

### 1: Evangelism for teen-agers. ( edition) | Open Library

*Many Christian teens feel a passion for sharing their faith with others, but many are fearful of how their friends, family, and even strangers will react if they try to share their Christian beliefs.*

Reconciliation Activities for Kids Teenagers in the throes of seeking independence generally are not inclined to pay much heed to an adult lecture on their need for God. However, when facing a problem, they do seek out and take to heart the advice of friends, making teens an often untapped resource for evangelizing through their natural relationships. Nevertheless, teens have fears and insecurities about speaking up, just like adults. So if you want to teach your teenagers how to evangelize, addressing these issues provides your youth with the social, mental, emotional and scriptural skills necessary to overcome the barriers to effective evangelism. Pastor Michael Turriff of the Mt. Train your teen with a solid foundation in the gospel basics using the Bible and real life stories to help her learn to appreciate how it applies to her everyday realities. Explain how the gospel comforts and encourages you and you want her to receive the same comfort and encouragement, just as she desires to be a loving support for her friends in turn. Share your own story and admit your need for a savior. Tell what Jesus has done for you personally, not only on the cross, but also in the circumstances of your life. Dialogue with your teen about how knowing Jesus has blessed his life. Encourage him to think of specific instances and personal stories that illustrate how God is working in his life and growing his character. Point out that these are stories he can use to share his testimony with his friends. If it would help his confidence, he can write out his personal testimony to use as a guide when sharing with others. Role-play with your teen various evangelism scenarios. Take on the role of an unbeliever of varying persuasions and let your teen practice approaching you and answering your objections or questions. If you are involved in evangelistic outreach with your church, take your teenager along to witness evangelism in action. Pastor Michael Geiger of Good Shepherd Church in Burnsville, Minnesota, suggests other venues to give teenagers an opportunity to put their evangelism skills to work in a low-key, nonthreatening environment: Tip The key to effective evangelism is to keep the doors of communication open. Asking sincere questions and giving honest compliments can help someone to open up and engage in real conversation with you about God. Whether you are the parent encouraging your teen to witness to her friends or a teen with a desire to share the good news of the gospel with your friends, communicate that you love and care for that person as a friend, mentor or role model. They are much more likely to receive and respond to your message when they feel loved, encouraged and valued as a human being. Gospel tracts can help your teen structure his message as he gains experience and confidence in his evangelism abilities.

## 2: Evangelism Resources |

*Role-play with your teen various evangelism scenarios. Take on the role of an unbeliever of varying persuasions and let your teen practice approaching you and answering your objections or questions. If you are involved in evangelistic outreach with your church, take your teenager along to witness evangelism in action.*

Telling others about Jesus Use this youth group game and lesson to challenge the way your students think about sharing Jesus with their friends. As students search for hidden treasure with no direction from their friends, they will learn how important it is to share directions to the most important treasure of all: Split the students into two groups. Choose one student from each group and pull them aside. Tell them where the treasure is, but tell them that they cannot give their teammates any hints at all. Send the surely confused students back to their groups and tell everyone to start looking for the treasure“without giving them any rules or hints to where it may be. After teams have been looking for a while, start passing out clues. For every true clue you give the students, also give them a false clue. After the students run around confused for a few minutes, eventually give them enough true clues to allow one of the groups to find the treasure. Did the false clues make it a lot harder to find what you were looking for? Teach “ Evangelism Say: What if I told you that names of students you pulled aside at the beginning knew where the treasure was the entire time? Pause and allow students to react. They even knew that some of the clues I gave you were wrong! If they had spoken up, your entire team would be enjoying candy right now! What kind of friend keeps their mouth shut when they know something that could help their friends? Sadly, a lot of you may be that kind of friend this year. You may even become close friends with some of them. If you know Jesus, you already have found the greatest treasure in the entire world. What reasons do you have to not tell your friends about Jesus? Do you agree that knowing Jesus is like having a treasure? If you think of knowing Jesus as a treasure, does that motivate you more to share him with others? It would be really easy for you to just worry about your assignments and making sure you got in with the right group. But if you did that, you would be withholding the secret to the greatest treasure there is. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field. It shows us how excited we should be over the fact that we know about Jesus and Heaven. The man in this story was so excited that he rushed to give away everything he had so he could get the treasure. I hope that after reading that verse, you will. You could be that someone. Someone needs to tell the students at your school about the greatest treasure they could ever have. Is it going to be you?

Evangelism Personal Evangelism - Teens Training Most of our students are probably not getting enough exercise. Quite simply, they are not sure what to say or how to respond when opportunity to "bear witness" arises. As teachers, we can equip students with tools that inspire confidence in handling, even pursuing such opportunities. I recommend taking students periodically through a P. Here is the general outline of a seven-week emphasis on personal evangelism: Week 1 Help students better understand what has taken place in their own salvation. They may not question it, but neither do they know how to explain it to others. Also teach them to build a strong prayer basis for their witness--depending on God to provide opportunities and the Holy Spirit to empower for action. Do NOT to communicate in "spiritual jargon," misunderstood outside of the church realm. Explain concepts such as "sin" or "saved" in plain terms like "going your own way", and "set free from the consequences of defying God. Within two or three minutes they should be able to convey honest elements of their situation before Christ; specifically how they came to trust Jesus as the answer; and how their life has changed since Christ took control. If they accepted Christ at a very early age, their main focus can be to recap their life with Christ and the difference living for Him makes. Week 3 Review elements of personal testimony and have a few students share theirs very briefly and informally. Then give great attention to helping them learn a smooth and concise presentation of the Gospel. You may outline your own or use a guide such as a tract. Although the presentation might not be as "orderly" in real life, the knowledge will give added confidence. It should lend clear yet concise explanation to sin, separation and human inadequacy; and include follow-up elements on the assurance of salvation and Christian life disciplines. Week 4 Review the Gospel presentation, giving students time to "practice" it with partners. This may seem awkward, but the tension likely reflects real life encounters. When students are comfortable with the basic presentation, plug relevant illustrations into the delivery i. Before they leave, give students key scripture passages, printed in full on a single sheet, to review and begin to memorize. General knowledge of these passages will alleviate anxiety over inability to substantiate claims with Scripture. Then help them learn to initiate conversations, establish "common ground" and make transitions that will allow them to talk about Jesus and their faith in everyday situations. Field ideas on how to turn the tide of typical conversations with statements and questions that might provoke spiritual thought and curiosity i. Practice praying for and with someone. Then review the Gospel presentation and illustrations; let them rehearse putting it all together. Conclude this session by listing tough questions and "objections" you and your students have gotten from others about God. Study these during the week and come to the final session prepared to discuss "answers" that will help students better explain and defend their faith. Week 7 Follow-up on last weeks questions, preparing students to respond to challenges that may surface during a witnessing encounter such as:

### 5: How to Teach Teenagers How to Evangelize | Healthfully

*This Bible lesson will teach children about the spiritual discipline of evangelism. Sometimes we forget that children can speak God's truth, even better than grown-ups. (See Matthew ) Telling others about Jesus is also a key for kids to grow in their own faith.*

That means that you and I must teach evangelism regularly and often! This means we should be teaching them early, often, and by example. Get these object lessons ready! For this object lesson, you need several copies of a small paper doll. The doll should look like Jesus. Use this Jesus coloring page if you need a printable. Cut them out and place them on a table near your teaching area. Read some verses or ask the kids to read verses about sharing the good news. I recommend John 3: Hand a child a paper doll. Who is going to tell someone that Jesus loves them? Before you present this object lesson, purchase several rolls of heart-shaped stickers. Tear off sections of 3 to 5 stickers and set them to the side. God is so amazing. But, most people will not know that God wants to live in their hearts unless we tell them. This heart means that someone told me about Jesus. Has anyone told you about Jesus? If so, raise your hand. Explain that he takes away our sins. I want to send you home with some of these stickers but before you give them away, you have to tell your friend about Jesus. Can you do that? As a youth leader, you can help unleash them for this grand cause by incorporating these simple evangelism training components into your youth ministry. So find a clear, simple way for your teens to learn how to share the core essentials of the gospel message. You can choose whatever works best for you. But whatever you use, make sure it presents the full message of the gospel. This key will also help your teens understand and internalize their own faith at a deeper level. Equip your teens to reach their friends with an evangelism strategy that is relational and relentless. Once your teens know how to explain the message of the gospel, give them an intentional strategy for reaching their friends. How do they begin this evangelism journey with their friends? Challenge your teens to pray for their friends daily, to pursue them spiritually – serve them, love them, and bring God up in conversations, and to persuade them to consider Christ and His message. Persuade means to convince someone in a loving way. Create an evangelism story telling culture in your youth ministry. Take a few minutes weekly in your youth group to make evangelism an ongoing priority. Then challenge other teens to do the same. This will help to make evangelism a priority every week so it becomes part of the DNA of your youth group. Then encourage them to come back and tell about it. The Book of Acts is an evangelistic story telling book and we should be continuing that story on and on! Finally, take a minute or two out of each meeting to tell the greatest story ever – the gospel. When you present the gospel regularly, it helps your students see how to do it and how important it is.
