As his inner life intensified through his practice of meditation, the subjects of his paintings moved from portraits, nudes, and landscapes to vivid and prismatic depictions of inner worlds. Each time I read it, it never fails to stun me anew that this same power recorded in this chapter, is the same power that lives within me, you, and all those in whom the Spirit of God dwells. I thought someone might like to read it again, or perhaps read it for the first time. Scientists, who have made it their business to study storms, have discovered some interesting facts about lightning and how it occurs. A storm generates electrical energy because of rising and falling moisture inside the cloud. That electrical energy is negatively charged. When one part of the cloud becomes more heavily charged than another, lightning arcs across the gap to equalize the difference. Over ninety percent of lightning occurs within the cloud itself. But every now and then the cloud mass discharges energy earthward. That is what we see as a bolt of lightning. These studies have revealed that places on the earth begin to respond to the electricity in the cloud. The land, which is positively charged, gathers positive energy in one place. It may be a tree branch, a high spot, a power pole or some other object. A path is etched through the ozone charged atmosphere by the first bolt to descend. Slow motion photography has revealed that the bolt quite often begins on the ground though sometimes it begins in the cloud. It reaches up, and then the cloud reaches down. Power surges down that path three, four and up to thirty times before it finds another place to connect. An allegory in the sky As I was watching a program on storms and lightning, the parallel between lightning and the kingdom of God came to me strongly. It reminded me of a vision I had in November . In that vision I saw heaven and earth depicted as two flat planes levels, not flying machines. The ground, or earth was pinkish grey in colour and the heavens were yellow gold in colour. There were contours in both planes- undulating gentle hills and valleys like a cave a roof and a floor. As I watched, one of the hills began to rise slowly. It formed a mountain, reaching for the sky. As it did, the heavens above it began to descend. The two eventually touched, and what I saw next etched into my memory. At times I reach down from heaven, and touch the earth, but at other times people reach up to touch Me. This always releases power and a display of My glory in the earth. The best example of this in the Bible is perhaps the Mt Sinai visitation. At a time when the Lord desired to make His heart known to all the people, He called them to Mt Sinai in the wilderness and drew them near to speak to Him. Moses brought the people out of the camp to meet God. They took their stand at the foot of the mountain. Heaven took the initiative, God chose a time and place and boom!. Thunder and lightning, trumpeting, trembling, fire and smoke and shaking of the earth. Earth reaching up More often however, God responds to the reaching up of His people. We have no control over the day or hour God chooses to visit, but it is helpful to example some of the themes that arise when God chooses to respond. There are some great examples of this in the Bible. In the days of Ahab, the people had followed after false gods. The Lord instructed Elijah the prophet to confront the nation at Mt Carmel, and make them choose between the false gods and Him. Elijah called Israel to gather and witness the confrontation between Baal and Jehovah. After the prophets of Baal had cut themselves, shouting, ranting and raving, Elijah had his turn. The Lord had told him what to do with a bull, stones, water and then the fire. Elijah obeyed the Lord in every detail, and in front of all the people, heaven responded. Elijah reached up toward heaven, in obedience, and heaven reached down with fire consuming the offering, the altar, the water, the dust and everything else. Solomon saw a similar visitation in Jerusalem. When he had completed the temple according to the plan laid in his fathers heart, Solomon called all of Israel together. They gathered according to the custom, bringing offerings, sacrifices, instruments of praise and their families to celebrate. Solomon arrayed the musicians and priests in the temple. This passage stresses the importance of unity also. They were one voice. Centuries later, Jesus commanded the disciples to gather themselves in Jerusalem, and wait there until they were endowed with power from on high. When the appointed time had come, and they were gathered in unity in one accord the Lord responded to their hearts cry. They were one

voice again. Unity and glory A thunder storm hovers over the earth, full of power and unreleased energy. It seeks a place on earth to discharge. The energy of the earth gathers in one place, and that point reaches up toward heaven, drawing a response from the storm. So it is with God. When he broods over the earth, looking for a place he might visit, His eyes search throughout the earth for hearts committed to Him- 1 Chr. I want to add that I wish I could talk to every man and woman who works for NASA or who worked on this mission and tell them: And we know of your anguish. On this day years ago, the great explorer Sir Francis Drake died aboard ship off the coast of Panama. In his lifetime the great frontiers were the oceans, and an historian later said, "He lived by the sea, died on it, and was buried in it. The crew of the space shuttle Challenger honored us by the manner in which they lived their lives. We will never forget them, nor the last time we saw them, this morning, as they prepared for their journey and waved goodbye and "slipped the surly bonds of earth" to "touch the face of God.

Can Andrew help Alex through a horrible tragedy? He sometimes does it in seemingly random ways, but nothing is random with God. On with the story The morning certainly seemed to be starting off badly. First, she overslept, and then she burned her breakfast because her cat, Cleopatra, was sick. She must have left the lights on after coming home from her evening class the night before. Now I have one more thing to pay for this week. Although it was only September, the morning was chilly. 1 God, who touches earth with beauty, Make me lovely, too, With Thy Spirit recreate me, Make my heart anew. 2 Like Thy springs and running waters.

There have been many times in my life while living in South America that a family member or friend has turned to me and asked, "Did you feel that tremor? It was like a gigantic exclamation point written by the finger of God. It pointed to the magnitude of the death of Jesus Christ. It was as if God were saying, "Wake up! The location of the tremor "The earth shook" does not tell us the extent of the earthquake that day. It may mean no more than the land and may have been limited to Jerusalem and Judea. But at the cross the ground shook and frightened the battle seasoned soldiers. We are led to believe by the context the epic center was at the cross. The location of the quake was Calvary. Our text simply says, "the earth shook and the rocks were split. Earthquakes are frequent in the Middle East. Why should we pay particular attention to this sudden shaking at Calvary? The timing of the event is what grabs our attention and the fact that eyewitnesses "became very frightened. Matthew is suggesting to us that this was another supernatural event. God was involved; God shook the earth. By an act of His will, at a precise timing, God touched the earth and it shook. The earthquake was miraculous. It was the result of divine involvement. This was not a normal natural occurrence. This earthquake was independent of the natural movement of the plates in the earth. When we keep in mind the other miraculous events taking place at precise timing that afternoon, we cannot but come to the reasoned conclusion that this earthquake is a part of the larger picture of that cosmic event. The supernatural three hour darkness, the tearing of the huge curtain dividing the Holy Place from the Holy of Holies, the victorious shout and the manner in which Christ died, the splitting of the rocks and opening of selected graves all reinforce the sound conviction that God did it. The rocks in the tombs split open. This strange violent earthquake did not disturb anything else that day. Response of the witnesses The trembling earth caught the attention of the Roman centurion at the foot of the cross of Jesus and he "became very frightened. Our response to the death of Jesus for our sins should be one of praise, thanksgiving, trust, worship and love for Him. We do not know the full effect of all these combined miracles at Calvary on people who experienced them and their families until perhaps the day of Pentecost when 3,000 people believed on Christ as their Savior Acts 2: The book of Acts tells us in the months after Pentecost many priests put their faith in Jesus the Messiah. God spoke at Mt. Sinai and the earth shook in a way Moses tells us "the whole mountain quaked greatly. God spoke at that scene and communicated His law to a fallen and depraved people. Sinai and spoke in an awesome manner. And Moses brought the people out of the camp to meet God, and they stood at the foot of the mountain. Now Mount Sinai was all in smoke because the LORD descended upon it in fire; and its smoke ascended like the smoke of a furnace, and the whole mountain quaked violently. When the sound of the trumpet grew louder and louder, Moses spoke and God answered him with thunder. In that meeting with His people God gave specific details of what He required of His people. The law points its finger and says you are guilty. You must pay the penalty for your sin. Yes, God spoke at Sinai. Again, it is the exact timing of the earthquake that draws our attention to the details. Judgment came upon Korah at the command of God, and the earth opened up and swallowed up the rebellious Numbers There had been an earthquake on Sinai; there was now an earthquake on Calvary, and the wrath of the former was now hushed in the mercy of the latter. It pointed its finger and said all have sinned and the wages of sin is death. Calvary answered that condemnation and declared publicly that God has paid the penalty in full by placing all our sins on His divine substitute and dying. Then Paul adds, "But when the fullness of time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, in order that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons" Romans 4: Christ secured our release from the demands of the death penalty by His death. It was a substitutionary death, the just for the unjust. The Holy One died for the depraved sinners. Again Nicolson expresses beautifully, "Sinai was the prophecy of Calvary; Calvary was the fulfillment of Sinai. Once again, the timing of the event is crucial. God was doing something that morning in the tomb. He was calling the attention of the soldiers to the tomb door. Paul and Silas were praying and singing Acts The missionaries are praying and singing hymns of praise to

God "and suddenly there came a great earthquake. It was supernatural because God did it according to His will. It happened at His specific timing for a specific purpose. God was sending a message to those prisoners listening to the Gospel in their cells. There is a greater liberation and release found in the death of Jesus Christ. He suggests creation is an anxious scout scanning the horizon with head thrust forward eagerly searching the distant horizon with a throbbing, vivid expectation that something marvelous is going to be fulfilled. For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. The material heavens and earth is on tiptoe in "earnest expectation" waiting for "the revelation of the sons of God. It brings out the truth and makes it clearer and easier to comprehend. God has great designs for "the new heavens and new earth. The fall of Adam had a cosmic affect on all of creation even though we do not understand all the implications for creation. It is obvious that all of creation was affected. Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you; And you will eat the plants of the field; By the sweat of your face You will eat bread, Till you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return" Genesis 3: Who subjected the creation to this bondage of corruption? And only God could give the creation "hope" because only God has power to affect this kind of change over His created world. Darwinism and evolution cannot do this. The present state of the universe is not permanent. Everything is not going to rust out, wear-out and self-destruct. God is going to bring a cosmic change at the revelation of the sons of God in glory. The "hope" is that creation itself will be delivered. The Scriptures never give man or Satan the power to bring about the far-reaching changes that the world experienced at the Fall. Only God could bring about this subjection about. Man and creation did not fall up; it fell down when Adam disobeyed God. What if creation could speak for itself? What would it say? What if the rocks could shout? What would they say? They were caught up in a great act of worship of the Creator who stood before them. Some of the Pharisees immediately began to tell Jesus to calm down the crowd. Jesus said, "I tell you, if these become silent, the stones will cry out! God must receive praise. If man will not praise Him the mountains will! It is as if at Calvary they shouted the moment Christ died! Creation is impregnated with an earnest expectation of the revealing of the sons of God because its freedom from bondage comes when we too receive our "freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now" Romans 8: Creation is involved in both our bondage to sin and our hope of redemption. None The Scion with this Boon can link herself to the ground beneath her, borrowing its immovability for a short period of time. By standing on bare earth, stone or some other earthen substance and paying the requisite cost, the Scion becomes almost impossible to move; she becomes immune to knockback and knockdown and may only be lifted by an assailant with more dots of Epic Strength than she has Earth Boons. None By stomping on some naked earthen ground or surface, a Scion with this Boon can cause a cloud of that earth to fly up around him, creating armor of hardened earth around his body, granting him an additional bashing and lethal soak equal to his total number of Earth Boons as well as making him immune to piercing on weapons and weighing him down with a -2 mobility penalty to movements. This Boon requires that some earthen substance be available nearby, but it may be used in conjunction with other armoring powers. The armor remains for a scene, after which it turns back into its constituent earth. None The Scion with this boon has mastered the rot and reformation of metal; she may restore any rusted item to its unmarred, brilliant original state, or alternatively cause a metal object even one normally impervious to oxidization to instantly and spontaneously rust, cutting its soak in half. None Like a fish, the Scion with this power may swim through earth and rock itself as easily as if it were water for the rest of the scene, leaving no trail behind him. He may not pass through manmade alloys, and while he always instinctively knows in which direction the surface lies, he has no extra innate knowledge of his location or what might be above him. Any unfortunate target that fails three such rolls is sucked completely under, there to suffocate to death unless rescued. Beings with the Divine Balance knack are immune to these effects. The Scion herself may spend one additional point of Legend to swim within the affected area as if she had the Lightning Swimmer knack, affording her the opportunity for quick travel or getaways. None By calling out the name of the substance he wishes to turn into and converting his body to pure earth or stone, the Scion with this Boon becomes immobile, able to hear and see around him while disguised as an innocuous statue. If he chooses to pay the greater cost, he may also have the ability to move while thus transformed he may, if he chooses to pay the lower cost, pay the difference at any time to begin moving. The Scion may use the Shaping Boon, if he possesses it, to change his own appearance however he sees fit, though any changes will vanish when he reverts to his usual form; others may not use the Shaping Boon on him, as he is only temporarily made of stone. Upon paying the requisite cost, the Scion

summons a ten-foot-tall earth elemental of enormous strength and endurance which obeys her commands to the best of its ability. The elemental receives ten automatic successes to all physical feats or attacks and has the following abilities if unaugmented:

Symbols. Carefully maintained by the shrine's monks, the cones are aimed at the heavens. The tatezuna are a symbol of Mt Kami, where legend says Kamo-no-Wake-Ikazuchi-no-Mikoto – Young Thunder Prince of Kamo, came down from the heavens and touched the earth in ancient times.

At the edge of the road, where five mobile homes once stood, nothing remains. From the road to the crest of the hill are the mess and misery a tornado makes when it drops unannounced from the early-morning sky. For a Central Floridian, the scene is familiar: The slabs of plywood and 2-by-4s. The flimsy metal sheets. The confetti of pink and yellow insulation. Among the debris are the personal effects of people who lost their homes and, in some cases, their lives when a tornado touched down Friday morning. A box of Christmas lights. A snapshot of a baby wearing a Mickey Mouse shirt. Pre-algebra books, English books, American literature books. A Life Skills Mathematics book opened to page , the chapter on home insurance. All of it was swept up and carried across the road from six portable classrooms at the high school and five from the adjacent middle school. At the high school, one portable was upside down, one tipped on its side, another tossed on top of the school greenhouse. Student desks were crushed beneath the I-beams of mobile-home frames or speared by tree trunks. Had the tornado touched down at 8a. Friday, instead of 90 minutes earlier, those classrooms would have been full. Among those killed were Cal Little, 74, a former janitor at the high school, his daughter, and her 6-year-old son. At least 12 people died and at least were injured by the tornado that cut a path through five Georgia counties and into North Carolina, where two more died and an additional 27 were hurt. Those twisters leveled the town square and killed people, including women trapped inside a burning clothing factory. Hall County alone has been hit by 17 tornadoes in that time span. Crouse covered herself and her two children, ages 5 and 6, with a beanbag chair in the living room. When the tornado passed, she opened the door to find five mobile homes gone and one in shambles. I was crying; my children were screaming. Ginny Kast, 19, was inside the partially dismantled mobile home. She and her year-old fiance, Allen Dover, were awakened when the tornado began ripping apart the home into which they had just moved two weeks ago. I think God wanted us to move on. They took years to acquire and long hours to maintain - and they were destroyed in seconds.
