From him who "made the stars also" comes down every good and perfect gift, and with him "there can be no variation, neither shadow that is cast by turning. Matthew Henry Commentary 1: Afflictions cannot make us miserable, if it be not our own fault. The tried Christian shall be a crowned one. The crown of life is promised to all who have the love of God reigning in their hearts. Every soul that truly loves God, shall have its trials in this world fully recompensed in that world above, where love is made perfect. But nothing sinful in the heart or conduct can be ascribed to God. He is not the author of the dross, though his fiery trial exposes it. Those who lay the blame of sin, either upon their constitution, or upon their condition in the world, or pretend they cannot keep from sinning, wrong God as if he were the author of sin. Afflictions, as sent by God, are designed to draw out our graces, but not our corruptions. The origin of evil and temptation is in our own hearts. Stop the beginnings of sin, or all the evils that follow must be wholly charged upon us. God has no pleasure in the death of men, as he has no hand in their sin; but both sin and misery are owing to themselves. As the sun is the same in nature and influences, though the earth and clouds, often coming between, make it seem to us to vary, so God is unchangeable, and our changes and shadows are not from any changes or alterations in him. What the sun is in nature, God is in grace, providence, and glory; and infinitely more. As every good gift is from God, so particularly our being born again, and all its holy, happy consequences come from him. A true Christian becomes as different a person from what he was before the renewing influences of Divine grace, as if he were formed over again. Turning Jump to Next.

What, then, is "a good gift"? That which fulfils these two requisitions. And what is "a perfect gift"? That which entirely fulfils these two ends. Now everything we have in the world â€” from the blade of grass, or the ray of sunshine â€” up to eternal glory; from the slenderest thought that darts through the mind to the highest flights of philosophy; from the earthly songs to the triumphant anthems of heaven â€” everything we touch, or feel, or see, or hear, everything is "a gift. We did not make it; we did not buy it; we did not deserve it. It is God who gives it, and He gives it lovingly of His own free will, and He gives it to make whoever receives it happier and better. That is "a gift. Does not He give us trials, sorrows, separations, sickness, bereavement, death? Are these good gifts? Paul was "caught up to the third heaven, and heard unutterable things. It was necessary to balance and make safe the first gift. Each alone was "a good gift," but the two in combination make "a perfect gift. I think there is a difference. A gift which has in it perfect adaptation and eternity. Now we might say that all light â€” the light of the world â€” was but one light; but we see it broken up into its prismatic colours. There is the light of nature; there is the light of reading; there is the light of grace; there is the light of knowledge; there is the light of love; there is the light of heaven. But it all comes from the same spring, and in every case it is "the light" which is on it which makes the value of "the gift. Father; but from the want of "the light" which should reign in that "gift," the gift is valueless. Nay, more, it is an unfulfilled possibility; it is the handle of temptation; it turns to self, to pride, to sin. The "gift" is abused; and in proportion as the "gift" is "good and perfect," it becomes evil, and it incurs the heavier "gift" of condemnation.

This perfect unique being at least until they grow up! I have to share with you the story of how my husband, Mark, and I met. Mark was born in the south and raised as a true southern gentleman. But one of the weirdest, most God-gifted facts of our relationship is that I was born almost exactly nine months to the day after Mark was born. The gifts of God are good and perfect for each of His children. Who knows us better? We have spiritual gifts like salvation, forgiveness, the Holy Spirit, and eternal life. But we also have gifts of family, friends, special places and people that God has given us. We have talents and dreams given by God. What gifts in your life are from God? Who has been placed in your life by God to teach, guide, comfort, love, or even admonish? This week see how many gifts in your life you can think of that come from God. Be thankful for your gifts. 4: What does James mean?

Every Good and Perfect Gift "Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it; let the field exult, and everything in it. Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy."

He never changes or casts a shifting shadow. Emotions and sinful thinking can trick us into turning away from God. In the midst of our trials, we are tempted to change our opinion of the trustworthiness of our God. We start to make lists of all the things we think we are missing in our lives, of all of the things we have lost. This attitude leads to even more temptation. We struggle to find our own satisfaction. Now, however, James urges us to flip the typical human script. He calls us to make a new list: Where did all those good things come from? James is encouraging believers in Christ to tell themselves the truth: God gave you every single good thing in your life. He is the source of all the good you have and all the good you crave. Who God is does not change when our circumstances change. He is still the source of all the good in our lives; He never changes. James also uses a play on words in this verse, referring to God as the Father of lights, or "of heavenly lights. The sun can never be in shadow. At times, shadows may fall on us, but He is ever and always light. If we turn away from Him, we go only deeper into shadow. Turning from God in order to escape hardship is as ridiculous as hiding from the sun in an effort to escape darkness. When faced with ordeals, we should seek the one who can make all things new. What does it mean to remain faithful in hard times? It means continuing to acknowledge that God is the source of what is good in our lives, and what will be good in the future.

James now begins to focus on just one of those good and perfect gifts that our Father in Heaven has given to us. This gift is given freely to whosoever will. The gift of regeneration, or the New Birth, is not a gift that we receive in stages, like sanctification. Sanctification is given to every one of us when we fall on our face and repent at the foot of the Cross. We are sanctified, made holy and pure, by the Blood of the Lamb. Our corrupted, dirty robes of sin that clung to us like glue are removed and God clothes us in righteousness. One day soon, we shall see Jesus again. On that day we will put aside, once and for all, these robes of flesh and be clothed in a glorious, spiritual body that will be perfect, but for now we still live in corrupted bodies of flesh. Every day that we live we must become more sanctified. At the time of the New Birth, we are sanctified spiritually. But in our daily walk with the Lord, we must sanctify the flesh and learn to be more like Jesus. Thus Sanctification is a gift that we get in stages. This Born Again experience comes all at once. No, you are born again all at once. You are made a new creation in Christ Jesus by the Spirit of God in an instant of time, and then you never need to be born again, as long as you continue to walk with the Lord.
