

## 1: Everyday Evangelism - Evangelism Explosion

*Excerpt from Every-Day Evangelism: Personal, Trained, Co-Operative The remedy for all this is a new spiritual movement, a gracious re-inspiration of the Church, such as God effected through the Wesleys and their helpers.*

Of all of the people you would like to win to Christ, which one is most important to you? My bet is that your answer is a member of your family! Sometimes I observe that people are nicer to those outside their family than they are to their family. Does that make any sense? In this lesson we will look at how we can be a witness to our family, and then consider whether those principles are the same for personal witnessing to those around us. Attitude Adjustment Read 1 Peter 2: Are you and I called to take a beating? That is what the text says! Actually, it says we are called to "endure" when we take a beating for doing good. Read 1 Peter 2: Why are we called to take a beating? Because Jesus, as our example, took a beating for our sins! His wounds healed us. Read 1 Peter 3: What does Peter mean when he says, "in the same way? This hits a very open nerve for me and many others. When I hear of a man who beats his wife or children, I feel like punching him. Men who beat or abuse their wives are despicable worms. If you attack someone who cannot fight back, like your wife, your children, your employees, your subordinates or the wait staff at the restaurant, you are a bully. How can Peter suggest that wives take a beating? Re-read 1 Peter 2: Why was Jesus beaten? He bore our sins. He was the Lamb of God. Was Jesus regularly being beaten during His life? He was only beaten at the end. When Peter writes, "in the same way be submissive to your husbands," would this mean enduring regular beatings? That is not what Jesus suffered. More importantly, Jesus had a very important goal in mind, saving us. If a wife took a beating to save her husband, then I would see a parallel. But, if a wife takes a beating just to be beaten, then this is not "in the same way! I think that is the attitude which Peter is urging. With this background, what is Peter saying about beauty, jewelry, hairstyles and clothing? He is saying true beauty comes from having the same attitude towards your husband that Jesus has towards us. What is this text saying about Sarah and jewelry? If Abraham is giving jewelry to his future daughter-in-law, it seems unlikely that his wife does not wear jewelry. Instead, this confirms that Peter is talking about the importance of beauty coming from attitude, rather than adornment. What might our jewelry say about our attitude towards others? Most of what is called "jewelry" in America today is not. It is cheap metal and plastic that anyone can afford. Personal Family Evangelism So far we have seen that a wife should witness to her husband by having a self-sacrificing attitude. What kind of attitude is required from a husband who wants to witness to his wife? Notice that Peter starts out, "in the same way. The same way that Jesus gave up His life for us. The same way that a wife is unselfish with her husband. Husbands have a "same way" obligation. What is required of husbands? Peter tells husbands to be considerate and respectful. Paul tells them to love their wives. The direction against being "harsh," is clearly a prohibition against hitting the wife. What attitude should parents have towards their children? Nothing the parent does should make the child bitter or exasperated. I think the same kind of self-sacrificing attitude that Jesus has towards us is the best evangelism tool for members of our family, including our children. Personal Community Evangelism Read 1 Peter 2: What is important to evangelizing the world? Does this mean that pagans will not charge us with wrong-doing? They will make false accusations, but we prove them wrong by our deeds. What attitude are we to have towards the world? We submit ourselves to authority. We show by our lives that God is to be praised. As you consider what we have discussed, is there a common thread for evangelizing our family and evangelizing the world? The common thread is self-denial. Your life should bless others. How does this compare with the attitude of the world? The world pursues self-aggrandizement. Christians get the attention of those around them by being the opposite of the world. An "opposite" that blesses those around you. That nudges them towards the reason for your attitude. An Example Read John 1: John the Baptist is speaking about Jesus. What witness does John give about Jesus? That Jesus is the Son of God. What motivated these two disciples to seek to learn more about Jesus? To tell a family member about Jesus. Instead of staying with Jesus longer, Andrew seeks out his brother to share the good news. Assume that Nathanael said this about your important discovery. What is the self-important answer? To argue with Nathanael to show him that you are right. Instead, Philip simply says, "Come and see.

We can assume that Jesus also knew what Nathanael said. How would you like it if someone said to you "Nothing good comes from your family, town, etc? Instead of saying something positive about Himself or something negative about Nathanael, what does Jesus say? Instead of thinking of the personal insult, Jesus lifts up Nathanael. How well does the self-denial approach to evangelism work? Nathanael is immediately converted. Is Jesus telling us that "magic" converted Nathanael instead of self-denial? Jesus approach to Nathanael was to focus on him. Friend, are you focused on others, or focused on yourself? To reach the lost and teach the found to reach the lost. I have spoken about evangelism to groups from Tauranga, New Zealand to Amsterdam. This is my calling and passion. It is what I try to do with most of my days and hours, but I have to admit that doing evangelism is still difficult. We all believe in the Great Commission and most of us are committed to follow this call of Jesus, but it is just plain hard. We drift off course. The next thing we know, our lives and churches are doing lots for believers and our focus on the lost fades. After encountering thousands of pastors, elders, staff members and church leaders from around the globe, I have seen the same three obstacles to evangelism surface over and over again. When a church mobilizes to equip believers to share their faith, it is a declaration of war. But when believers are prepared, passionate and engaged in evangelism, the demons arm for battle. Because of this spiritual reality, many churches stop reaching out and engaging in intentional evangelism. Our Enemy will seek to destroy us, our family and our church, and will pull no punches. If we do not recognize and identify his tactics, we will find ourselves quickly sidelined and discouraged. We will spend our time doing the easy things, but not what is most important. Instead we must fight the good fight. We must arm ourselves with the Word of God and immerse ourselves in the truth of the Scripture. To do this, we need to open the Bible daily and teach others to do the same. When Jesus faced the Enemy in the wilderness, he quoted the Bible in the face of each temptation. We also need to pray in power against the tactics and activity of the Enemy. In the name of Jesus, because of the victory of the cross and the resurrection, we can resist the Devil and watch him flee. We must live each moment profoundly aware that God, who is in us by his Holy Spirit, is greater than our Enemy who is in this world. If we are going to share the love, grace and message of Jesus and call others in the church to do the same, prayer will be a weapon we must wield every day. I would also suggest you develop a prayer team around you and your church. If you are going to stand strong and enter the spiritual battle, you will need a consistent team of prayer warriors at your side. Give them fresh prayer needs on a regular basis and keep them praying. We can even be timid about walking with people toward the Savior, having spiritual conversations and telling stories about our own relationship with Jesus. More and more, followers of Jesus are nervous to say they love and follow the Savior because of the dishonest caricature of Christians that is often portrayed in the media. Admit your fear, name it and stand in faith. A pastor will pull me aside after an Organic Outreach Intensive or training event and admit their secret fear of sharing their faith. They confess their personal sorrow about never or rarely giving an invitation for people to respond to the gospel. I will lead my church in a new way. I am ready to learn how to lead an evangelistic movement in my church and live it in my life. When Christians declare their desire to engage in the evangelistic mission of Jesus and name their personal fears, something changes. As each fear comes into the light of Jesus, it melts, shrinks and pales in comparison to the power and glory of our Savior. Faith can flood in. We can strategize ways to confront our fear with action. Even when an evangelistic encounter or conversation is hard, it is always worth it. Our faith grows as we are faithful to the call of Jesus. We are expected to do this in a respectful and gentle manner, but the problem is most Christians have no idea how to articulate their faith. We have not thought through how we can tell our story of faith or the story of Jesus in a way that is organic and compelling. Unfortunately, too many pastors have never trained their congregation in the basics of organic outreach. So, people simply do not do it. Get equipped for the work of outreach. It is easier to stay uninformed and unengaged when it comes to evangelism. But, we must refuse this enticement. Commit to be prepared for daily outreach encounters and engagements. Read a practical and down-to-earth book about how to share faith naturally. I would suggest Organic Outreach for Ordinary People. If you are a preacher, commit to doing a three-week preaching series every year through which you equip your congregation to share faith naturally. Practice sharing your testimony of how you became a follower of Jesus. Do this with other Christians to get warmed up, then share

your story with people you know who are not yet followers of Jesus. Go over it until the words are natural and the message is embedded in your heart. Get prepared, because God is ready to send someone your way who is open, hungry and longing for more in life. You have what they needâ€”or better yet, whom they need. You have met the one who is the way, the truth, and the lifeâ€”share him freely.
