Excuse me for stepping out but we are trying to keep the government open. But let me just talk about CHIP for a moment because this is a subject that many of us have been involved with for a long time. The health and well-being of our children is a primary responsibility for those of us in Congress – for me, personally, my motivation for me to be in politics is the one in five [children] who live in poverty in our country, go to sleep hungry at night in America, the greatest country that has ever existed in the history of the world. But nonetheless, this issue should have been done by September 30 when the reauthorization ended. The Republicans – because they wanted to pay for it in a strange way – we could not come to an agreement on it. So where is their value system? So, anyway, that is what has been holding it up for nearly three months and that is really unfortunate because, as has [been] said by my colleagues, states are running out of money – some states have already run out of money. We must do this. What was the question? Whether or not the CR was going to keep the government going – Leader Pelosi. Did you want to formulate it? I stepped out of the room. The government will be open by the Republicans because they have the votes. They have the votes in [the] House, the Senate and they have the White House – they control whether government is open. We are very proud of our unity in our Caucus: More than you want to know on this subject? The question is about parity. We have a budget agreement that we would have parity. That means whatever you increase defense by, you increase domestic discretionary budget by. They have to, in their own Caucus, come up with a CR where they have the votes. You have to ask them. Have there been recent negotiations on CHIP? On the tax bill, Republicans are convinced that this is going to help them win elections in Do you think the tax bill is going to help Republicans win elections? Let them think that. Let me say, that would be a course of action that might work for them. The question is – we pass something, it goes to the Senate, they put on health care, is that what their promise was? It comes back here. Do the Republicans support that? You really think these Republicans are going to support that? My colleagues, anyone else want to weigh in on this? Do you expect Republicans to have similar issues on this tax bill? Well, let me just say: When we did the Affordable Care Act, we did scores of hearings, took hundreds of amendments – probably took hundreds of them – took some, probably modified some just the way we treated Democratic amendments. So we had a full airing of that – because they have a bill now that will affect the economy to the tune of trillions of dollars in which they have had no hearings, no expert testimony. I only wish they could listen to the people in wheelchairs with disabilities that we heard from yesterday to what it would do in their lives, to listen to health care professionals or even listen to their own people. Eighty-[three] percent of the benefits go to the top one percent – 8[3] percent of the benefits go to the top one percent. They were able to mischaracterize what the Affordable Care Act was. A month later, a 9th-inning single cost him a no-hitter against the Oakland Athletics. Johnson suffered another walk, 4-inning start in But his untapped talent was volcanic: In , Johnson became the first left-hander to strike out Wade Boggs three times in one game, and a no-hitter against the Detroit Tigers attested to his potential. Ryan recommended a slight change in his delivery; before the meeting, Johnson would land on the heel of his foot after delivering a pitch, and he therefore usually landed offline from home plate. Ryan suggested that he land on the ball of his foot, and almost immediately, he began finding the strike zone more consistently. In May , Johnson again lost a no-hitter to a 9th-inning single; again, the opponent was the Oakland Athletics. When Gillick was unable to contact Woodward he agreed to utilize the deal with Alderson. However, Gillick gave his word to Alderson even though the deal had not been finalized. He defeated the Yankees in Game 3 with 10 strikeouts in seven innings. Entering a 4""4 game in the ninth inning, Johnson pitched the ninth, 10th, and 11th innings. Johnson posted an 0""6 playoff record in his next four playoff series, each of which his teams lost. Between May and October , Johnson had gone 53""9, including a 16""0 streak that fell one short of the AL record. Johnson had two strikeout starts in , on June 24 and August 8. Another colorful All-Star Game moment proceeded in the edition involving former Expos teammate Larry Walker , at that point with the Colorado Rockies. He ended the at bat by drawing a walk. Johnson finished 7th in the National League Cy Young voting despite pitching only 2 months in the league, and helped Houston win their second straight National League Central division title. Johnson started Games 1 and 4, both losses. He only gave up three earned runs combined in the two games, but received only one run in support in Game 4. Johnson finished with 19 wins, strikeouts and a 2. When the game resumed the following day, Johnson stepped in as the new pitcher and racked up 16 strikeouts in 7 innings, technically setting the record for the most strikeouts in a relief stint. On May 18, , Johnson pitched the 17th perfect game in baseball history. At 40 years of age, he was the oldest pitcher to accomplish this feat. Johnson had 13 strikeouts on his way to a 2""0 victory against the Atlanta Braves. He also became the fifth pitcher in Major League history to throw both a no-hitter and a perfect game in his career after Young, Bunning, Addie Joss , and Sandy Koufax ; since Johnson, Mark Buehrle and Roy Halladay have joined this

group. Johnson led the major leagues in strikeouts with In the games where Arizona scored three or more runs, Johnson was 13â€™2. As his team only won 51 games that year, his ratio of winning Johnson was inconsistent through , allowing 32 home runs; however, he regained his dominance in late Johnson did not make the original edition, but for the update, with his career totals considerably higher and his World Championship season taken into account, he was ranked at Number In Game 5 in Anaheim, Johnson made an effective relief appearance after Mike Mussina gave up 5 runs and 6 hits to give the Angels a 5â€™2 lead, but the Yankees were unable to come back in the series. Johnson got his 4,th career strikeout on July 6, Johnson was placed on the day disabled list with a torn rotator cuff in his throwing shoulder on July 28, On January 5, , he announced his retirement from professional baseball. Anton Graff – Anton Graff was an eminent Swiss portrait artist. In Graff started studying painting at the art school of Johann Ulrich Schellenberg in Winterthur, after three years he left Winterthur for Augsburg. There he worked with the etcher Johann Jakob Haid, however, only one year later he was forced to leave Augsburg. The members of the painters guild feared his competition. With a letter of recommendation from Johann Jakob Haid, he moved to Ansbach where he found employment with the court painter Leonhard Schneider until , Graff travelled frequently to Munich to study the paintings in the different collections. In he went back to Augsburg and later moved to Regensburg, in he went back to Winterthur and Zurich. He thought he was not good enough to work for the court of Saxony. To give Hagedorn an impression of his talent he sent a self-portrait to Dresden, the self-portrait arrived on 16 January , in Dresden. It was so well received that one day later Hagedorn worked out Graffs employment contract. On 20 June , Graff was appointed Professor for portrait painting at the Dresden Art Academy, Graff made portraits of nearly 1, of his contemporaries and was the leading portrait painter in Germany in the late 18th and early 19th century. Graff was also the portrait painter of German poets between the Enlightenment and the early Romantic periods. Many of them were also his friends, like Johann Wolfgang von Goethe whom he met in Dresden in , Graff was the favourite portrait painter of the German, Russian, Polish and Baltic nobility. His portrait of Frederick the Great is regarded as his masterpiece, the painting is exhibited at Schloss Charlottenburg. Frederick the Great never posed for Graff, however, Graff got the authorization to watch the troops parade in This was the chance for Graff to study the physiognomy of the King, Graff was also very popular with the landed gentry, diplomats, musicians and scholars 2. Holy Roman Empire – The Holy Roman Empire was a multi-ethnic complex of territories in central Europe that developed during the Early Middle Ages and continued until its dissolution in The title was revived in when Otto I was crowned emperor, fashioning himself as the successor of Charlemagne, some historians refer to the coronation of Charlemagne as the origin of the empire, while others prefer the coronation of Otto I as its beginning. Scholars generally concur, however, in relating an evolution of the institutions and principles constituting the empire, the office of Holy Roman Emperor was traditionally elective, although frequently controlled by dynasties. Emperor Francis II dissolved the empire on 6 August , after the creation of the Confederation of the Rhine by Napoleon, before , the realm was merely referred to as the Roman Empire. In a decree following the Diet of Cologne, the name was changed to Holy Roman Empire of the German Nation, by the end of the 18th century, the term Holy Roman Empire of the German Nation had fallen out of official use. As Roman power in Gaul declined during the 5th century, local Germanic tribes assumed control, by the middle of the 8th century, however, the Merovingians had been reduced to figureheads, and the Carolingians, led by Charles Martel, had become the de facto rulers. He eventually incorporated the territories of present-day France, Germany, northern Italy, on Christmas Day of , Pope Leo III crowned Charlemagne emperor, restoring the title in the west for the first time in over three centuries. After the death of Charles the Fat, those crowned emperor by the pope controlled only territories in Italy, the last such emperor was Berengar I of Italy, who died in Around , autonomous stem duchies reemerged in East Francia, on his deathbed, Conrad yielded the crown to his main rival, Henry the Fowler of Saxony, who was elected king at the Diet of Fritzlar in Henry reached a truce with the raiding Magyars, and in he won a first victory against them in the Battle of Riade, Henry died in , but his descendants, the Liudolfing dynasty, would continue to rule the Eastern kingdom for roughly a century. Upon Henry the Fowlers death, Otto, his son and designated successor, was elected King in Aachen in and he overcame a series of revolts from an elder brother and from several dukes. After that, the managed to control the appointment of dukes. In , Otto came to the aid of Adelaide, the queen of Italy, defeating her enemies, marrying her. In , Otto won a victory over the Magyars in the Battle of Lechfeld 3. Leipzig – Leipzig is the largest city in the federal state of Saxony, Germany. With a population of , inhabitants it is Germanys tenth most populous city, Leipzig is located about kilometres southwest of Berlin at the confluence of the White Elster, Pleisse, and Parthe rivers at the southern end of the

North German Plain. Leipzig has been a city since at least the time of the Holy Roman Empire. The city sits at the intersection of the Via Regia and Via Imperii, Leipzig was once one of the major European centers of learning and culture in fields such as music and publishing. Leipzig later played a significant role in instigating the fall of communism in Eastern Europe, through events which took place in, Leipzig today is an economic center and the most livable city in Germany, according to the GfK marketing research institution. Outside of Leipzig the Neuseenland district forms a lake area of approximately square kilometres. Leipzig is derived from the Slavic word Lipsk, which means settlement where the linden trees stand, an older spelling of the name in English is Leipsic. After a period of Allied occupation, two German states were founded, the Federal Republic of Germany and the German Democratic Republic, in , the country was reunified. In the 21st century, Germany is a power and has the worlds fourth-largest economy by nominal GDP. As a global leader in industrial and technological sectors, it is both the worlds third-largest exporter and importer of goods. Germany is a country with a very high standard of living sustained by a skilled. It upholds a social security and universal health system, environmental protection. Germany was a member of the European Economic Community in The national military expenditure is the 9th highest in the world, the English word Germany derives from the Latin Germania, which came into use after Julius Caesar adopted it for the peoples east of the Rhine. German literature – German literature comprises those literary texts written in the German language. This includes literature written in Germany, Austria, the German parts of Belgium and Switzerland, Liechtenstein, South Tyrol in Italy and to a lesser extent works of the German diaspora. German literature of the period is mostly in Standard German. The Old High German period is reckoned to run until about the mid 9th century, the most famous works are the Hildebrandslied, Middle High German starts in the 12th century, the key works include The Ring and the poems of Oswald von Wolkenstein and Johannes von Tepl. The Baroque period was one of the most fertile times in German literature, modern literature in German begins with the authors of the Enlightenment. Periodization is not a science but the following list contains movements or time periods typically used in discussing German literature. Saxony has, after Saxony Anhalt, the most vibrant economy of the states of the former East Germany and its economy grew by 1. They were formed during a process, During the folding of the Variscan orogeny, metamorphism occurred deep underground, forming slate. In addition, granite plutons intruded into the metamorphic rocks, by the end of the Palaeozoic era, the mountains had been eroded into gently undulating hills, exposing the hard rocks. As the rock of the Ore Mountains was too brittle to be folded, it shattered into an independent fault block which was uplifted and tilted to the northwest. This process is known as dissection, the Ore Mountains is geologically considered to be one of the most heavily researched mountain ranges in the world. The main geologic feature in the Ore Mountains is the Late Paleozoic Eibenstock granite pluton and this pluton is surrounded by progressive zones of contact metamorphism in which Paleozoic slates and phyllites have been changed to spotted hornfels, andalusite hornfels, and quartzites. Late Tertiary faulting and volcanism gave rise to basalt and phonolite dikes, Ore veins include iron, copper, tin, tungsten, lead, silver, cobalt, bismuth, uranium, plus iron and manganese oxides. The soils consist of rapidly leaching grus, in the western and central areas of the mountains it is formed from weathered granite. Phyllite results in a loamy, rapidly weathered gneiss in the east of the mountains producing a light soil, today the land is predominantly used for pasture. But it is not uncommon to see near-natural mountain meadows, to the north of the Ore Mountains, west of Chemnitz and around Zwickau lies the Ore Mountain Basin which is only really known geologically. Here there are deposits of coal where mining has already been abandoned.

In that one school year, the university instituted a discriminatory zero-tolerance policy for the mostly black residential students, and we organized a press conference to voice our discontent. The school created new fees, and then tried to remove the mostly black students from campus for not paying them. So then we held the biggest event our campus had ever seen, and used the proceeds to pay for the overdue fees of those students. Every trick the school pulled, we were ready to respond. We were bad asses. I was devastated but also convinced that this was some form of retaliation for all of my radical activism on campus. It was my own oversight. In my haste to be done with school and get into the real world, I had become disillusioned with classes that year. I was a political science major, because it was the closest that I could get to my real goal of changing the world through my activism. I knew through most of college that I would finish and go work for a nonprofit, social justice organization. I thought propelled by all the wonderful bad-assery of my college work that I was ready for the world. The truth is, I am 22 years removed from my senior year of college, and although I have had an amazing career as an activist and advocate and nonprofit professional, I am woefully aware of these nuggets I wish that I had had as I was entering the world. You have all committed to the passionate pursuit of social innovation, impact and justice, and that is a very particular lane to occupy. I thought long and hard about what I wish someone would have told me, all at once, so that at least I could ignore it with some context. So here are my tidbits to take with you as you journey forward in this work. The work is hard. And because this world is broken beautiful, but broken this work can take you in so many directions. So getting in touch with what moves you deeply, what gets you up in the morning and sends you to sleep at night, makes it easier to narrow your focus. As long as your passion remains the biggest driver of your work, you will stay on the right track. The second one is find your tribe. So many folks get caught up in their singular contribution, but that can actually be a hindrance to progress. The lift is always more than you expected, and part of the problem is folks trying to be singular heroes instead of the Avengers. Whether you are MSW or a nonprofit executive, it is important to find like-minded folk who have a similar vision for a way forward, to build with, commiserate with, to win with. Next is sharpen your instincts. Just saying, "Follow your instincts," assumes that your instincts will never fail you. This may sound a little bit of a contradiction to the last point, but follow me. Human beings, particularly those who have committed themselves to reversing injustice, have a tendency to develop absolutes in our views of the world. But one way to keep your sharp instincts, I believe, is to challenge what you know to be absolutely true or what you think you know. One great way of doing that is by mixing up who you have in your community. Make sure you have some folks around you with different points of view and alternate visions for justice in the world. Keep them close, and practice active, deep listening when you engage with them. You will either expand your own vision or have a better understanding of why your vision is sound. But either way, it allows that muscle that controls your instincts to expand and contract, which will keep it sharp. This one goes right along with sharpening your instincts. Passionate instincts can either take you far or stunt your growth. And that reality is in direct relationship with how honest you are willing to be with yourself. This is not to be mistaken with second-guessing yourself. But the nature of this work is service. You are choosing of life of being in service of other human beings in the world in some capacity. The people who we work in service of are often in critical need. An inability to, without ego, examine yourself and ask tough questions is a disservice to those people. Why am I here? Am I the best person to provide this service? Am I using my privilege in service of those with less than me? What is driving my investment in this work? This is also where that tribe can come in really handy if you pick the right ones. Ask for honest feedback, and then gift yourself with the same honesty. At the end of all this self-examination, you may draw the same conclusions that you are where you are supposed to

be, doing things that you are supposed to do. But I guarantee you that your approach to the work will have improved and your output will be more excellent every time. The next one is take care of yourself. Lately, in the last few years, the term "self care" has been really popular in pop-culture lexicon, right, particularly in social justice circles, and its popularity stems from the stark reality that the generations before us worked themselves literally to death. And I want to underscore that. My comrade and sister, Joanne Smith, who is the founder of Girls for Gender Equity, often says, "We come to the work because we are the work. My motivation for wanting to bring healing into the lives of black and brown girls I worked with was because no-one spoke healing into my life. I came to this work because I am the work, which means I brought my baggage and broken pieces to the work, too. Eventually I realized how important it was to continuously unpack and repair in order to be more effective and impactful. So many of you are coming to this work for the same reasons. Do your personal work. And our dean gave this one away a little bit, but the last one is, let love lead. One of my all-time favorite quotes from the great scholar and activist Dr. What the last three decades have shown me is that if love is not leading, it becomes easy to lose your footing. Me Too went viral now almost seven month ago. The night that it started going viral was a really interesting night for me. I see MeToo everywhere! One of the things I struggled with is, how am I going to contain my work? How am I not going to get lost in this viral moment? And a really interesting thing happened. You all know what I mean. I was on Facebook. And so when it was set up, I could watch the hashtag. And I thoughtâ€”I was calling friends and I was consulting people, and I was like â€” what am I going to go? Who is going to believe that this year-old black women is the one who started this thing 12 years ago? And I was out-of-my-mind frantic. And then a really interesting thing happened. Somebody tweeted MeToo with a link. And it was gut-wrenching. I read that story and I thought to myself, "My god, Tarana. I remember sitting up in my bed and saying exactly that to myself. I was taught that by some elders and veterans of the Civil Rights Movement and the Black Power Movement and Labor Movement who really cared about passing on their legacy of work to another generation. And I made that commitment after the first thing I ever organized. I said, "This is the live I want. I want to do this forever. So I asked myself in this moment, when you committed yourself 30 years ago to be in service of people, when did that change? The question for me in that moment after reading that story and watching this viralness happen online was simply, are you going to be in conflict or are you going to be in service? Because conflict would have been easy, right? It would have been easy for me to say, "This is mine. I did it first. I can prove it. The truth of the matter was that I had no choice but to be in service. And in the span of 24 hours, I had to tap into my passion. I had to consult my trusted tribe. I had to lean into my instincts, which forced me to re-examine my motives. When I came up for air, the answer was clear. I love people deeply. I love my people deeply.
