The area surrounding the town was settled before statehood, and the town is home to several notable historic buildings. It has a mayor-council form of government. Early History The territory south of and possibly including Grove Hill was formerly inhabited by the Choctaw Indians but was claimed by the Creeks as well. A few miles from present day Grove Hill, the stockade Fort Siquiefield was built during the Creek War of and was the only fort attacked during the conflict. After the massacre at Fort Mims , which initiated the war, most local settlers took refuge from the Creek warriors at Fort Siquiefield. Fort Siquiefield Monument As the result of crowded conditions, however, at least two families left the shelter of the fort for their nearby farms and were attacked by Creek Indians in early September ; this incident became known as the Kimbell-James Massacre in which all but two of the group of women and children in these homesteads were killed. As the residents of the fort were burying and holding funeral services for the victims just outside the fort the following day, approximately Creeks again attacked the stockade as well as a group of women at a nearby spring. The settlers at the service successfully retreated into the fort, and all but one of the women at the spring were saved when Isaac Hayden led a large pack of dogs on horseback from the fort in their defense. Fort Siquiefield survived the onslaught but was soon abandoned for nearby Fort Madison. The first seat of Clarke County was established in Clarkesville, but it was moved to the more centrally located Grove Hill in , and a courthouse was constructed. Grove Hill was likely named for a grove of oak trees at the location. The town also had been referred to as Magoffin, Smithville, and Macon before being more consistently called Grove Hill by It grew after its establishment as the county seat, with hotels and stables to accommodate officials and travelers, but there was little industry. In addition, the town was struck by a yellow fever epidemic in A two-story brick courthouse was constructed in and enlarged in The town was incorporated in in and the present courthouse was constructed in Demographics According to Census estimates, Grove Hill recorded a population of 8, Of that number, Employment According to Census estimates, the workforce in Grove Hill was divided among the following industrial categories: The town has an elementary school, middle school, and high school that collectively enroll approximately 1, students and employ approximately 80 educators. A pre-kindergarten through 12th grade prep school enrolls approximately students and employs approximately 20 educators. Transportation Grove Hill is served by U. The Grove Hill Municipal Airport lies just southeast of town. The building houses artifacts and a book store, and its grounds feature the Creagh Law Office ca. The museum hosts a Pioneer Day each October featuring pioneer-related demonstrations, including syrup making, butter churning, and wood working. At the Census, the population was , Clark County was created on February 3, The county seat is Jeffersonville. Clark is divided into 12 Civil Townships as follows: Clark County lies on the north bank of the Ohio River. The state of Virginia rewarded General George Rogers Clark and his regiment for their victorious capture of Forts Kaskaskia, Cahokia, and Vincennes from the British by granting them , acres km2 of land. A small portion of this land, 1, acres 4. Clark County was formed 3 Feb from Knox County. Counties later formed all or in part from Clark County were: The first county seat and court was established in Springville, Indiana on April 7, The platting of Jeffersonville occurred a year later and the county seat was fixed to Jeffersonville on June 9, by order of Governor William Henry Harrison. By December 14, the county seat changed for the third time to Charlestown and it would remain there until The county seat changed for one last time on September 23, and returned to Jeffersonville with then mayor Luther Warder campaigning for the county seats return. The use of the steamboat in the early s to transport goods and services provided Clark County opportunities for commercial and industrial growth. In , James Howard founded the Howard shipyards making Clark County a leader in ship building and bringing with it economic growth. The railroad brought further economic growth. Two railroad lines, the Monon, which spanned from New Albany to Chicago and the Jeffersonville, Madison, and Indianapolis railroad, provided Clark County and southern Indiana with access to the northern trading centers of Indianapolis and Chicago. Colgate purchased the former Indiana Reformatory building in The Company rehabilitated and adapted the building for its dedication in They stayed in business until early Producing smokeless powder for the conflict overseas, the arsenal, at times, employed as many as 20, During the war, Howard shipyards was Commissioned by the Navy to produce landing craft. Later Howard shipyards reorganized as Jeffersonville Boat and Machine Company Jeffboat - a current major employer The Interstate Highway System act of aided this growth. Because of the improved access and efficiency brought by the interstate system, especially Interstate 65, new development in the form of subdivisions and shopping centers located near these roads. Mindful of its rich past, Clark County progresses toward the future boasting a diversified economic base and excellent development opportunities. Clark County history has been closely associated with the development of the Ohio River. From its beginnings, Clark County relied on the river for economic opportunities. Clark County has diversified its economic base, lessened its dependency on the river, and continues to develop in new directions.
