Consider the following non-fiction opening lines: Consider the aspects of your topic that will naturally peak human interest, and lead with that: At that moment, Karen walked out onto the middle of the stage with her violin and looked out across the room at the big crowd. At that moment, Karen appeared on the stage with her violin, her eyes wide as she surveyed the growing crowd. As you can see, the same image is portrayed more clearly and succinctly in the second version. For example, your first task might be to look for extraneous adverbs, your second task might be to break up run-on sentences, your third task might be to remove any unnecessary repetition, so on and so forth. Doing all of these items at once is sure to lead to oversight – and not to mention exhaustion. Of course, these people can also look for any grammatical errors as well. Friends and family are of course a great resource, but you might also want to consider looking for outside beta readers.

Make sure that you have a general idea of your paper before you start writing an outline. Decide on the type of the outline to use Choose between a sentence outline and a topic outline. A sentence outline entails the use of complete sentences in expressing points. A topic outline entails the use of short phrases. You can start by finding out whether your professor or teacher has specified the type of the outline to use. Make sure that you do not mix both styles. Create a header for each page of the outline Each page of the outline of your research paper should have a header, though this is optional when you are not required to submit the outline to be awarded a grade. The header should appear at the right side of the paper. It should have your name and page number. Create a title for your outline The title should not be written in capital letters, large fonts, underlined or in boldface. The title that you give the outline should be the title that you give your research paper. Make use of the title style. This means that each word of the title should have a capital letter at the beginning except for short prepositions, conjunctions and articles. Use main ideas or points to subdivide your outline This is an important step of a guide on how to write a research paper outline that you should master. Your outline should be subdivided into sections of major points or ideas that support the main argument of the research paper. The outline should present at least three major points. Although you can have more points, do not include too many points. Make sure that you have manageable points. Have a Roman numeral numbering each point or subdivision. Expand the subdivisions Include minor points under your major points using capital letters to label them. If you have subtopics that you want to include under your minor points, use numbers to label them. However, make sure that you have a minimum of two points for each detail level. Under the minor point A, you can have subtopics or points 1 and 2. Under subtopic or point 1, you can have details a, b, c and d. Start each entry with a capital letter The first word of every entry should start with a capital letter even if it is a topic

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outline that is made of phrases only. When your outline uses complete sentences, make sure that first letters of all first words are capitalized. There should be a period at the end of each sentence. Each level should be indented but this should be done at the same amount. This implies that capital letters should be lined up with one another. Numbers should be lined up too. Make sure that the reader can follow your research paper outline at their first glance due to its proper organization. Visit site An outline might be formal or informal. An informal outline working outline is a tool helping an author put down and organize their ideas. It is subject to revision, addition and canceling, without paying much attention to form. In a formal outline, numbers and letters are used to arrange topics and subtopics. The letters and numbers of the same kind should be placed directly under one another. The topics denoted by their headings and subheadings should be grouped in a logical order. A good outline is the most important step in writing a good paper. Check your outline to make sure that the points covered flow logically from one to the other. Make the first outline tentative. What is the chief reason you are writing the paper? State also how you plan to approach your topic. Is this a factual report, a book review, a comparison, or an analysis of a problem? Explain briefly the major points you plan to cover in your paper and why readers should be interested in your topic. BODY – This is where you present your arguments to support your thesis statement. Remember the Rule of 3, i. Begin with a strong argument, then use a stronger one, and end with the strongest argument for your final point. Explain why you have come to this particular conclusion. Critically analyze your research data. Using the best available sources, check for accuracy and verify that the information is factual, up-to-date, and correct. Opposing views should also be noted if they help to support your thesis. This is the most important stage in writing a research paper. Here you will analyze, synthesize, sort, and digest the information you have gathered and hopefully learn something about your topic which is the real purpose of doing a research paper in the first place. You must also be able to effectively communicate your thoughts, ideas, insights, and research findings to others through written words as in a report, an essay, a research or term paper, or through spoken words as in an oral or multimedia presentation with audio-visual aids. Do not include any information that is not relevant to your topic, and do not include information that you do not understand. Make sure the information that you have noted is carefully recorded and in your own words, if possible. Plagiarism is definitely out of the question. Document all ideas borrowed or quotes used very accurately. As you organize your notes, jot down detailed bibliographical information for each cited paragraph and have it ready to transfer to your Works Cited page. Devise your own method to organize your notes. One method may be to mark with a different color ink or use a hi-liter to identify sections in your outline, e. Understanding the Internet A. The complete Dune and Foundation series? Picking a genre is the first step in writing a book. In other words, write for yourself, not the market. Stephen King puts it best: Your stuff starts out being just for you, but then it goes out. Start from the End Endings are the hardest part of any story. Most beginners start out strong but find themselves flummoxed by the time the ending draws near. So before you put a single word to paper, figure out how your story ends. Not how it begins – that can be redrawn and revised indefinitely – how it closes. Work your way backwards. What are the catalysts that lead to the close? What was their origin? Want to write a book fast? Take this easy to follow course on writing and publishing books by Mindy Gibbins-Klein. Create Your Characters Characters, not plots, are the soul of good writing. The plot of *Catcher in the Rye* is mostly superfluous. Characters stay with readers for generations, the stories are mostly forgotten. This is why you must draw out your characters before you start writing the book. These tips should help: Write a Character Biography: When was the character born? What is her name? Who were her parents? Was she rich, poor, or middle-class? Where did she go to school? What did she study in college? Answering questions like these will help draw a deep portrait of the character and make her more convincing. What does your character want? What are her motivations for doing what she does? The essential quality of every good character is change. How A manages to overcome C and get B is the heart of any story. Rocky wants to be a champion, but crushing poverty and Apollo Creed stand in his way. How he overcomes this is the meat of Rocky, not the final fight itself. Make an Outline Once you have your characters firmly in place, start creating an outline of the plot. This is meant to serve as a very rough guideline to hold the plot in place. Chiefly, the outline should: Give a brief overview of what happens in each chapter. Delineate the primary struggle in the novel. Show how different events and characters interact and affect each other A murders B, C takes the fall, etc. Allow plenty of room for improvisation Step 5: The outlines you wrote earlier will often be discarded as you experiment with characters, plots, styles and forms. This is a place for you to break the mold and push yourself creatively. Eventually, this rough collection of thoughts, ideas, and plotlines will come together into a comprehensible book – after due editing and countless revisions of course. For now, focus on writing – anything. Everyone has a book inside them. Learn how to write the book inside you with this course. Rewrite This is the part where most writers fail. Slinging out a rough draft is easy enough; turning that incomprehensible mess into something readers would want to read takes time, patience and practice. Ideally, you should give yourself a few months between first draft and first rewrite. This gives you the creative distance necessary to analyze the writing dispassionately. Ask sharp, pertinent questions – does the plot make sense? Are the characters convincing? Is the pace too slow? Is the writing crisp and creative enough? Is the story fun to read? The first rewrite should take you considerably longer than the first draft. For now, focus on pulling the rough ideas in the draft into a narrative that actually makes sense. There is still lots of work to be done. Editing is the opposite of creative writing. Instead of spinning beautiful metaphors and creating lush imagery, you have to actually delete linguistic flourishes. Those long-winded, poetic asides? To make this murder slightly easier, follow these tips: They

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reduce into a single word what should generally be conveyed by context. Use Plenty of Synonyms: A man is not very tired, he is exhausted. Language was invented for one reason, boys "to woo women" and, in that endeavor, laziness will not do. A book is no place for lazy writing. Your book should be half its original length after a solid round of editing. Consider getting outside help "a professional editor or a friend" to look over your manuscript. This is the time to hit the clubs and party hard. Then wake up next morning and start working on your second book!
