Meanwhile, Flaherty learns from a priest that Mark confessed to a crime to him, apparently the murder of Trang. Wes cuts his ties with Mark but Mark and Christina marry. She hides herself away in a motel but then goes into labor. Diane has claimed that Mark was the man who raped her in college though Mark denies it. As Christina and the others try to talk Mark into handing over the child, he repeatedly squeezes and shakes the infant. Diane goes toward him though he warns her away, and pulls a gun from her handbag, shooting Mark and grabbing the infant before Mark falls to the ground. Glitsky notes that Diane will say that Mark was going to kill the baby, and that she had no choice but to shoot him.
