

## 1: Fourth of July – Independence Day - HISTORY

*July 14 is the 14th day of the year (15th in leap years) in the Gregorian calendar. There are 251 days remaining until the end of the year.*

July 14th in France, often called Bastille Day among English speakers, marks the anniversary of the storming of the Bastille fortress in Paris, a key kick-off point for the French Revolution. The excitement on the streets of towns, cities and villages across the country will be palpable so definitely make the most of it. At 10am at the Arc de Triomphe, drums and trumpets will announce the arrival of President Emmanuel Macron. This principle of equal citizenship was at the core of the Republican vision for post-Civil War America. In , the Supreme Court set out its own racialist vision of American identity in the infamous Dred Scott v. Candidate Abraham Lincoln campaigned against the decision in and Two months later, Congress included birthright citizenship in its proposed Fourteenth Amendment. The only relevant exception today given that Native Americans no longer live in the same kind of tribal regime that existed in the s is for those who owe their allegiance to another sovereign, such as the children of foreign diplomats. The Citizenship Clause also marked an important shift in American identity. The Citizenship Clause flipped this troubling script. Rather than deferring to the racist citizenship determinations of individual states, the Fourteenth Amendment made Americans citizens of the nation, first and foremost, and established a simple national rule for citizenship: By its own terms, the Citizenship Clause is not expressly limited to the relationship between citizens and governments; it can also be understood as having implications for the relationship between citizens themselves in certain situationsâ€”for example, in certain prominent public spaces, even if these public spaces are not, strictly speaking, owned by the government. Under this equal-birth principle, the government may regulate its citizens in numerous ways using all sorts of legal distinctionsâ€”for example, between wage earners and dividend earners in the tax code, or between opticians and ophthalmologists in medical regulations. But government may not penalize or degrade anyone born on American soil simply because he or she was born the wrong wayâ€”because, say, he was born black or she was born female, or he was born out of wedlock, or she was born gay. This birth-equality principle stood in sharp contrast with the infamous Black Codes that many ex-Confederate states had enacted after the Civil War. These lawsâ€”the paradigm evils that the Fourteenth Amendment was designed to eradicateâ€”degraded African Americans simply because they were born with dark skin, reducing them to the status of second-class citizens. Furthermore, Dred Scott itself situated citizenship in a broader contextâ€”defined not just by official state action, but also social meaning and practice. The Reconstruction Congress passed several laws along these lines; however, the Supreme Court struck down some of them, reading the Fourteenth Amendment as only reaching actions by state governments. Read the full discussion here. In the end, the Citizenship Clause is one of the richest single sentences in the entire Constitution, rivalling the Preamble in both theoretical depth and breadth. Here are just some of the many extraordinary things done by this extraordinary sentence: Second, the sentence establishes the priority of national citizenship; no matter what a state might say, anyone born in America under the American flag is an American. Third, the sentence requires a state to treat any American who chooses to reside in that state as a full and equal state citizen. The sentence thus makes emphatically clear that there is a right of any American to move to and remain in any state, no matter what a state might prefer. Fourth, the sentence in tandem with the sentence that follows affirms that an American citizen is entitled to all the basic civil rightsâ€”the privileges and immunitiesâ€”of citizenship against both state and federal governments. Seventh, and related, this birth equality idea clearly condemns a racial caste system in which light-skinned children are born lords and dark-skinned children are born serfs. Eighth, the sentence goes far beyond race by condemning all sorts of other birth-based caste-like systems improperly exalting some and improperly degrading others because of birth status. The sentence thus explains why certain types of birth-based governmental discrimination are suspect laws based on race or sex or sexual orientation or illegitimacy whereas most other kinds of governmental line-drawing say, between opticians and ophthalmologists should not be viewed with comparable skepticism. Ninth, the sentence focuses our attention on place, not parentage. Unlike the law of many European countries, in America the key issue of constitutional citizenship is based on the law of the soil, not the law of blood. The issue is where one was born, not to whom. Anyone born in America under the American flag is a citizen, even if his parents are not citizens and indeed even if his parents are not here legally. Yet Reconstruction Republicans in Congress doubtless were aware that some antebellum slaves had

been smuggled into America illegally, in violation of various nineteenth congressional laws prohibiting transatlantic slave importation. In multiple cases decided in the late nineteenth and the late twentieth century, the Supreme Court has recognized only three narrow exceptions to birthright citizenship: Anyone born on American soil under the American flag is an American.

You are effeminate, vacillating, will-less; you tremble at the sight of a musket. Enough of vice, enough of stupidity, enough of cowardice! Band yourselves together, strike from your midst all who are false to the cause, purify your minds, and gird your loins. Oh, my fellow citizens, I tell you these truths a little harshly, perhaps, but it is because I love you!

### 6: Dominican Life on Lotus Lane: Fourteenth of July???

*Highlights of this day in history: Bastille prison stormed during the French Revolution; Outlaw 'Billy the Kid' gunned down; Richard Speck murders student nurses in Chicago; Mariner 4 probe flies.*

This year marks the th anniversary of the ratification of the Fourteenth Amendment. The last of the 28 states needed to approve it acted on July 9, and Secretary of State William Henry Seward formally announced the ratification on July . It was a momentous event, a change to our constitutional system so fundamental that historians have put it on a par with the ratification of the original Constitution itself. In many ways, it gave Americans a new constitution. On the most basic level, the Fourteenth Amendment set the terms for the restoration of the Union of the states after the Civil War. The second section revised the way representation in Congress was apportioned, aligning representation more closely with the voting population. Unless that was changed, southerners would gain representation in Congress and therefore the Electoral College by virtue of the emancipation of their slaves they had so strongly resisted, even though they did not allow African Americans to vote or hold office. The third section disqualified anyone who had previously taken an oath to support the Constitution but then had joined the rebellion from holding state or federal office. The disqualification could be removed only by a two-thirds vote of Congress. The fourth section forbade payment of any of the debts Confederates had incurred during the insurrection. The fifth section empowered Congress to enforce the other sections by appropriate legislation. Protesters carry a sign highlighting the promise of equal protection to all people under the Fourteenth Amendment. But by far the most important was the first section. That section carried forward the implications of the Thirteenth Amendment that had abolished slavery. It declared all persons born in the United States and subject to its jurisdiction to be citizens of the United States and the states where they resided. And it barred states from abridging the rights of citizens; depriving any person of life, liberty, or property without due process of law; or denying the any person the equal protection of the laws. The first section of the Fourteenth Amendment revolutionized the constitutional system in three ways. First, it made citizens of everyone born in the United States, except Indians subject to tribal rather than U. Congress did not make all Indians citizens until National Archives of the United States Second, the Amendment for the first time set general national standards that the states had to meet when establishing and enforcing state laws. Third, the Fourteenth Amendment was phrased in a way that enabled state and federal courts to intervene when its provisions were violated. Over time, this third change has proved particularly important for our system. A map showing states that ratified the Fourteenth Amendment, and when. Before the Civil War, state and federal courts were quite reluctant to rule laws unconstitutional. They were especially reluctant to do so to protect individuals and minority groups from hostile majorities. The Supreme Court had said it would intervene directly against state laws only when they violated expressly stated constitutional prohibitions. Moreover, it mandated that that courts intervene to protect very vaguely defined rights. What constitutes due process? When does a state law or action deny equal protection? Inevitably, judges would have to decide what the concepts meant. Furthermore, these were rights of individuals to due process and minority groups to equal protection that the courts had never shown much interest in safeguarding. A fourth change could have been even more momentous. The fifth section, which empowered Congress to enforce the Amendment by appropriate legislation, applied to the first section as well as the others. There is evidence that the framers of the Amendment intended Congress to be as active, or even more active, than the courts in protecting individual and minority rights. It did not delegate power to counteract private denial of rights. It has been easier to argue that denial of rights inhibits interstate commerce than to rely on the Fourteenth Amendment. The proposed Fourteenth Amendment was very controversial. President Andrew Johnson, the Tennessee loyalist who succeeded Abraham Lincoln as president, fought it tooth and nail as did Northern Democrats. President Andrew Johnson left , and a message he sent to Congress

in June , voicing his displeasure with the Fourteenth Amendment as it was being sent to the states for ratification right Library of Congress. White southerners resisted almost unanimously. Only after northern voters backed Republicans overwhelmingly in the congressional elections and after Republican congressmen made ratification a condition for the restoration of any southern state, did they acquiesce. For a long time, judges remained reluctant to undertake their new role. They distinguished between the broad rights associated with state citizenship and the limited rights associated with federal citizenship, saying the Amendment protected only the latter. They ruled that reasonable discriminations based on race did not deprive anyone of equal protection of the laws. Business people demanded judicial protection from laws and government actions that infringed on property rights. The courts began protecting property rights as early as the s and s. Black Americans and their sympathizers demanded that the courts protect equal rights. When state and federal laws suppressed criticism of the government during World War I , progressive lawyers and others formed civil liberties organizations to demand freedom of speech and the press. Civil libertarians called on the courts to protect people from the excesses of the Red Scare of and the Ku Klux Klan in the s. The courts began to look to the Fourteenth Amendment to find the protections for due process and equal rights they now wanted to enforce. Library of Congress Slowly, they interpreted the Fourteenth Amendment to impose on the states most of the rights listed in the Bill of Rights. In the seventy-plus years since, state and federal courts have extended the principle to age and gender discrimination, aided by supportive state and federal legislation. Library of Congress By the late twentieth century Americans accorded the courts, and especially the United States Supreme Court, a special, primary role in the protection of civil rights and equality before the law. We now consider such judicial review of government action a central part of the American constitutional system. It has proven influential around the worldâ€”so much so that giving courts this central responsibility is often considered an essential element of any constitutional system that respects the rule of law. Perhaps the world would have reached that conclusion without the American example. But it would not have had that example without the ratification of the Fourteenth Amendment.

The Bastille was a fortress-prison in Paris which had often held people jailed on the basis of lettres de cachet literally "signet letters", arbitrary royal indictments that could not be appealed and did not indicate the reason for the imprisonment. The Bastille held a large cache of ammunition and gunpowder, and was also known for holding political prisoners whose writings had displeased the royal government, and was thus a symbol of the absolutism of the monarchy. As it happened, at the time of the attack in July there were only seven inmates, none of great political significance. However, possibly because of a misunderstanding, fighting resumed. The aim of this celebration, one year after the Storming of the Bastille, was to symbolise peace. The event took place on the Champ de Mars, which was at the time far outside Paris. A mass was celebrated by Talleyrand, bishop of Autun. After the end of the official celebration, the day ended in a huge four-day popular feast and people celebrated with fireworks, as well as fine wine and running nude through the streets in order to display their great freedom. Origin of the present celebration[ edit ] Claude Monet, Rue Montorgueil, Paris, Festival of 30 June On 30 June, a feast was officially arranged in Paris to honour the French Republic the event was commemorated in a painting by Claude Monet. The Assembly voted in favour of the proposal on 21 May and 8 June. The law was made official on 6 July, and the Ministry of the Interior recommended to Prefects that the day should be "celebrated with all the brilliance that the local resources allow". In the debate leading up to the adoption of the holiday, Henri Martin, chairman of the French Senate, addressed that chamber on 29 June. This [latter] day cannot be blamed for having shed a drop of blood, for having divided the country. It was the consecration of the unity of France Whatever difference which might part us, something hovers over them, it is the great images of national unity, which we all desire, for which we would all stand, willing to die if necessary. This is a popular event in France, broadcast on French TV, and is the oldest and largest regular military parade in Europe. Smaller military parades are held in French garrison towns, including Toulon and Belfort, with local troops. The market takes place on Kampa Island, it is usually between 11 and 14 July. On the day, uniformed war soldiers march through the street to honor the French soldiers who were killed in the battles. One can perceive French and the [Indian flag] flying alongside that project the mishmash of cultures and heritages. Many members of the French community in Ireland take part in the festivities. Boston has a celebration annually, hosted by the French Cultural Center for 40 years. The celebration includes francophone musical performers, dancing, and French cuisine. Carondelet also began hosting an annual saloon crawl to celebrate Bastille Day in A concert with Jean Michel Jarre on the Place de la Concorde in Paris was the first concert to have one million attendees. The military parade was opened by Eurocorps, a newly created European army unit including German soldiers. This was the first time German troops paraded in France since, as a symbol of Franco-German reconciliation. A concert with Jarre was held at the Eiffel Tower in Paris. Two days after the French football team became World Cup champions, huge celebrations took place nationwide. To commemorate the centenary of the Entente Cordiale, the British led the military parade with the Red Arrows flying overhead. To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Treaty of Rome, the military parade was led by troops from the 26 other EU member states, all marching at the French time. To commemorate the th anniversary of the beginning to the First World War, representatives of 80 countries who fought during this conflict were invited to the ceremony. The military parade was opened by 76 flags representing each of these countries.
