The President of the Republic has decreed that every World War II veteran who has fought under enemy fire on French soil is eligible for this distinction. How is the Legion of Honor awarded? The Legion of Honor medal can be given by other members of the Order or by French ambassadors stationed in a foreign country. The Legion of Honor can be granted at a large ceremony or a small gathering with family and friends. It is a solemn and official event to honor the recipient, and to recognize their bravery and sacrifice in the name of freedom. How can a veteran apply to receive the Legion of Honor? Upon presentation of their military file, US veterans who risked their life during World War II fighting on French territory may be awarded this distinction. Those selected are appointed to the rank of Knight of the Legion of Honor. The Legion of Honor medal is not awarded posthumously. To be eligible to this outstanding award, the veteran must fit strict criteria: Interested veterans of all branches of the armed forces must have fought in at least one of the 4 main campaigns of the Liberation of France: Normandy, Provence, Ardennes or Northern France. Actions having taken place in Belgium, Germany, Italy or any other neighboring European countries are not taken into consideration. The file presented must contain: If possible, the file must also contain: This is especially important for decorations that were not shown in the discharge document at the time of separation. To be considered, these citations must have been issued during WWII or the close aftermath, and must relate to events outstanding actions, wounds, having been made prisoner, evasions, having taken action with the resistance, etc. This only includes ground, airspace and coastal waters. How does the selection process work? If the file meets the criteria, it is sent to the Legion of Honor committee in Paris. The Legion of Honor committee approves or rejects the candidate after appropriate review of his file. This process does not involve an application. The process can take several months. The Legion of Honor is the highest French decoration and one of the most famous in the world. For two centuries, it has been presented on behalf of the Head of State to reward the most deserving citizens in all fields of activity. What is its purpose? As an honor, the Legion of Honor does not include any actual material or financial benefit. However, it is an invaluable source of pride for the recipients and their families and an example of civic service made public. Any French citizen with no criminal record, who has demonstrated outstanding merits in the service of the nation, in a military or a civilian capacity. Twenty years of activity at least are required to qualify for the Legion of Honor. How many have received it? The Legion of Honor has 93, members. Some foreigners can be awarded this honor every year but, unlike French nationals, they are not members of the Legion of Honor. Can one apply for it? The Legion of Honor cannot be applied for. French ministers are responsible for identifying potential honorees, relying on the societal network parliamentarians, mayors, employers, leaders of trade unions or non-profit organizations, presidents of professional or sports federations Can it be turned down? Some people express their objection in principle to the Legion of Honor though they have not received it. In their case, we cannot speak of refusal. Turning down the Legion of Honor implies prior admittance to the Order, by decree published in the Official Journal. In this very rare case of refusal, the relevant individuals choose not to receive the decoration. Can it be taken away? The honor can be revoked in the event of criminal conviction, or any action that is dishonorable or that may harm the interests of France. The exclusion measure is announced by decree. What does it look like? The color of the ribbon is red. The badge is a five-armed Maltese asterisk hung on an oak and laurel wreath. On the obverse is the effigy of the Republic and on the reverse two tricolor flags surrounded by the motto "Honneur et Patrie" Honor and Fatherland. When and how is it worn? The Legion of Honor is worn before any other French or foreign insignia, on the left-hand side. On informal attire, one wears lapel insignia ribbon or rosette. Pendants and small-size decorations are preferred for official ceremonies. The military has its own rules for wearing insignia. How is it evolving? The Legion of Honor belongs to its time and adapts to changes in society. It recognizes more and more the role of non-profit organizations end employees, the life achievements of persons of modest origins, and the place of women through strict gender parity in each civilian awardees class.
