Parishes enriched by initial sessions in V Encuentro process Discerning pastoral practices and priorities for ministry among Hispanic Catholics Parishes in the Diocese are progressing in their participation in V Encuentro, a three-year ecclesial process of missionary activity, consultation, leadership development and dialogue in parishes, dioceses and episcopal regions to discern pastoral practices and priorities to impact the quality of ministry among Hispanic Catholics. The Diocese of Scranton began its participation in the V Encuentro process about a year ago. A core Diocesan Team had been meeting to learn and to explore different ways parishes could be encouraged to participate in V Encuentro. The process went as follows: Diocesan Team members from each parish invited 8 to 10 people who would be facilitators. The facilitators would conduct the faith sharing for the length of five weeks. Each parish team did their own recruiting to invite all parishioners to participate. At this time most of the parishes have completed the five sessions, except for a couple who will start soon. Two weeks ago, the V Encuentro Diocesan Team met to share their experiences on the five-week process. They all agreed the process was enriching, hopeful and faith filled. Nicholas Parish from Wilkes-Barre had a unique experience during the five-week session with the youth. The parish team wanted to engage everyone, particularly the youth. It was a great opportunity to give the youth a chance to share their dreams and hopes for the Church and, according to the Parish Team, it was phenomenal to have their input. Now the parishes are in the process of developing a Parish V Encuentro Day celebration where the parishes would have the opportunity to celebrate the accomplishments of the five-week sessions. In addition, more information will be collected at the Parish V Encuentro Day celebration. Everyone who has participated has enjoyed it. More details about this day will be published soon.
