That is certainly the case in Dante, and in ordinary human lives the crime and the punishment can be so connected as to seem aspects of the same thing, so that an understanding of what you have done to someone else brings with it its own sentence of remorseful torment. Besides, if your crime can be specified, then so can the punishment. Greater or lesser crimes will have greater or lesser punishments, and once this idea is admitted, hell becomes purgatory: True damnation must be eternal, and so the truly damned must never really understand why they are there. That rather depends on the kind of god, or the idea of justice, that you believe in. Obviously there are some gods, and some ideas of justice, that condemn all unbelievers to hell, just for being unbelievers. He sends particular condolences to the Mormons who He realises put in a lot of work. This, though, is where reliable advice is hard to come by. The Roman Catholic church used to have a beautifully worked out schema where you could hope to know exactly what your chances were of ending up in the right place, but in the past 50 years this has been eaten away by squeamishness and hopes of mercy. The best answer was suggested to me by the Catholic philosopher Nicholas Lash. The first point is that of course hell is not part of any objective reality that can be studied by the methods of science. But neither are we who might go there. Even if hell is not real to our instruments, to say that hell is real to us is quite enough. Lash went on to say and I am paraphrasing that eternal damnation “ or its opposite “ would have to be something experienced before we died, perhaps if the immediately preceding moment were spent in hell. This is perhaps why those who kill themselves at least regretful suicides may be considered damned. The argument might sound improbable, but it is at least not logically impossible. Heaven Is Not the Default Destination. A recent poll indicated that for every American who believes he or she is going to hell, there are who believe they're going to heaven.

What have you been thinking about? Do only Christians go to Heaven? Classical evangelical doctrine holds that salvation comes only through faith in Jesus Christ, and that those without such faith will be condemned to hell. A number of texts are typically cited in support of this position. No-one comes to the Father except through me. Hence his urgent call: And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? Taking such texts at face value, many evangelical scholars maintain that even those who fail to hear the Gospel through no fault of their own will be damned. Often called "exclusivists" or "particularists", this group includes Hendrik Kraemer, Douglas Gevitt and R. However, in recent years a growing number of evangelicals have argued that at least some who do not profess Christ before death can be saved. As evangelicals, they claim to find warrant for their "wider hope" in Scripture. Inclusivists often draw an analogy with the Old Testament saints. In Hebrews 11, a whole line of godly figures who never knew Jesus explicitly are counted among the redeemed. Those who live faithfully within their own religious context today without hearing the Good News are seen to be in a similar position, and to be similarly qualified for salvation. Exclusivists, however, reject this argument on the grounds that Jesus decisively globalised the mission of God beyond Israel, and that salvation which bypasses overt faith in Him is no longer possible. Implicit faith A second model of implicit faith is often inferred from Romans 2: Inclusivists characteristically apply this to those who do not hear the Gospel before they die. As we have seen, however, Romans later makes hearing and responding to the Gospel a matter of critical importance for all people, whether they have known the law or not. In any case, it is important to realise that conscience is itself affected by sin, and is thus hardly infallible. Scripture provides no explicit teaching on this matter, but it does offer hints that those who perish before they are old enough to make a conscious commitment might be saved. It may be significant here that Jesus depicted the kingdom of God as belonging to children Matthew Although we are all "conceived in sin" Psalm By definition, he says, this standard cannot apply to deceased infants. Following Charles Hodge and Benjamin Warfield, Nash concludes on this basis that all who die in infancy within and outside the womb should be numbered among the elect. What is clear is that, if those who die as infants are granted eternal life, it will come purely by the grace of God, whom we must always recognise as the final arbiter in these matters. The same would apply to a fourth category of persons sometimes linked to the wider hope "those whose mental disability renders them unable to respond overtly to the Gospel. In this instance, as in the others we have considered, God will have mercy "on whom He wants to have mercy" Romans 9: So far, we have examined only those who die without professing faith, and who move straight from death to final judgement, as Hebrews 9: However, some have extended wider-hope thinking beyond the grave, to a second chance for those who are not evangelised in their earthly life. Pinnock and George Beasley-Murray derive this concept of post-mortem repentance from 1 Peter 3: Rather, the "spirits" of 3: As we weigh up these different approaches, one thing must surely remain clear. We cannot second-guess God.

The Bible says in John 1: It goes on to say in verse 14, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. These are works that are commandments from Jesus for us to do after we are saved. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them. We serve him not to get saved, but, we serve him because we are saved.

4: How to get into heaven

Those who argue that all good people go to heaven often suggest that if hell exists, it is reserved for a minority of particularly evil people. But since most people are not so evil, they argue, it makes sense to claim that all good people will get to heaven regardless of any minor lapses in moral behavior.

The answer I most frequently hear goes like this: Only really bad people—thieves, prostitutes, and murderers—will go to hell. It is totally opposed to what Jesus taught! You could set your watch by their prayer times. They tithed not only their money, but even their table spices. These people never darkened the door of a church. To make matters even worse, Jesus had just invited the crook to be one of His disciples, and the guy had accepted the offer! Let them clean up their act first! At least the crooks knew they were spiritually terminal. But those who thought they were spiritually well were terminal without knowing it. Some years ago in a church in England, the pastor noticed that a former burglar was kneeling at the communion rail beside a judge of the Supreme Court of England, the very judge who, years before, had sentenced the burglar to seven years in prison. After his release the burglar had been converted to Christ and had become a Christian worker. I was thinking of myself. But look at me. I was taught from childhood to live as a gentleman, to keep my word, to say my prayers, to go to church. I went through Oxford, took my degrees, was called to the bar and eventually became a judge. Pastor, nothing but the grace of God could have caused me to admit that I was sinner on a level with that burglar. It took much more grace to forgive me for all my pride and self-righteousness, to get me to admit that I was not better in the eyes of God than that convict whom I had sent to prison. The only ones who go to heaven are those who see their sinfulness before a holy God and cry out to Him for mercy. What will you say when you stand before God? Are you hoping to get into heaven by your goodness? You may want to express your trust in Christ in prayer to God. I rightly deserve your holy judgment. But I put my trust in your Son, Jesus, and His death on the cross, as the just payment for my sins. Thank you for giving me eternal life according to your promise. Purchase a good modern translation Bible and begin prayerfully reading it. As you read, ask two questions: God bless you as you begin your new life with Him!

If that was all people needed to know, the other Even the best people can not keep the Ten Commandments. Although we have met a number of people who think they have always obeyed the Ten Commandments, a few questions typically reveal that they have broken most of them hundreds of times each. People then realize that by the time they finished their teenage years, they broke that Commandment hundreds of times more. If your parents are still living and you ever criticize anything about them, you are still breaking that commandment. The Bible makes it clear that we have all sinned Ecclesiastes 7: So, how can we not go to hell? Since only an infinite and eternal penalty is sufficient, an infinite and eternal price must be paid. God became a human being in the Person of Jesus Christ John 1: In Jesus Christ, God lived among us, taught us, and healed usâ€”but those things were not His ultimate mission. God became a human being so that He could die for us. Jesus, God in human form, died on the cross. As God, His death was infinite and eternal in value, paying the full price for sin 1 John 2: God invites us to receive Jesus Christ as Savior, accepting His death as the full and just payment for our sins. God promises that anyone who believes in Jesus John 3: God does not want anyone to go to hell 2 Peter 3: That is why God made the ultimate, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice on our behalf. If you want to not go to hell, receive Jesus as your Savior. It is as simple as that. Tell God that you recognize that you are a sinner and that you deserve to go to hell. Declare to God that you are trusting in Jesus Christ as your Savior. Thank God for providing for your salvation and deliverance from hell.
