She develops the aptitude to apologize to whomever she loses control upon realizing her shortcoming, even when she was wronged. She was talented in writing lyrics and stories. She grows up to be the head girl of the entire school by the time she is in her sixth form. Other Characters Involved in the Series It encompasses varied characters such as the reliable friend of Darrell named Sally Hope, the rebellious Gwendoline Mary Lacey, the younger sister of Darrell named Felicity Rivers, the kind and timid Mary Lou, the bright and competitive Alicia Johns, the artistic Belinda, Wilhelmina Robinson known as Bill who loved horses, the shrewd Jean, etc. The author introduces readers to Darrell in this first book as a new student who arrives at Malory Towers boarding school and many of the other important characters. Darrell feels puzzled in her first term, but very soon joins the bad company of Alicia Johns. Her first term is filled with highs and lows. A girl named Sally Hope dislikes the joyous family life of Darrell, and therefore she does not remain in good terms with Darrell. A bullying event occurs at the swimming pool at Malory Towers boarding school due to which Darrell loses temper and slaps a girl named Gwendoline Mary Lacey who was unruly. Darrell who was once admired by the other girls startles everyone due to her bad show of temper. But then she wisely handles the situation by apologizing after realizing her mistake and wins back her popularity and respect among others. During the half term, Sally continues to be infuriating causing Darrell to push her accidentally and thus she slips away. During supper time when Sally does not turn up, Darrell learns that Sally had suffered severe stomach ache and was taken to the san. She changes her attitude and tries to be kind to Mary-Lou thereafter. Very soon Darryl and Sally become friends. The end of the term contains events such as mean tricks played by Gwendoline on Mary-Lou. By the end of the term, Darrell had made two friends namely Sally and Mary-Lou, and she also performs well in her exams. Darrell gets promotion to the second form after completion of the first four terms in the first form, and she meets many new girls in North Tower. The other new girls in this form include Belinda Morris who is very good at art, Irene who is a musical mastermind and becomes a good friend of Belinda, Gwendoline who partners with Daphne Millicent Turner, Ellen whose temper causes issues in the form and Jean who attempts to sweet-talk Ellen but is ignored by her. Certain other incidents take place in this form such as Ellen falling sick and missing class followed by her efforts to take a look at the test papers prior to the exams, and jewellery and purses being robbed in North Tower by someone. At the same time, the girls notice something disturbing: Alicia begins to suspect Ellen, whom she has seen snooping about desks classrooms, and one night tells the other girls of her suspicions, despite Sally cautioning her not to. Ellen resolves that she will go out and find the exam papers that night but disturbs Darrell on her way out of the room, causing Darrell to follow her and catch her with the papers. Ellen becomes sick with worry and goes to Matron in the middle of the night, causing the girls to speculate that she has been expelled. When she believes Ellen to have been expelled, Daphne acts strangely and becomes very concerned with getting a parcel sent from the post office. Mary-Lou offers to take it for her and, unbeknown to the others, goes out on the cliff road in a gale to take the parcel. When Daphne realises what she has done she goes after her and finds Mary Lou clinging to a tree root after having been swept over the edge of a cliff. Daphne saves her life by fashioning a rope and holding onto her until help arrives. Miss Grayling gives her the option of being expelled without facing the girls or confessing to them and asking their forgiveness. The term ends happily with everyone reconciled and Mary-Lou and Daphne firm friends.

Ellen had actually all but decided not to cheat after all, but being called a thief angers her so much she decides she will go downstairs that night and look for the exam papers. She has just found the papers when she hears a noise outside, and she quickly hides in a cupboard. Enter Darrell, who had been woken up when Ellen left the dormitory. She finds Ellen, sees the exam papers and wrestles her to the floor to retrieve them. And the next day The girls think she has been expelled for stealing, so they do not ask about her. Everyone in the form is informed of this and Darrell, Sally, Belinda and Irene go to search for the parcel the next afternoon. Daphne is regarded as a heroine. When the four children find the parcel which is a box they are puzzled by its contents which include stolen purses, a brooch and a necklace. They report to Miss Grayling who She calls Daphne to her office it is revealed that Daphne is the thief and Daphne is actually from a humble background and had been lying and had also stolen things at her previous schools. She is not expelled by Miss Grayling. The decision to expel her lies with the girls who decide to give her a chance. Miss Grayling deals with her and at the end, everything is all right again and the girls look

forward to their holidays. Daphne befriends Mary Lou.
