3: Feng Shui in Chinese Architecture and Interior Design - China Underground

Origins[edit] As of [update] the Yangshao and Hongshan cultures provide the earliest known evidence for the use of feng shui. Until the invention of the magnetic compass , feng shui apparently relied on astronomy to find correlations between humans and the universe. The late Yangshao site at Dadiwan c. In some of the cases, as Paul Wheatley observed, [15] they bisected the angle between the directions of the rising and setting sun to find north. This technique provided the more precise alignments of the Shang walls at Yanshi and Zhengzhou. Rituals for using a feng shui instrument required a diviner to examine current sky phenomena to set the device and adjust their position in relation to the device. These consist of a lacquered , two-sided board with astronomical sightlines. The earliest examples of liuren astrolabes have been unearthed from tombs that date between BC and BC. Along with divination for Da Liu Ren [17] the boards were commonly used to chart the motion of Taiyi through the nine palaces. A feng shui ruler a later invention may also be employed.

Foundational concepts[edit] Definition and classification[edit] The goal of feng shui as practiced today is to situate the human-built environment on spots with good qi, an imagined form of "energy". The "perfect spot" is a location and an axis in time. A traditional explanation of qi as it relates to feng shui would include the orientation of a structure, its age, and its interaction with the surrounding environment, including the local microclimates , the slope of the land, vegetation, and soil quality. Wu Yuanyin [25] Qing dynasty said that vital qi was "congealed qi", which is the state of qi that engenders life. The goal of feng shui is to take advantage of vital qi by appropriate siting of graves and structures. Often people with good karma live in land with good qi. Polarity expressed through yin and yang is similar to a magnetic dipole. That is, it is of two parts: Yang acting and yin receiving could be considered an early understanding of chirality. They play a very important part in Chinese thought: This and the Yellow River Chart Hetu, sometimes associated with the Earlier Heaven bagua are linked to astronomical events of the sixth millennium BC, and with the Turtle Calendar from the time of Yao. And it is this area of China that is linked to Yellow Emperor Huangdi who allegedly invented the south-pointing spoon see compass. The literature of ancient China, as well as archaeological evidence, provide some idea of the origins and nature of the original feng shui techniques.

Form School[edit] The Form School is the oldest school of feng shui. The Form School was originally concerned with the location and orientation of tombs Yin House feng shui , which was of great importance. The "form" in Form School refers to the shape of the environment, such as mountains, rivers, plateaus, buildings, and general surroundings. It considers the five celestial animals phoenix, green dragon, white tiger, black turtle, and the yellow snake , the yin-yang concept and the traditional five elements Wu Xing: The Form School analyses the shape of the land and flow of the wind and water to find a place with ideal qi.

Compass School[edit] The Compass School is a collection of more recent feng shui techniques based on the eight cardinal directions , each of which is said to have unique qi. It uses the Luopan , a disc marked with formulas in concentric rings around a magnetic compass.

Transmission of traditional feng shui techniques[edit] Aside from the books written throughout history by feng shui masters and students, there is also a strong oral history. In many cases, masters have passed on their techniques only to selected students or relatives. Therefore, modern practitioners of feng shui generally draw from multiple schools in their own practices.

Aspirations Method[edit] The Eight Life Aspirations style of feng shui is a simple system which coordinates each of the

eight cardinal directions with a specific life aspiration or station such as family, wealth, fame, etc. Life Aspirations is not otherwise a geomantic system.

4: Feng Shui for House Layout, 17 Feng Shui Tips for Good Home Design Plan

In the last two decades, Architects' clients demand Feng Shui to be adopted in their building projects. In some ways they ask the architect to include Feng Shui concept embedded in the design when the design is almost finish.

Even a basic review of Feng Shui reveals an intricate and sometimes contradictory language of design. In fact, for this post, we had a difficult time even finding a common definition of Feng Shui. In the spirit of forward progress, we borrowed from a variety of sources and produced our own definition – one that relates to our use of Feng Shui and with any luck keeps relatively true to its fundamental ideals. It is based on a belief in patterns of Yin and Yang and the flow of energies Chi that have positive and negative effects. The practice commonly influences orientation, placement, or arrangement. While we greet some principles of Feng Shui with skepticism, the placement of a three-legged toad statue in the entry vestibule, for instance, we admire others for their direct and understandable value to physical design. These beliefs typically relate to what seems healthy and sensible to us as architects. Orienting the bed to face south-east is a good example, as it has a clear relationship with a natural way to awake in harmony with nature. Academics may take issue with our rudimentary understanding of Feng Shui, our selective use of its principles, or our tailored definition. This post is not intended to cover the philosophy of Feng Shui or address the complexity of the complete Feng Shui design process. These items are usually requested by savvy clients who are versed in the guidelines of Feng Shui. More often than not, we find that these 10 principles of Feng Shui dovetail nicely with Pacific Northwest modernism and the philosophy of Scandinavian design that have so heavily influenced our own thinking. The ideal house proportion is square, followed by rectangular. These geometries make for highly functional relationships between interior spaces, energy efficient plans, and the application of practical building materials. The front entry should be clean, unencumbered and well maintained. The entry area should be free of trash bins, yard tools and other distractions. House numbers should be clearly visible and preferably in a font like Century Gothic, Helvetica or Neutra okay, we might have made up that last part. The entry area is the face of the house, you pass it several times each day and it is the first thing that greets visitors: The quality of the entry door determines the quality of the energy entering the home. Ideally, doors should be solid and should open in. The front door can become a feature of the home with the use of a bright color red seems to be preferable. Areas of rest should be kept separate from areas of work. A home office should be distinct from living or sleeping areas. There should be a place for everything to be stored and rooms should be clutter free. Clutter in the home restricts the flow of positive energy and results in cluttered thinking. A tidy, well organized home fosters a calm and relaxed environment. Get rid of unused items. As a simple matter of home maintenance, items that are unused evoke bad energy and should be removed. Promote natural ventilation and an abundance of daylight inside the house. Large floor to ceiling windows maintain a maximum amount of natural daylight while operable windows in the right locations allow for excellent natural ventilation. Beds should face south-east so that the process of sleeping and waking are in harmony with nature. While the fundamentals of Feng Shui link the direction of the bed with your Kua number and what you are trying to achieve in life wealth, love, happiness, we find that most people simply enjoy waking up with the sun. Avoid sharp corners or protruding objects pointing toward areas of rest. This includes beds, the dining room table, the sofa, etc. Designing with simple squares and rectangles typically compliments this principle see 1. The center of a house should be empty to let the energy circulate properly. This works well with the circulation of a house and it allows common areas to share common square footage. Front Entry The front entry is the space which is visible by the people at maximum, so this area should evoke positive energy, the house number should be clearly visible. The entry should be kept clean and should be wide open. Bright colors should be used in the entrance gate. Zoning Areas should be separated on the basis of its workability like Area of rest should be kept away from working areas. Offices in houses should be isolated from the core residential area. Get Rid of Unused Items The area should be free from unwanted items as it blocks the space. Areas should be kept open with necessary items which lead to positivity in your house. Promote Ventilation Every building should have proper natural sunlight, low sill windows, and openable windows at the proper location to allow natural ventilation. Bed Placement A bed should be kept in the south-east direction to provide proper sleep and be in harmony with nature. Central Space The center space in feng-shui should be kept open to circulate positive energy into the house.

January 16, Happy New Year! This is the first blog post of the year. I have been helping a university student doing her final year thesis assignment on feng shui and design, here are three interesting questions that she asked me with my reply. Please feel free to make your comments, since your input will help her broaden our understanding of feng shui and design as well. Three things have influenced me to apply feng shui into my design: I think the more complex our society becomes and faster it is moving, modern architecture needs to be more simple and slow down to compensate for the imbalance and feng shui can help us to achieve this. Further, the whole is anticipated when the parts are not integrated or complete. Gestalt psychology tries to understand the laws of our ability to acquire and maintain stable percepts in a noisy world. Gestalt psychologists stipulate that perception is the product of complex interactions among various stimuli. This holistic approach may not produce a feng shui style but it has a feng shui depth to it and it is basic to all good design. Feng shui works when it is practically efficient and ritually correct at the same time. This is the criterion that we use to judge the result of our feng shui architecture and built-forms, including interior and graphic designs. Feng shui becomes superstitious when the practitioner fails to understand the basic principles involved and how these principles are applied in technical applications. For example, the principle of Yin and Yang is not fixed; their technical application depends on the context of the situation and the reference point used. A mountain can be considered yin or yang compared to water, it depends on whether we are looking at it from a height point of view or from an activity point of view and so forth. But I hope in the near future, when a new generation of Chinese designers learns to appreciate their own culture and they will look to feng shui for a unique source of inspiration, things will change. In a few of the modern designs that we can see coming out from China, like the works by Atelier Feichang Jianzhu Beijing and Amateur Architecture Studio Hangzhou, I think the days are not far off.
