2: Deciphering Honda model & Part numbers (ST) *

According to the American Honda Motorcycle Identification Guide, effective September , American Honda adopted an official "model year" policy, which means that, regardless of the actual date of manufacture, all and later models sold by American Honda are represented by specific model years.

Determine the year, make and model of most popular ATVs, motorcycles and Scooters. Here are some examples: Motorcycle VINs are usually stamped into the steering neck of the motorcycle. This is located just behind the front forks, behind the headlight if equipped. Many scooter VINs are stamped into the frame rails. Often times you will have to remove scooter bodywork to locate the VIN. We have seen many scooters with VINs stamped into the left side frame rails and some with them stamped into the right side frame rails. Additionally, many scooters include an identification plate or sticker that will aid in scooter identification. Check the front and rear wheel wells along the right or left side. The letters I, i, O, o, Q, and q are never to be used so as to avoid confusion with numerals 1 and 0. These 17 characters are divided up into three groups:

Character 1 The first character of the VIN tells us which region the motorcycle was manufactured in.

Character 2 The second character, when combined with the first character denotes which country the motorcycle was manufactured in.

Character 3 The third character is used by powersports manufacturers to identify the vehicle type. It could be a motorcycle, ATV or scooter. Not every manufacturer uses the same codes.

Characters 4 - 9 These characters are known as the Vehicle Descriptor Section. Characters 4 through 8 provide information about the model, engine size and body style options. Character 9 is a check digit that is used to determine if the VIN is correct.

Characters 10 - 17 These characters are known as the Vehicle Identifier Section. The 10th character indicates the marketing model year of the vehicle, not to be confused with the year of production. For example a Honda CBRRR most likely has a date of production in 2008 it was produced for the marketing year. Characters 11 through 17 indicate the assembly facility, available options and the production number as it rolled off the assembly line.

Where used, the Honda motorcycle VIN consists of four sections of characters grouped as follows: This section uniquely identifies the manufacturer, make and type of the vehicle, as in the example VIN below Honda Motorcycle, manufactured in Japan, according to the Honda table: This section uniquely identifies the following attributes of the motorcycle: For example, under this scheme, Honda was required to report the net brake horsepower of the model state VFRF to the appropriate U. This section is the check digit whose purpose is to provide a means for verifying the accuracy of any VIN transcription. After all of the other characters in the VIN have been determined by the manufacturer, the check digit is calculated by carrying out a simple mathematical computation. If any character in the VIN is incorrect, the check digit will calculate incorrectly: JH2RCMM d The fourth section consists of eight characters occupying positions ten through seventeen of the VIN for motorcycles, the last four 4 characters of this section must be numeric , as follows: The first character of the fourth section represents the vehicle model year. The year is designated as indicated in the following table The second character of the fourth section represents the plant of manufacture Hamamatsu, Japan, according to the Honda table: The third through the eighth characters of the fourth section represent the number sequentially assigned by the manufacturer during the production process:

Vehicle Identification Number (VIN), Chassis number and Frame number: Every Honda motorcycle has a unique frame number. The frame number can be found either stamped in to the headstock of the frame (Where the steering stem passes through the frame) or stamped on a VIN plate which is then rivited to an exposed area of the frame.

How to Read a Honda Motorcycle Engine Number by William Bronleigh Finding the engine serial number on a Honda motorcycle can be easy or more of a challenge, depending on the model of motorcycle. Cruisers have engines that are relatively exposed, and the engine number should be easy to spot. Sport bikes may have fairings that cover the engine, making the engine number more difficult to locate. At first glance, a motorcycle engine serial number looks complex. However, motorcycle manufacturers create these numbers to convey key information in a small space. Knowing the rules of how Honda chooses numbers for their engines will provide information for ordering parts for your specific engine. Look for the serial number on the lower portion of the engine, which is called the crankcase. Newer Honda models and above often have it stamped on the rear of the crankcase, usually close to the swing arm pivot point. Older models earlier than may have it stamped on the lower left or lower right section of the crankcase. Write the engine serial number down for further reference. The number should be in the following pattern, where X represents a letter, and represents a number: E is a common designation for all engine serial numbers. These digits represent the motorcycle model number. The last character represents the year of the particular model. Read the seven digits after the dash. These digits convey information regarding the engine casing. This information is important when ordering engine parts for your specific engine. As motorcycle manufacturers often alter engines within a specific model of motorcycle, this serial number is important. Tell the Honda service center the engine serial number when ordering parts. This ensures the correct replacement part. Tip You might need a flashlight to see the engine serial number, particularly if it is stamped on the rear of the crankcase.
