On 5 April , in the Segovia prison break, twenty nine prisoners escape from prison, in Spain's largest prison break since the country's civil war. The majority belong to the Basque separatist group ETA.

Methods[edit] 1, U. Many escapes have been successfully conducted by inmates who have invented their own methods. Weaknesses that are found as prisoners escape are often corrected at numerous prisons around the world to prevent future escapes in a similar manner. This leads inmates to finding new ways. Since prisoners usually have a lot of time in which they are doing nothing, this gives them plenty of time to think, allowing them to devise plans and figure out ways to escape. The following are methods that have commonly been used by prisoners in escapes. In some instances, a combination of these are used. Many prisoners who are kept in their cells must find ways out of the cells. Even those who are allowed out of their cells at times still have plans that involve escape from their cells. Cell escapes occur through either the door, the window, the light, the ventilation system, by breaking down the walls, or by tunneling underground. Some prisoners have escaped by picking the locks on their cells, creating keys to their cells, sawing bars off of the doors or windows, carving away the walls, or breaking away the vent. Containment penetration[edit] Breaking down or slipping through the physical containment of the prison, including that of the cell itself or the surrounding complex. Methods include destruction of the cell or compound walls, squeezing through tight spaces, or entering off-limits areas. Prisoners often destroy their containment with homemade tools, smuggled objects, or other contraband. Most prisons are contained on the outside by one or more fences, often topped with barbed wire or razor wire. Escapees manage to scale these fences successfully or cut holes in the fences, damaging them. These fences are also watched by one or more guards from a tower, but escapees manage to pass the fence when the guard is turned away, unable to see in the dark, or sleeping on the job. Outside the fences is often a perimeter patrol conducted by an officer in a vehicle, which stands as the final line of defense. Escapees manage to evade this by studying the length of time between passes or waiting until it is on the other side or using the cover of darkness. A rare method that has been used at times involves the digging of a tunnel under the facility that exits outside the facility. Physical force[edit] Attacking guards with blunt force, homemade weapons, smuggled weapons, or weapons stolen from overtaken guards. Some escapes involve one or more inmates taking over an entire unit or section of the prison, subduing guards, and stealing weapons or other objects they can use to their advantage. Deception[edit] Deception may involve fooling one or more guards into believing the prisoner is authorized to depart prison grounds for a legitimate reason, or the prisoner disguising himself or herself as a worker or civilian who can exit prison grounds without arousing suspicion, or the creation of a ruse to mislead guards. In some escapes, inmates construct makeshift dummies to make guards believe they are in their cells, usually in bed, when they are not. This enables the inmate to gain a head start from the prison before guards discover they are actually missing. Exploitation of weaknesses[edit] Finding holes in the security of the facility, and taking advantage of them. This may include the discovery of overlooked security issues, or taking advantage of guards who are not following policies or procedures, or are otherwise not doing their jobs properly. Exploitation of corruption[edit] Taking advantage of intentional wrongdoing on part of prison staff. Failure to return[edit] Some lower security inmates are permitted to leave prison grounds temporarily on the honor they will return. These include those who depart for employment outside the facility or furloughs that allow time outside for periods of time. Escape from outside[edit] Breaking while in custody outside facility grounds. Prisoners are often transported for work duties, to be moved between facilities, attend court hearings, for hospitalization and medical appointments, and other reasons. Outside help[edit] Receiving aid from an accomplice outside prison walls, including those who provide a ride to the inmate following their penetration, smuggle in contraband as visitors, use helicopters, among other methods. When a banned item is smuggled, it can either be slipped through or tossed over the fence from outside, hidden in a gift to the inmate that is legal, or slipped past corrupt security officers. In some cases, the staff are the source of the smuggling themselves. Escape from island prisons[edit] Escaping from an island prison brings another challenge of crossing the water to free land. This can be done by construction

of a makeshift raft or receiving outside help from the owner of a boat. In the famed Alcatraz escape , a makeshift raft from raincoats was confirmed. One additional theory is that a boat was used to transport them in the water. Prevention[edit] Prevention of prison escape includes the numerous security measures that are in effect. There have been many infamous escapes throughout history: However, because he was heavy, the rope broke and as a consequence, he fell to his death. He was then smuggled outside. The Italian author and adventurer Giacomo Casanova escaped from prison in 1746. All but 50 two were drowned in the nearby James River successfully reached back to Union lines. The notorious outlaw Billy The Kid managed to escape from prison in 1880, but was captured and shot by Pat Garrett only a few months later. He enjoyed great public sympathy, including from county officials, who supposedly allowed him to escape by leaving his cell door unlocked at night. He eventually seized the opportunity, but within a few days he either gave himself up or was recaptured. Frederick Mors, an Austrian-born American serial killer, was declared insane and placed into the Matteawan Institution for the Insane in the United States in 1899. He escaped in 1901 and was never seen again. Fristoe was imprisoned for double murder in 1902 of a police Constable and a deputy Sheriff in Nevada. He lived for nearly 46 years under the alias of Claude R. Willis, before being turned in by his own son. Within four months, he was back in jail in Lima, Ohio, but his gang sprang him, killing the jailer, Sheriff Jessie Sarber. Most of the gang was captured again by the end of the year in Tucson, Arizona, due to a fire at the Historic Hotel Congress. On March 3, 1933, Dillinger escaped from the "escape-proof" as it was dubbed by local authorities at the time Crown Point, Indiana county jail, which was guarded by many police officers and national guardsmen. Newspapers reported that Dillinger had escaped using a fake gun made from wood, blackened and shined with shoe polish. After a series of daring adventures, during which all of the other escapees were captured, he reached United States in 1935. In his account, *Dry Guillotine*, was published. It went through 14 printings in less than a year. Japanese murderer Yoshie Shiratori broke out of prison four times between the 1930s and 1940s. A novel and TV-drama *Hagoku* was based on his true story. Built inside the mountain and obsolete since its opening in 1909, due to its weakness against aviation, it served as a prison. On May 22, 1937, during the Spanish Civil War, around 30 prisoners organised a mutiny for a massive prison break. Most fugitives were intercepted during the following days. In 1937, a sculpture was erected to honour the memory of the Republican people dead there. The fort ceased to be a prison in 1945. Colditz Castle was used as an "escape-proof" prisoner-of-war camp during World War II, but over the course of escape attempts, prisoners escaped. The men had tunneled, disguised themselves as guards, workmen or women, sneaked away through sewer drains, and even planned to use a glider to get over the wall. His story, *Papillon*, was published and filmed under the same name. Out of the roughly 1000 escapees, 100 died and were wounded. Sixteen of the wounded showed signs of attempted suicide. They then fled into the surrounding desert but because the rivers in Arizona were mostly dry and had not been navigable for decades, most of them were recaptured without bloodshed over the next few weeks. After 56 years he was arrested in Florida. He made his way to Istanbul, then to Greece, where he was eventually deported to the U.S. Hayes wrote a book on his experiences, *Midnight Express*, which was later adapted into the film of the same name starring Brad Davis as Hayes. The majority belong to the Basque separatist group ETA. The majority of prisoners are recaptured in shoot outs with the authorities in the next few days, during which one escapee is killed, though four manage to escape to France. In 1967, the convicted murderer of Martin Luther King, Jr. Ray was recaptured after two days. He had been running and hiding in the mountainous forest surrounding the prison. He was arrested in March 1969. No one was injured during the prison break, including the guards-turned-hostages who were left in the parking lot. In 1970, Shakur escaped to Cuba where she gained political asylum. On 2 March 1972 in Peru, PCP guerilla fighters assaulted the Ayacucho prison, resulting in the release of inmates. In the Batticaloa Jailbreak on 23 September 1977, 41 Tamil political prisoners and criminal prisoners escaped in eastern Sri Lanka. In 1979, six death row inmates escaped Mecklenburg Correctional Center, making it the largest mass death row escape in American history. All were recaptured within 18 days, and all six men would eventually be executed. The final execution took place in 1980. Police found Butterley shot dead six days later, and re-captured Gibb. Trikala, Greece, on May 23, 1981, Albanian inmates staged a daring escape from

an old Turkish administration building-turned-prison, using weight dumbbells to break the locks of the gates and bed springs as a ladder to scale the wall. In , the Belgian child molester Marc Dutroux notoriously managed to escape for a few hours. He was caught the same afternoon, but the incident forced two politicians to resign and deepened the loss of faith in the Belgian judicial system. He was found dead a few days later. They were caught within hours, before they even managed to escape prison grounds. The four men had managed the escape with the use of hacksaws that had been smuggled in for them by a bribed corrections officer. After the escape, two corrections officers were fired and two others were demoted. Martin was immediately moved to the holding cell outside the death chamber , a month before his execution in Connally Unit on December 13, Six of them were captured after over a month and a half on the run; the seventh killed himself before being captured. One of them was injured during the escape, and while trying to get back into the prison he got caught in the razor between the fences. In New York, two convicted murderers escaped from Elmira State Penitentiary in July ; both were recaptured in two days. Colton Harris-Moore fled a three-year sentence by walking out of a halfway house in April One of the largest attacks by Afghan insurgents, the raid freed prisoners. The men escaped by climbing prison pipes in a narrow space inside a wall, then using homemade instruments to cut a hole in the roof. As of October , convicted murderer Edward Salas was the only inmate still at large. Salas was taken into custody by the U. Renwick was captured in a shootout in Rifle, Colorado on August 1, Though he still had 32 years on his sentence in Arizona, he was sentenced to 60 years to be served in Colorado. Province, already a lifer, was captured on August 9, in Meeteese, Wyoming. He was sentenced to 43 years in an Arizona prison on escape, kidnap, hijacking and robbery charges. Kenneth John Gonzales , the U. Attorney in New Mexico, filed death penalty charges against all three. Both inmates had been convicted of murder. Two days later on June 28, , David Sweat was captured just miles from the Canadaâ€”US border, shot twice before taken to a local hospital. His escape involved an elaborate underground tunnel leading from the shower area in his cell stretching 1. The shower area in his cell was not detectable to the security cameras, creating a blind spot. The tunnel lay 10 meters underground and was equipped with a ladder to climb to the bottom, artificial lights, air ducts and various construction materials. An investigation and manhunt quickly followed. He was recaptured on January 8, The three inmates Jonathan Tieu, 20; Hossein Nayeri, 37; and Bac Tien Duong, 43 cut through steel bars, made their way through plumbing tunnels, and a used a makeshift rope made out of bed sheets to rappel down the multistory facility. The two inmates Mathew Baker and James Whitlock used diamond-tipped cutting equipment to break through cell bars before they scaled the perimeter wall. They left mannequins in their beds to fool the prison guards. Whitlock was found at an address in Homerton, east London, after six days on the run. In , career criminal Ralph "Bucky" Phillips used a can opener to cut a hole in a prison kitchen ceiling. When police finally caught up with him he pleaded " guilty as hell. Fake it till you make it. In , convicted killer Charles Victor Thompson slipped out of a Texas jail by changing into a set of smuggled civilian clothes and bluffing his way past guards. He told them he was a "state investigator" and flashed his prison ID. The infamous Texas Seven snuck out of a maximum-security state prison in by impersonating supervisors over the phone, among other ruses. Slow and steady wins the race and, in some cases, freedom. In , two New Jersey convicts, apparently taking inspiration from *The Shawshank Redemption* , used tools to carve holes in their cell walls and covered them with pinup posters. This might be the toughest technique of all. In March , Brian Nichols overpowered a security guard at an Atlanta courthouse and took her gun. He went on to shoot a judge, a court reporter, and a police officer before taking a woman hostage in her home. He eventually surrendered to police. Three convicted murderers escaped from an Arizona state prison in August by using wire cutters thrown over the prison fence by a woman outside. The French criminal first escaped from prison in in a helicopter hijacked by a group of friends. In , he paid it forward by helping three friends escape from the same prison—again via a helicopter. He was soon arrested and returned to prison, from which he escaped once again in —by helicopter. He was caught in Spain two months later. Not all escapes require a helicopter. But a little technology helps. According to some experts , a major threat to prison security is cell phones. In , a death row inmate in Texas used a smuggled cell phone to threaten a state legislator. Even Charles Manson was recently caught with a mobile phone. Some penitentiaries have begun installing phone-jamming systems to keep prisoners from making calls. But in the end, preventing escapes usually comes down to having enough competent officers on duty.
