At the beginning of the twentieth century, Vienna was one of the six largest cities in the world, recently transformed by rapid industrialization, and by successive waves of immigration from various corners of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Essays by Christian Meyer, Franz Smola, Barbara Sternthal and Beate Susanne Wehr set this motley assembly of artists and craftsmen in historical and theoretical context, showing how they paved ways for the Bauhaus and De Stijl movements to come. Painter, textile and stage designer and co-conspirator with her husband Robert Delaunay of the Orphist movement, Sonia Delaunay is a heroine of early modernist art and design. Known primarily as an abstract painter and colorist, Delaunay applied her talents and theories to all areas of visual expression, including graphics, interiors, theater and film, fashion and textiles. The book features essays by Delaunay experts Matteo de Leeuw-de Monti, Matilda McQuaid and Petra Timmer, accompanied by more than paintings, drawings, designs, textiles, garments and photographs. After a brief period of study in Germany, she moved to Paris in 1918, and began painting in the Fauve style of Matisse and Derain. In 1921 she met Robert Delaunay, and together they devised a brighter version of Cubism that their friend, the poet and art critic Guillaume Apollinaire, termed Orphism. In addition to her prolific year painting career, she created brilliant textiles and fashion works for nearly three decades. In 1970, after losing an eye, Chihuly ceased to blow glass himself, though he maintains a firm hold on the artistic direction of his studio. Charles and Ray Eames literally shaped modern design during the postwar years. Prolific furniture designers, filmmakers and exhibition designers, the Eameses were also hugely influential communicators. Elsewhere, the tight screws of plough blades stack interlocked on a warehouse floor, utilitarian subjects coalescing into a heady abstract pattern. From his first days as a photographer with the backing of such greats as Tina Modotti, Edward Weston, Paul Strand and Henri Cartier-Bresson Manuel Alvarez Bravo worked over a wide range of styles and subject matter formalist abstraction, architecture, interiors, landscapes, still lifes, and portraits with a consistent focus on the landscape and social geography of Mexico. In his concise vision of his homeland, it was both a real and symbolic landscape populated with subjects detained in dream world tableaux of desire, solitude, candor and foreboding. This portfolio, culled with the help of the artist himself, and completed after his death, is full of unfamiliar abstractions, portraits, landscapes and street photography. His pace has never abated and, since then, his work has been exhibited around the world and is in the collection of nearly every major museum.
