointer over the line of the bounding box avoid the selection handles. When the cursor changes to Move pointer, drag the box to the new location. To maintain alignment with the other list items, press Shift as you drag. Move, rotate, or resize a text box You can move or rotate text boxes on a page. Edits are confined to the page. You cannot drag a text block to another page, or move or rotate individual characters or words within a text box. However, you can copy text boxes and paste them on another page. Resizing a text box causes the text to reflow within the new text box boundaries. It does not change the size of the text. To change the font size, see Edit or format text in a PDF. As with other text edits, resizing is limited to the current page. Text does not flow to the next page. Click the text box you want to move, rotate, or resize. A bounding box with selection handles surrounds the text box you clicked. Do any of the following: Move Place the pointer over the line of the bounding box avoid the selection handles. When the cursor changes to Move pointer, drag the box to the desired location. Hold down the Shift key as you drag to constrain the movement vertically or horizontally. Rotate Place the pointer just outside a selection handle.

When the cursor changes to the Rotation pointer , drag in the direction you want it to rotate. Resize Place the pointer over a selection handle. When the cursor changes to the Resize pointer , drag the handle to resize the text block. Add, edit, or move text on noninteractive forms or when signing Organizations sometimes provide PDF versions of their paper forms without interactive form fields called "flat forms". Use the Add Text tool on the Comment toolbar to fill in noninteractive forms or to add text to documents you need to sign. Text added with this tool is actually a comment and does not change the original PDF. Click where you want to add text. If the font isn't installed on your system, but is embedded in the PDF, you can change only the color or font size. If the font is neither installed or embedded, you can't edit any of the text. Click outside the selection to deselect it and start over.

This is an editor that comes with powerful features that allow you to edit all elements in a PDF file, including the text color. The intuitive user interface ensures that you find all the text editing tools with ease. They are all placed in a convenient panel on the right side of your screen. Go ahead and save the document and it will be saved in the colors that you chose. Many people love reading documents that have different text colors. It is not interesting to read documents that only have one text color, and this is why changing font colors is necessary. There are online tools that you can use to change the color of particular parts of the document. Using Sedja is easy and straightforward and you do not have to register at all. It is easy to use, making it very useful to anyone changing PDF text. You may also use Adobe Reader to change the color of the text of a document, but you cannot change selected parts.
