

## 1: Friendship Day Crafts

We can take some time during these activities to teach the kids HOW a friend acts and behaves. This theme page is filled with preschool activities and ideas for all areas of your classroom. Let the Theme Planning Begin! You can scroll down through this page to see all of the preschool lesson plans for your theme. Looking for a Valentines Day Theme to go along with Friendship? A large piece of sturdy paper with a circle drawn on it; several different colors of fingerpaint. Have the children make hand prints ONLY on the drawn circle. When dry, have the children print their names as best they can in the middle. Label your sign "We are a Circle of Friends at Preschool"! Togetherness Friendship Flag Materials Needed: A large paper, different colors of finger paint, additional smaller paper Ask the children if they know what a flag is, and then show them one. Explain that is is a symbol or a sign for a country. It is to remind us to get along and work together. Tell them that they are going to make a preschool flag. The children work together to make strips out of their own handprints you could draw rows for them to fill up with handprints. When done, give them a smaller piece to continue some fingerpainting on! Friendship Chain Materials Needed: The children cut out strips either predrawn or freehand, depending on their ability level. Show them how to link the chains together. When complete, hang in your classroom! Pre cut paper dolls 4 connected dolls for each child ; miscellaneous crafts supplies buttons, ribbon, fabric, etc. This is a great time to remind them that we can have many, many friends at school! Discuss how we all look different but are all friends. Put shaving cream on their chameleon picture. Ask them which colors paint they would like and drop a few colors on the shaving cream. They spread and mix it over their chameleon Stamping Friends Materials: Write down their story and display with their pictures. They can make slides, climbing walls, etc. Add some little people to use as well! The third one has a new blue cap or hat! The fourth one said "Look at all our friends here today! Who could that friend be that is so new? Could that new friend be Or, you could have 6 flannel piece children prepared for the children to put on the board as you say the poem. What is a Friend? A large paper to hang on the wall and a marker. Ask the children what a friend is and write down all of their answers. Then extend it to ask what do friends do for other friends? Write down their answers. Some things to focus on are: For example, have the puppet discuss a "problem" he had with a friend, such as "My friend had a really, really, really, bad day. She was so angry about her day. When I said hi, she yelled at me. What should I do? Should I yell back? Cooking with children helps develop their math skills and helps them to learn how to follow directions. It also allows for some great conversation! Ask many questions while cooking with your children to encourage conversation! Be sure to ask specific Space theme questions while making these fun snacks! Friendship Soup In advance, ask parents to supply a vegetable to add to the soup. Of course, have extra available in case they forget! Have the children help wash and prepare the vegetables and put them in a crock pot. Add water and some vegetable boullion cubes. I usually partially boil the vegetables on a stove top to get them soft Graham crackers, powdered sugar, small construction paper hearts The children place a heart on their graham cracker square and then sprinkle the powdered sugar on the cracker. When they remove the paper, they will see a heart! Before this activity, have the children cut out their own hearts to use for great cutting practice you can predraw hearts on papers for them. Raisin and Banana Buddy Muffins Ingredients: Blender or food processor, mixing bowls, measuring cups and spoons, 2 mini-muffin pans total 24 muffins or 1 muffin pan total 12 muffins , cooling rack Preheat oven to degrees farenheit. Spray muffin tins with non-stick spray. Blend bananas in the blender and then scrape into a mixing bowl. Have the children help to add eggs and oil to the bananas and mix. In a separate bowl, have the children add flour, sugar, cocoa, baking soda, salt, and baking powder. Then add banana mixture and mix. Place one tablespoon or so into each

mini muffin tin. Bake at degrees farenheit for minutes.

## 2: Friendship Activities for Preschoolers

*Friendship Crafts, Activities, Games, and Printables Children celebrate the joys of making and having friends with our friendship theme. They engage in sharing and caring activities, games, songs, rhymes, literature, and snacks.*

Have them fold the paper in half and print their name along the fold. They should print their name fairly large. Next have them cut out their name, making sure not to cut the fold. Open and they have created a name monster. The diagram will resemble a stretched out crossword puzzle. Divide the children into groups. Each group is given a large sheet of paper. When done decorate the paper. The children will want to do this activity over and over. Friendship Chain Give children strips of construction paper. Have everyone decorate and write the name of a friend on the strips. Let children take turns adding their strips to the chain. Display the chain in the classroom. Keep a supply of construction paper strips on hand and invite the children to continue adding strips to the class friendship chain. Montage of Faces Need: Have the children get into groups of 5 to 6 people. The groups decides if it wants the people montage to be happy, sad, funny, or scary faces. After the group decides what kind of faces it wants the children then look through the magazines and cut out the pictures they find. Cut the faces so that uninteresting areas around the faces are taken away. Next the children take turns pasting the faces to the construction paper in any manner suitable. When the montages have dried hang in the room. This montage is eye-catching. Tower Your Initials Need: Decorate them on both sides in any fashion desired. When the letters have been completed, notch them in two different places. Start connecting the letters by fitting them in the notches of the other letters. Build the letters up in a tower shape. This is not difficult if you are sure to insert the notch of one letter into the notch of another. The process automatically locks the letters together. Place the Towering Initials on the windows or your bulletin board. After a day or two see how many names and initials the children can associate with the members of their class. Offer a small reward for the person who identifies the most names from the Towering Initial display. Secret Pals send anonymous notes, cards, treats and surprises for their special friends. See if classmates can identify their pals. Can do all week--On Friday see who can guess who their secret pal is. Make Friendship Bracelets Make friendship necklaces using straws and paper. Put the names of friends on the papers. Or, give a paper to a friend to string with "From your name". A ring can be made by bending a pipe cleaner to fit the size of a finger. Make sure the ring will slide onto a finger, then twist it closed. Wrap yarn tightly around the ring shape, change the color scheme whenever desired. A bracelet can be made by bending a cardboard strip into a circle shape. Make sure the bracelet will slide over your hand, then fasten the ends of the cardboard with a stapler. Wrap yarn tightly around the shape until the circle is completely covered. Cut the yarn and glue the end to the inside of the bracelet. Read the story and see if the children can find the dog Maisie. Games Human Knot Form groups of 6 to 10 members. Stand shoulder-to-shoulder in a circle. Reach across the circle with one hand. Grab the hand of a member can not be the person next to you. Try to untangle the human knot. Here are some strategies: Squat down while someone steps over your arm. Move slowly, one person at a time. Talk to each other and work together. Learn how to work as a team. In the end some people may end up facing outward instead of inward. Try it a second time. See if you can untangle faster than the first. Someone from the group tiptoes up to the chair, taps the child sitting in it on the back, and in a disguised or funny voice says, "Do you know me? After three guesses, a new child takes the chair and gets a turn. One child in the middle hides his eyes. Teacher picks a child to leave the circle. The child in the middle has to guess who is missing. Child who was picked to leave the circle is next in the middle. The children love this game. A good way for the children to learn each others names. It is nice to say hello to a friend. It shows them that you are thinking about them. The teacher throws a beanbag to a child. This child says hello to another child in the circle. The first child then throws the beanbag to another child. Continue until each child has caught the beanbag and said hello. Beanbag Share Talk about what it means to share ideas. When you share an idea, you tell someone something. Pass the beanbag around the circle. Help the children think of ideas! What do you like to play? What do you like to draw? Children find this concept interesting! They begin to think about communication. They find that speaking their thoughts is a safe and fun thing to do. Teacher begins by describing the clothes of one of the children in the class. When the

children think they know whose clothes has been described, they raise their hands. The teacher selects someone, who makes a guess. At a group time play the tape back and have the children try to guess who is talking.

Preschool Crafts on Friendship written by: Teach preschool children how to get along and create a preschool craft friendship as a team as well as individually. Learning friendship and ways to be kind to each other begins early and should be practiced often. Preschool crafts concerning friendship will solidify a group camaraderie and demonstrate how to be kind and appreciative of others. Take this idea one step further by making those wreaths a symbol of friendship. Ask each child to trace their hands on a piece of construction paper and label the hand. If there are twenty children in the class, the handprint will need to be cut out twenty times. Gather the children together to complete this craft. Distribute the pictures to the children so each child has their own photo, then distribute the hands. Each child will receive one hand from each of their classmates. Do not give the child his own hand. Decorate the hands and glue them to the photo to create a wreath of friends. Make a train after reading popular train books. Cut large butcher paper into rectangles and add large black circles for wheels. Allow children to trace hands, make handprints with paint, or attach hand shaped stickers to the train. Encourage students to add names and work together on the project. The train will be large, so the rectangles can be taped to a table while children work together. The train will be a project highlighting teamwork, getting along with each other and creating a piece of artwork representing the value of friendship. Cut two strips of paper for each child in the classroom. During circle time, allow one child to choose one classmate helper to make a loop with a strip of paper. The helper will hold the tape or stapler while the chosen child creates a loop with the paper strip. The first loop will be attached to the wall, and following loops will be attached to previous loops to create a chain moving across the wall. The class will observe while two of their classmates work together to create the next link to the chain. After every child has had two turns at the friendship chain, the children will have a full chain representing hard work and partnership. The chain will be a visual representation of friendship and the group effort required to create an appealing classroom decoration. Allowing children to work together as well as independently to consider others and build teamwork skills teaches children how to be kind to all individuals. While working on a preschool craft friendship, encourage conversation regarding why students need to get along and how to get along with all individuals, despite differences.
