Also remember that cheating hurts everyone. If you see it, report it. Once you have submitted your registration to ACT, by any method, it cannot be canceled. Rescheduled Test Centers Occasionally, a test center must cancel a test administration due to bad weather or other unforeseen circumstances. When this occurs, the test will be rescheduled for a future date. Prohibited Behavior at the Test Center To ensure fairness for all examinees, avoid disturbances in the testing room, and protect the security of the test materials, certain behaviors are prohibited at the test center. All examinees deserve the chance to show what he or she has learned. ACT has designed its testing procedures to give you and other honest students an equal opportunity to demonstrate your own academic achievement on a fair and equal playing field. If you suspect that someone is trying to take unfair advantages or encounter anything else out of the ordinary, please report it to ACT. You can make an anonymous report about test security concerns by using the Test Security Hotline. Keep the ACT fair. Report cheating and comply with all testing rules. Security Measures We regularly review preventive measures to ensure every reasonable effort is made to deter and detect potential compromises to test security, while still enabling the greatest possible access for students. Our security measures include: Students upload or otherwise submit via ACT website, mobile device, or mail a recognizable head-and-shoulders photo of themselves when registering for the ACT In addition to submitting a photo, students must provide ACT with their gender and identify the name of the high school they attend. In addition to their ticket, students bring and present an acceptable photo ID on test day. Both before and after testing, students provide written affirmation that they are the person whose name appears on the test booklet and answer sheet which they have submitted. To deter attempts to circumvent these procedures, students including those who hope to test on a standby basis will be required to register their intent to test and will not be allowed to make any test center or test date changes on the day of the test. But one of the most important considerations when planning for college is your entrance exams. This test examines your ability to reason, and to think logically. As the SAT does not test for specific fact based knowledge, it can prove difficult to study for. But there are ways in which a student can prepare for the SAT, and be ready to conquer the challenge of their college entrance exams. These questions can give you a general idea of what you will be facing when the time comes to take the SAT. Many students find these sample questions beneficial, but many more students opt to take the PSAT. What is the PSAT? The PSAT is organized in much the same manner as the official SAT, with regulated testing cycles and nationally standardized scoring procedures. The PSAT gives high school students hands on experience with the testing procedure, and allows them to judge their own results with an eye toward improving any areas in which they may be deficient, The value of the PSAT can not be overestimated. It allows students to become comfortable with the exam process, and provides them with an insight on what to expect on their official college entrance exams. It contains sections on mathematics, reading comprehension and writing skills. The only differences are in the specific questions, the length of the exam and the lack of an essay section on the PSAT. This gives the student the opportunity to recognize, and address, any areas of the exam in which they performed poorly. The test is open to all high school students in their junior year. A wide variety of books and study guides are available, as well as sample exams to get you ready for the testing procedure. What does my PSAT score tell me? Your PSAT scores will allow you to see the areas in which you performed well, and the areas you need to work on. Again, while the SAT does not test for specific knowledge, and only gauges your ability to reason and think logically, conventional study techniques may not prove overly helpful. But having your scores on the PSAT will give you the opportunity to focus on sample questions for the sections in which you need improvement, and will help you prepare for any test anxiety you may have experienced. Your PSAT scores will also give you a general understanding of your statistical relationship to other students across the country. That information will help you plan for your college admissions applications by giving you a clear idea of your competition. If you can use your PSAT results to improve your score on the SAT you can increase your chances of being accepted to your first college of choice. Taking the PSAT offers a few additional benefits beyond giving you an opportunity to review and improve your test performance. The more your child masters her fundamental coursework, the better prepared she will be for college admissions tests. Get familiar with the test format Taking tests is a skill. Since both tests are timed, proper test-taking strategies can help your child make the most of every minute. If your child runs out of time on a section, they should make sure to bubble in a random answer for each remaining question. On both tests, guessing can only help: Take advantage of free test prep options Fortunately, high-quality test prep resources are increasingly available for free online. Khan Academy can help your child create a personalized SAT study plan targeting the areas your child needs to work on that includes video lessons, practice questions, and full-length SAT practice tests. Students can even use the service to study on the go by downloading an app to their smartphones or tablets. While free online options help some students increase their scores, others benefit from the structure of in-person instruction. One-on-one tutoring can be particularly beneficial for students who need to work on specific subject areas. Alternatively, group classes provide a comprehensive overview of the test, with personal assistance when needed. If you decide to pay for test prep, make sure you are getting the most for your money. College admissions officers emphasize that they holistically evaluate each applicant. A full list of test-flexible and test-optional schools is available on FairTest. Colleges also differ in the way they use test results in making admissions decisions. Others will average the scores if a student takes a test more than once or look only at the highest score earned in a single session. Instead, taking these tests can help your child become familiar with the nature of the tests and develop a study plan. By then, they have completed most of the coursework that will help them on the test, and they can still retake the tests in the fall of their senior year if they feel they can improve their scores. When scheduling a test date, consider when your child will have time to prepare and whether results will be available before college applications are due. Many admissions officers say they only look at the test with the highest score. Research shows that students can often “ but not always “ improve their scores by retaking college admissions tests a second or even a third time. But experts also caution against taking the test over and over unless a student has a solid reason to believe they can significantly improve their results. In addition to being expensive, test prep and testing take time a student might otherwise invest in improving other elements of their college application, like their college essays, extracurricular involvement, and grades.

Hard questions count the same amount as easier questions. You may not be able to complete all the questions in the time given, but it is not necessary to get every question correct to receive the highest score for the test. Consider all the choices in each question. Avoid careless mistakes that will cause you to lose points. Work on less time-consuming questions before moving on to the more difficult ones. Questions on each test are generally ordered from easiest to hardest. Cross them out in your test book so that you can clearly see which choices are left.
